He was an outstanding athlete selected to the Arizona All-Star Teams in basketball and football. He attended Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona. In 1951, the Korean War erupted and he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and served in the 3rd Marine Corps Division, 3rd Battalion Combat Engineering Unit, and was very proud to serve our country.

He returned to Florence after an Honorable Discharge in 1954 and married Edna Youtsey in 1956. Together they raised five children, working numerous jobs: ranching, construction, law enforcement, and mining. The next five years he worked at the San Manuel Mining Corporation and then decided to attend Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona.

At the university he earned a Bachelors and Masters Degree in Education. Later, he was the recipient of the Southwest Kellogs Scholarship and earned a second Masters Degree at the University of Arizona in Tucson, Arizona in Counseling and Guidance. He was a certified real estate agent.

Throughout these years he was very communityinvolved: Scout Master (five Eagle Scouts), Co-founder of Las Juntas Patrioticas (an Eloy annual Mexican Fiesta), Director of Eloy American Red Cross, Elected Eloy City Councilman, Eloy Catholic Church parishioner, Florence-Coolidge Elks Club, Founder of Eloy Boxing Club, and member of the Arizona Moose Club. He participated in the indoctrination of the Atomic Bomb and was Service Manager for Arizona Jobs Colleges. He went to San Antonio, Texas to train for the Southwest Voter Registration. He was very involved in politics. He enjoyed reading, writing, golfing, camping, and most of all being in the company of his children and grandchildren. He officially retired in 1994 but continued to work as a consultant to schools in counseling, tutoring, and testing, until his wife's illness and he retired once more in 2009. His beautiful partner, friend, and wonderful wife of 53 years was called to Heaven in June 2009.

Ray, Hayden melee results in dual forfeit

Last week's baseball game between No. 5 Ray and No. 10 Hayden in Kearny was ended early due to a melee between players on both teams that resulted in each team taking a loss.

The fracas allegedly started when a Hayden pitcher hit the same Ray batter during multiple plate appearances. Later, the Hayden pitcher reached first base, where the Ray batter was positioned defensively, words were exchanged and the two began chest-bumping before things escalated further. A Ray infielder ran over to try to separate the players, but instead he was tackled and pinned to ground, where he was assaulted. Players from both teams joined the incident before umpires called the game.

The Ray infielder suffered several facial abrasions, a busted lip and a concussion. Several players on both teams were suspended for one game.

The teams met again on Monday, Apr. 15, with the Bearcats narrowly defeating the Lobos, 10 - 9. **Ray up next:** Apr. 19 vs. Round Valley at 1 p.m. and Apr. 23 at Duncan at 4 p.m.

Hayden up next: Apr. 18 vs. Ft. Thomas (4 p.m.), Apr. 23 at Arete Prep (6 p.m.) and Apr. 24 at NFL Yet Academy (4 p.m.)


