Arizona, We Have the Opportunity to Promise our Youth a Prosperous Future

Education has always been a priority for my family, and it was a frequent topic of discussion growing up. With my own children, the conversation continued. As the daughter and granddaughter of miners, attaining a college education was a fervent goal for my entire family, myself included.

Four generations of our family graduated from Superior High School, and while the college/career path varied for each generation as the years progressed, one thing remained constant - lifelong learning would always be a priority. Regrettably, this is not always a common conversation for every Arizona family.

Accessing a college education was not easy, and significant sacrifices were made to do so. In earlier generations, working summers at the mine in Superior provided sufficient financial resources to make college affordable and accessible.

For my children, the Promise for the Future program for Pinal County graduates afforded them an opportunity to begin their college education at Central Arizona College and both were transferred to Arizona State University to pursue their bachelor's degrees. Pinal County's Promise for the Future program has helped reduce the burdens and struggles that many families face when making decisions about college, but once they complete a

two-year program, there are often not as many options to continue onto a bachelor's or graduate degree.

It is time that a program such as Promise for the Future is available across the state of Arizona. The Arizona Promise Program (SB 1508) would create a scholarship program to provide access to higher education for low-income families across our state by covering tuition and fees at Arizona's public universities or community colleges. The Arizona Board of Regents is making this

budget request to the Arizona State Legislature as part of its New Economy Initiative.

The Town of Superior has included lifelong learning, access to higher education and job/skills training as critical priorities in our economic development strategy. The Superior Junior/Senior High school maintains a higher than average graduation rate. The class of 2018 from Superior had a 96.7 percent graduation rate,

but despite the high graduation rate, only 7.4 percent went on to attend a four-year university. The low college attainment will eventually affect our local workforce development. Looking back to the Superior Junior/Senior High School class of 2013, only 11.7 percent of those graduates completed a four-year degree program compared to 22.4 percent statewide. For many of the families in our community, making the financial commitment to attend college is the number one deterrent.

The challenges that low-income students face to attend college will eventually have a devastating ripple effect on our statewide workforce development and severely limit Arizona's ability to remain competitive. We will be forced to recruit workers into Arizona and worse yet, we most assuredly can lose opportunities to retain and expand existing employers and to attract other companies to our state as well.

With additional and sufficient state support, Arizona's public universities can boost access and the number of Arizona resident students who earn a degree, while growing research and development for an economy increasingly built on knowledge and discovery. Our universities in Arizona are poised to lead Arizona into the New Economy, but we must invest now.

Developing the Arizona Promise Program will significantly reduce

the burdens many Arizona families face when determining if their children can attend college. The Arizona Promise scholarship will ensure that Arizona residents who graduated from high school with a minimum 2.5 GPA, qualify for the free or reduced lunch program and completed the FAFSA application will be eligible for this scholarship.

What will happen if we were to approve this Arizona Promise? Our economy across the state would continue to flourish, and more residents of Arizona would be qualified for these New Economy jobs, where they will earn higher wages and enjoy a higher quality of life. Higher education attainment also leads to an increased tax base for the state. States that have enacted promise programs have seen tangible benefits in the way students view college and their place in it. Why wouldn't we want to make this promise?

It is time that we place our focus on making and keeping a promise of the opportunity for lifetime success for every resident of Arizona. Access to higher education will keep Arizona in the lead. Let's promise success to everyone and enact the Arizona Promise Scholarship program.

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Tonto National Forest withdraws Final Environmental Impact Statement for Resolution Copper

On March 1, 2021, the United States Department of Agriculture which oversees the United States Forest Service made the following announcement on its website (<https://www.resolutionmineeis.us>) regarding the Resolution Copper Project.

On Jan. 15, 2021, the Tonto National Forest released the Resolution Copper Project Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) and draft Record of Decision (ROD) for objection. In the time since these documents were released, the Agency and Department have received significant input from collaborators, partners, and the public through a variety of means. Today, USDA directed the Forest Service to withdraw the Notice of Availability and rescind the Final Environmental Impact Statement and draft Record of Decision. The pre-decisional objection period will be halted as well.

