# Committee hearing on medical marijuana dispensary Thursday

A public hearing of the Pinal County Planning and Zoning Commission is being held Thursday, April 17 at 9 a.m. in the Pinal County Emergency Operations Center building F to consider the request for a special use permit for the unincorporated area of Oracle. The public hearing/action involves Rita Casares landowner; Glen A. Wilt, Jr., applicant, David Dow, agent requesting approval of a special use permit to operate the Pinal County Wellness Center medical marijuana dispensary in a building located on American Avenue.

The hearing is open to anyone interested in the matter and they may show cause, if any, why this application should or should not be granted. If 20 percent of the property owners within the zoning area file protests then three-fourths of all members of the Board of Supervisors will be required to approve the rezoning.

A group of Oracle residents have been collecting signatures on a petition in opposition to the medical marijuana dispensary being allowed in Oracle. Alicia Bristow, president of the Oracle Women's Network

(O.W.N.) said that well over 100 signatures have been collected including those of business owners in the area that are opposed to the medical marijuana dispensary.

Besides opposing a medical marijuana dispensary coming to Oracle in general, residents who signed the petition also were concerned about Dr. Wilt's reputation as a property owner. Dr. Wilt has run into problems with incorporated town governments in Superior, Globe, and Hayden. There have been complaints about his properties being neglected and in disrepair. Towns and individuals have gone to court over Dr. Wilt's failure to take action when requested to do so.

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# Mammoth STEM School students

The Mammoth STEM school teachers and students should be commended for their participation in the Southern Arizona Research, Science and Engineering Foundation Fair (SARSEF). This year's fair was at the Tucson Convention Center in the middle of March. Over \$48,000 in prizes and 14 scholarships were awarded. The Mammoth STEM School had steep competition with a total of 556 projects participating, but prevailed with securing nine awards ranging from first to third place. Three students won personal awards as individual entries.

SARSEF was created in 1955 as an event involving 100 science projects and it has grown into a competition for the southern half of Arizona. Each year SARSEF brings together educators, researchers, technology companies, parents and students for a five day celebration of science and scientific discovery. Last year 75,000 students from kindergarten to high school designed projects for their

local science fairs. Only the best of those projects were selected to advance to regional competition at SARSEF.

The students were happy they were able to participate and said they had fun putting together projects. Mrs. Formo's kindergarten class won first and second prize in the plant biology division. Mrs. Formo said, "Both of our projects were in the same category and we had the top two projects." Cooper Dale of Mrs. Formo's class entered an individual project on evaporating liquids and he won first place. The two class projects were Germ War and Balancing Act. In the Germ War, students tested many areas of the school for germs and found the bus to contain the most germs. The Balancing Act was to balance the ph in soil. Earthworms were used to balance the ph. Some of the soil was acidic and some was alkaline the worms were put in the soil and balanced the soils ph levels.

Mrs. Formo said, "The scientific method is used by all of us at the STEM school." The scientific method is choosing your project, identify a problem, research the problem, develop a hypothesis, design

the experiments, test the hypothesis, analyze the results, and finally formulate conclusions. Mrs. Formo said, "I believe we are facilitators, every step of the way the students are guided by me, but I do a lot of brainstorming with my class and I let them come up with ideas of working through the problems."

Mrs. Falkenberry's first grade class entered Worms and Pillbugs and Larvae Eat Our Garbage and won third place in the Animal, Plant and Environmental Sciences category. This project was

working with worms and feeding them different types of foods like egg shells, tea bags, coffee, vegetables, and bread, just to name a few. They found that mulberry and potato plants had the most worms. The second place in Animal, Plant and Environmental Sciences also went to Mrs. Faulkenberry's class for their project of Wigglers Through the Leaves. On this project they had several plants and measured different water, some of the containers had holes in the bottom and other plants didn't have any holes for

## Nominations sought for advisory council

Albuquerque, NM – Nominations for individuals to serve on the Arizona National Scenic Trail Advisory Council are being accepted by the U.S. Forest Service. This is a Federal Advisory Committee that will provide recommendations to the Secretary of Agriculture, through the Chief of the Forest Service, about matters relating to the administration and management of the Arizona National Scenic Trail (Arizona Trail).

