With the temperature rising and the humidity decreasing, we know these are elements that contribute to the wildfire season in not only our area but throughout the southwest. If you own or rent your home, there are things you can do to improve your home's ability to survive a wildfire.

The Oracle Fire District and the Oracle Firewise Board are glad to present an opportunity for anyone interested to participate in a one-day course presented by Aaron Casem, the State Prevention Officer of the Arizona Department of Forestry and Fire Management on April 24, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. at the Oracle Fire District, at 1475 W. American Avenue in Oracle.

This course will teach the participants the fundamentals of wildland fire behavior; types of ignition sources; the home Ignition Zone; and recommendations to reduce the fire risk in your home. It will also include property site visits to put into practice what has been learned in the class so participants are asked to dress comfortably and wear walking shoes.

Rollover crash briefly closes Highway 77 Friday

One person was transported to a Tucson trauma center Friday after a rollover accident sent the vehicle plunging over an embankment near the San Pedro River.

At 8:30 a.m. on Friday, April 16, 2021, local firefighters from Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District and Mammoth Fire Department were dispatched to the scene of an accident not too far from the PRFMD fire station.

When firefighters arrived at the crash scene near milepost 116 on Highway 77, they found a vehicle had left the road near the river and rolled at least one time before coming to rest down the side of an embankment.

Emergency crews worked swiftly to treat and prepare the driver of the vehicle before carrying the driver to a waiting helicopter

for transportation to a local trauma center.

Highway 77 was closed briefly in both directions to allow air medical transportation to land on roadway. It was not clear what caused the accident and Arizona Department of Public Safety Troopers do not suspect alcohol was a factor in this incident. Highway 77 was reopened at 10:15 a.m.

“I am pleased by the swift actions and cooperation of all the emergency crews at this incident to rescue the single occupant of the truck. We train for incidents such as this and our firefighters performed well today,” said Bobby Apodaca, Fire Chief of Pinal Rural Fire and Medical District.

Also at the scene were Mammoth Police Department, AMR Ambulance and Air Evac.

- Read with your child at least 20 minutes per day. This can be done by having short reading sessions throughout the day to add up to 20 minutes total, which can help with shorter attention spans. Try books that repeat words; involve activities like counting, identifying colors, objects or letters; or, are about things your child likes. Ask questions like, "What do you think happens next?"
- Talk with your child everywhere – at home, in the car, at the store. Have real conversations with your preschooler. Make up stories

- or songs about your outings.
- Writing begins with scribbling. Give your child safe writing tools to play with, like crayons, chalk or markers and blank paper. Ask your child to tell you about their drawings. Also, writing requires fine motor strength. Your child can build hand strength by playing with play dough.
- Teach your child how to use the bathroom by themselves, to wash their hands after going to the bathroom and before eating, to blow their nose and sneeze into their elbow.
- Since preschoolers may be in places where cloth face coverings are required, help them get used to wearing them. The American Academy of Pediatrics offers reassurance that mask wearing becomes routine when reinforced by adults and peers, just like wearing a bicycle helmet and buckling into their car seats.

Kindergarten Paraprofessional Lee Ann Miller. "This is an exciting time for them, preparing them for the beginning of their educational career. Activities that help strengthen their fine motor skills are important. Some fun fine motor exercises are stringing beads, putting nuts and bolts together, or painting with Q-tips. These are activities that will help them prepare for writing. Reading to your child, and having them look for colors and shapes in everyday items are fun ways to get them learning."

Even if you don't have kindergarteners this year, it's never too early to start helping kids prepare. Children who have positive early childhood experiences tend to score higher on school readiness assessments and are more likely to do well in school and graduate.

By turning everyday moments into learning moments, we can send our young kids to school with the skills and confidence that will help them succeed in kindergarten and beyond.