The project is proposed on Oak Flat, a site sacred to numerous Federally Recognized Tribes in the Southwest. The Department is taking this step to provide an opportunity

for the agency to conduct a thorough review based on significant input received from collaborators, partners, and the public since these documents were released. The recent Presidential Memorandum on tribal consultation and strengthening nation to nation relationships counsels in favor of ensuring the Forest Service has complied with the environmental, cultural, and archaeological analyses required. USDA has concluded that additional time is necessary to fully understand concerns raised by Tribes and the public and the project's impacts to these important resources and ensure the agency's compliance with federal law. USDA and the Forest Service also understand that under federal law that the Forest Service has limited discretion related to protection of Oak Flat. Long term protection of the site will likely require an act of Congress. USDA and the Forest Service cannot give a precise length of time for completing the re-initiation of consultation but consultations such as this generally take several months.

Resolution Copper maintains public access to Oak Flat

Resolution Copper will maintain public access to areas within Oak Flat including the campground and recreational trails and climbing, after completion of the land exchange mandated by bipartisan legislation that passed Congress in 2014.

Resolution Copper today published a management plan on its website detailing how it will continue to operate the campground in keeping with current Tonto National Forest practices. Community groups and Native American tribal representatives will continue to provide input on how the area is protected and managed after the land exchange.

Resolution Copper has contracted with 4 Winds, a local small business part-owned by members of the San Carlos Apache Tribe, to maintain the campground areas infrastructure and access trails.

Resolution Copper project director Andrew Lye said: "Resolution Copper will maintain public access to areas within Oak Flat including the campground, recreational trails and climbing after the land exchange is complete,

as permitting and studies to shape the project continue. We will continue to consult and seek community input as we refine and shape the Resolution Copper project over the coming years, to minimize any impacts on Oak Flat.

"Resolution Copper is committed to fostering constructive relationships with the local community and Native American Tribes in Arizona, especially those with a historical connection to the land in and around the project area. We are encouraged by the direct and positive engagement of the local community and many Tribes throughout the permitting process. Resolution Copper will continue to engage with the local community and seek the consent of all 11 Native American Tribes that have historical connections with the land involved in the project before any decision on development, consistent with the International Council on Mining and Metals (ICMM) Statement on Indigenous Peoples and Mining."

Completion of the land exchange is expected

Bridge girder placement moves Pinto Creek project forward

Motorists traveling US 60 between Superior and Globe will see the new Pinto Creek Bridge come into shape in the coming months as crews begin placing girders that will form the structure's deck.

The work started Monday, March 1, and requires lane restrictions and delays of up to 15 minutes, according to the Arizona Department of Transportation. From now until May, restrictions are scheduled between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays. As needed, restrictions will be in place between 7 a.m. noon on Fridays.



The bridge girder placement is a major milestone on the \$22.7 million project to replace the 71-year-old structure above Pinto Creek. Once the girders are in place, crews will begin forming the bridge deck for the new 695-foot-long bridge.

The work requires lane restrictions so crews can place the girders onto the piers. The 35 girders range in length from 91 feet to 127 feet, and weigh an estimated 50,000 to 70,000 pounds.

Crews are expected to pour the new bridge deck this summer, and that work is expected to require 91an overnight full closure. Later this summer, a 5-day closure is expected to shift the highway's alignment onto the new bridge. The project is expected to be complete in early 2022.

in March, transferring 5,459 acres of high-value conservation land to the Federal Government in return for Resolution Copper taking ownership of approximately 2,422 acres around the project site. The land exchange requires Resolution Copper to maintain public access to the Oak Flat Campground for as

long as it is safe. The US Forest Service is currently undertaking a public review and comment period on its Final Environmental Impact Statement for the Resolution Copper project. Its final record of decision is expected in the second half of 2021. More information can be found on

the Forest Service's website at resolutionmineeis.us. After the US Forest Service process, further permitting will be progressed with other authorities and a detailed feasibility study completed over several years to inform investment considerations on the project. When an investment decision is
