Julia Cerda Crawford awarded Esperanza Teacher Award by CPLC

Julia Cerda Crawford, a resident of Kearny, was recently awarded the Chicanos por la Causa Esperanza Latino Teacher Award. Crawford is a Spanish teacher at Miami High School.

The nomination required letters of recommendation from colleagues and her school administration. Her teaching techniques are student focussed and creative. She works diligently to immerse her students in the culture while also teaching Spanish. Singing songs in the Spanish variation is also an important part of her technique. Crawford highlighted the difficulties of teaching during COVID restrictions and how many of her students did not have the internet connections to fully participate in the class. Despite the challenges she found ways to communicate with the students in the event that they could not fully participate due to the lack of internet.

Many times the audio connections would not work appropriately.

Crawford's nomination described her as a student-focussed teacher, making time to make her students feel special on their birthdays and everyday greeting them with a handshake and warm smile. Teaching at a Title 1 school, she understands that many students do not have the same opportunity to celebrate special days like their birthdays, so ensuring that her students feel special and respected is important to her. Her struggles as a student at ASU while raising her family and commuting from Kearny were also recognized in her nomination as obstacles she has had to overcome. She immigrated to Los Angeles from Monterrey, Nuevo Leon, Mexico and became a U.S. Citizen in her 20s. She is proud to have completed her education and earn her bachelor's degree in Spanish at age 51.

Hayden's baseball and softball teams are currently ranked #5 and #9 respectively

as of Monday, April 25. This puts them on track for appearances at the playoff games.

The Lobos started last week off with a double header against San Manuel. The

Lobos found the victory for both of the games. The first game ended with a 17-3 final score. The second game ended with a 12-1 final score.

Coming off of their two wins, the next day the boys traveled to face off against Lincoln Prep. Though the game started with Lincoln Prep getting the first run, the Lobos brought the heat during the second inning, posting 5 runs and securing their lead. The game finished with a final score of 14-3.

The boys ended their week with a Saturday game against St. David, where the Lobos found their fourth win of the week, when they beat their opponents 8-5.

The Lady Lobos started off their week with a tough 1-11 loss against San Manuel on April 19. During their April 22 game against Leading Edge Academy, the girls made sure the outcome would be different, and it did. The Lady Lobos claimed the victory against LEA with a final score of 29-3.

Ray's teams are also on track for the playoffs. The Bearcats are ranked #8 and the Lady 'Cats are ranked at #11. Final

rankings were not available at press time. Games start next week.

The Ray baseball team kicked off last week with a tough loss against Morenci, ending with a 4-11 final score. The following day, the Bearcats hosted Superior. The boys took the lead at the beginning of the game and left Superior trying to catch up for the remainder of the game, resulting in a 13-3 victory by the sixth inning.

The Bearcats closed out their week with an away double header against Baboquivari. During the first game, the Bearcats took the lead in the second inning, and kept it for the remainder of the game. Baboquivari were only able to post 2 runs, one during the sixth inning, and one during the seventh inning. The first game ended with a 7-2 victory for the Bearcats. The second game only went into the fifth inning, before the Bearcats 10-run-ruled Baboquivari. The final score for the second game was 14-4.

It was a tough week for the Lady 'Cats who suffered tough losses from Morenci (1-4), and Superior (2-13).

Kearny skate park, anyone?

Kids from Kearny and surrounding area deserve more than a flat surface to use their skateboards – they need a Skate Park! The Kearny Town Manager, some highly-motivated kids and a couple of guides are attempting to make that happen via a Skate Park Grant. But they need your help.

Important conditions of the grant are community and end user (skaters) involvement.

“Our skaters range in size and age from little to big,” said Tom O’Connor, who is a leadership guide and a member of the Kearny Town Council.

The team has had three meetings, the first with parents and skaters and the last two with the skaters at which time a core group of kids to lead the effort was formed. Logan, the skate park lead, has and will work with his team members on design, fund raising and plans along with the help of their guides.

The team has identified a few features to make the Skate Park interesting and inviting to skaters such as a turtle shell, half pipe, bridge and lots of ramps were just a few ideas. How about a skate park concession stand for on-the-spot repair or just “hot” new items for sale?

“We cannot forget the money aspect,” O’Connor added. “Yes, another condition of the grant the team is seeking: evidence of community skate park fund raising support. The team is looking for ways to prove their seriousness about getting this built now! It’s the effort that counts!”

The grant will support a 3,000-square-foot skate park, and per the core team, “it’s a start and should be expandable when more funding is available.”

Fundraisers and coordinators, sponsors, rallies, maybe watch the kids having fun on the various forms of skateboards and have a paid ticket picnic show are a few