The Arizona Trail is the only designated national scenic trail in the state. It is a primitive, long-distance route stretching over 800 miles from Mexico to Utah and connecting deserts, mountains, forests, wilderness, canyons, historic sites and communities. The Trail showcases the state's diverse vegetation, wildlife and scenery, and offers hikers, horseback riders, and mountain bikers an unparalleled Arizona experience.

The Council will consist of not more than 13 members as described in the Council Charter. Members will be appointed as follows:

- The Regional Forester of the Southwestern Region, Forest Service, or a designee
- The State Director of the Arizona State Office of the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), or designee
- The Regional Director of the Intermountain Region, National Park Service (NPS), or designee
- One representative of the State of Arizona, selected from

milkshakes, they had taste tests and most of the students enjoyed the Chia pudding the most.

The first grade class wanted to share their favorite Chia pudding recipe: Put 1/2 cup chia seeds in a bowl, put 1/2 cup milk in blender and add one chopped banana or 2 Tbs. cocoa and 2 Tbs. sugar. Blend until smooth, pour milk mixture into bowl and whisk with seeds, add 1/4 tsp. vanilla and 2 Tbs. maple syrup, whisk again. Whisk every five minutes for a half hour. Cover and put in the refrigerator overnight.

Ms. Uttech's second grade class entered an Earthworm Soil vs. Pillbug Soil project and won first place in the Animal, Plant and Environmental Sciences category. The student separated worms and pillbugs, they grew plants in soil that contained worms and soil that contained pillbugs. The students grew mustard seeds. They recorded the growth of each plant they grew. Ms. Uttech said, "The potting soil actually grew the plants better, they found worms in the potting soil by accident, so that kind of skewed our results." Kayla and Ethan from Ms. Uttech's class told me that they had procedures to follow for the projects and that it was fun. Kayla enjoyed planting the seeds and watching them grow.

The fourth grade class guided by Ms. Scott won first place with their entry of Moisture from the Moon in the Animal, Plant and Environmental Sciences category. Ysidro from Ms. Scott's class said he really enjoyed measuring the growth of the plants.

The fifth grade class with direction from Ms. Vargas won second place for Recycling Grey Water Project in the Engineering, Physics and Mathematical Sciences category. Aracely Curry and Victoria Zazueta entered an individual project for sixth grade called Tea Time and they placed second in the Animal and Plant Sciences division. They made different tea from the compost and fed it to plants.

All the teachers and students represented Mammoth STEM school with dignity, pride and enthusiasm. Some of the up and coming scientists of the future can be found here.

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# Dark skies over Oracle? Committee has inaugural meeting

The Oracle Dark Skies Committee had its kick off meeting Thursday, April 10 at the Kannally Ranch House in Oracle State Park. The meeting was well attended and plans are being developed to have Oracle State Park become a designated International Dark Skies Park (IDSP). Once Oracle State Park is designated as an IDSP, it will become the model for additional parks within the Arizona Parks system to follow. The IDSP designation will be good for Arizona, Pinal County, the Copper Corridor, Oracle, and the environment.

The Oracle Dark Skies Committee is being led by Mike Weasner of Oracle. He is an amateur astronomer with a BS degree in Astrophysics. Mike is a former fighter pilot, pilot instructor, former manager in the US Air Force Shuttle Program and a retired senior manager for a large aerospace company. The committee will be gathering support letters from politicians, businesses, organizations, government agencies and others as well as looking for sponsors.

The International Dark Skies Association (IDSA) is an organization dedicated to preserving and protecting the night time environment and our heritage of dark skies through environmentally responsible outdoor lighting. They are considered the authority on light pollution and are consulted by government agencies in developing lighting ordinances. The IDSA is the approving authority making Oracle State Park an International Dark Skies Park provided they meet the qualifications. It is believed that Oracle and the lower San Pedro Valley have some very good dark skies.

Achieving the International Dark Skies Park designation will bring recognition to Oracle State Park. The IDSA has thousands of members in 70 countries. They also have chapters and affiliates around the world. Other benefits the park would receive are:

- Increased educational opportunities for science projects for local schools.
- Oracle State Park and the community of Oracle would reap economic benefits from increased visitation to the area.
- County wide public relations and economic benefits from having an

International Dark Sky Park in Pinal County. Visitors coming to the park would be exposed to the Copper Corridor area and Pinal County.

- Through the education of residents, light pollution will be reduced which will result in long term health, environmental, and economic benefits within Pinal County.
