He is preceded in death by his wife of 49 years, Mary Lou; sisters, Flora Arvayo and Espie Barcelo.



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Council approves new mural for downtown

The Superior Chamber of Commerce in conjunction with Rebuild Superior Inc. - Business Attraction Retention program submitted a plan to the Town of Superior to install and create a new mural in Downtown Superior. The vintage postcard Greetings from Superior mural will be installed on the Northwest wall of the Superior Senior Center at Lobb Ave. and Main St.

The mural will be a Welcome to Superior mural with a vintage design similar to those in cities like Tucson, Chicago and Austin. The letters will all depict traditions and land marks of Superior. Local artists and artists from the region submitted ideas to the BAR Committee and from there the letters were chosen and submitted to the Town of Superior Planning and Zoning Commission. Local artists contributing the to the mural are Chuck Davidson, Marilee Lash, Deb Kay, Augie Hing, David Drennon, Pete Casillas and Sal Cordero.

The mural followed the Town of Superior Public Art Policy which requires approval from the Planning and Zoning Commission with final approval coming from the Town Council. On Thursday the Town Council approved the design.





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
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
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Superior Police Report

Arriola hits, pitches Superior past Coolidge

Superior Player-of-the-Year candidate Kiki Arriola had two hits and an RBI at the plate and dominated the visiting Bears on the mound, pitching a complete game in the Lady Panthers' 8 - 2 win on Monday, Apr. 9.

Arriola, a senior, went 2-for-3 with a triple and tossed 112 pitches in the complete-game outing, where she allowed two runs on six hits with 10 strikeouts and four walks. In 11 starts this season, Arriola is 11 - 0 with six complete games. She's fanned 100 in 60 IP and walked only 18, a strikeout-to-walk ration of more than 5-to-1.

Anisah Cardenas, a junior, went 3-for-4 and hit one of two doubles in the game by Superior batters. She also drove in a run. Korrina Romero had a hit and two RBI while freshman McKenna Duarte went 2-for-3 at the plate.

Since its loss to the top-ranked Ray on Apr. 3, the Lady Panthers have won four-straight with an average of victory of nearly 12 runs per game.

"The team is playing well, and mentally I think we're in a good place," head coach Martin Navarrette told the Superior Sun. "It's not a secret, we know what we have to do to be successful."

Superior Firefighters battle blaze on Main St.

Superior Fire and Police were kept busy Monday night containing a fire that eventually engulfed two buildings and sparked a brush fire.

Superior Police received a report Monday at 4:16 p.m. of smoke and flames in the 600 block of Main St.

"Superior PD quickly arrived on scene and found a fully engulfed abandoned building on fire with fire spread to the adjacent building and brush," Captain Richard Drennan, public information officer for Superior Fire Department, told the Superior Sun in an email.

Superior Fire crews arrived in an engine a few minutes later and they immediately began to contain the fire. The spread in the brush was contained, but the first building was still fully engulfed with heavy fuels and the fire had spread into the second building, Drennan said.

Off-duty and reserve firefighters responded from home and brought additional fire vehicles to the scene to assist. Queen Valley Fire District responded with an engine as part of a mutual aid agreement.

"Firefighters aggressively attacked the fire for over an hour, which was difficult to engage with limited access to the building and several hazards including burning overhead electrical lines and the building being structurally unstable," Drennan added.

Drennan said there were no injuries and the fire's cause is under investigation.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR

COUNCIL OF SUPERIOR, THE TOWN ARIZONA: AND Section 1. The tax rate in the following section of the Superior Town Tax Code is increased to four percent (4 %):

Section 1-447 Rental, leasing, and licensing for use of real property; additional tax on transient lodging. In addition to the taxes levied as provided in Section 1-444, there is hereby levied and shall be collected an additional tax in an amount equal to four (4 %) percent of the gross income from the business activity of any hotel engaging or continuing within the Town in the business of charging for lodging and/or lodging space furnished to any transient. Section 2. Any person found guilty of violating any provision of these amendments to the tax code shall be guilty of a class one misdemeanor Each day that a violation continues shall be a separate offense punishable as herein above described Section 3. If any section, subsection sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective on July

RESOLUTION NO. 18-593 FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA, ADOPTING A FAIR HOUSING POLICY, MAKING KNOWN ITS COMMITMENT TO THE PRINCIPLE OF FAIR HOUSING, AND DESCRIBING ACTIONS IT SHALL UNDERTAKE TO AFFIRMATIVELY FURTHER FAIR HOUSING. WHEREAS

the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended requires that all applicants for Community Development Block Grant funds certify that they shall affirmatively further fair housing; and WHEREAS, the Civil Rights Act of 1968 (commonly known as the Federal Fair Housing Act) and the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 declare a national policy to prohibit discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for the construction of housing or in the provision of brokerage services, on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, disability, familial status or national origin; and WHEREAS, fairness is the foundation of the American system and reflects traditional American values; and WHEREAS, discriminatory housing practices undermine the strength and vitality of America and its people; **NOW** THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Superior, hereby wish all persons living, working, doing business in or traveling through this Town know: That discrimination in the sale, rental, leasing and financing of housing or land to be used for construction of housing, or in the provision of brokerage services on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin is prohibited by Title VIII of the Fair Housing Act Amendments of 1988; and That it is the policy of the Town of Superior, Arizona, to implement programs, within the constraints of its resources, to ensure equal opportunity in housing for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin: and That with available resources the Town of Superior will assist all persons who feel they have been discriminated against in housing issues on the basis of race color, religion, sex, handicap, familial status or national origin to seek equity under existing federal and state laws to file a complaint with the Arizona Attorney General's Office or the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and That the Town of Superior shall publicize this Resolution and thereby encourage owners of rental properties, developers, builders, and others involved with housing to become aware of their respective responsibilities and rights under the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988 and any applicable state or local laws or ordinances; and That the Town of Superior shall undertake the following actions to additionally "affirmatively further fair housing:"

• Mail this resolution to the real estate,

banking, and development communities: Mail this resolution to the media regarding issues relating to Fair Housing;

 Post copies of this Resolution at the Town Hall and Superior Library;
 Distribute flyers regarding Fair Housing month in the Town Hall, Superior Library

and Superior Post Office.
