Pinal County to suspend issuance of open burn permits starting in April

FLORENCE, AZ -Starting April 2, Pinal County Air Quality begin issuing only three-day open burning permits. All permits will expire May 1 and Pinal County will suspend the issuance of all open burning permits on

Burn permits allow for the disposal of plant material by open burning during limited daytime hours.

Additionally, State law prohibits open burning in Area

A from May 1 thru Sept. 30. The Pinal County portion of Area A includes Apache Junction, Queen Creek, Gold Canyon, San Tan Valley and portions of Florence.

The annual cycle of rising temperatures will quickly dry seasonal vegetation, leading to an acute wildfire risk in the desert and upland areas of the County.

The suspension on burn permits will continue until the

summer monsoons arrive and mitigate the dual risks to public safety and public health.

Archaeologists, tribal monitors talk about Resolution Copper Cultural Resource Studies in Superior April 10

The Superior Community Working Group (CWG) will hear a presentation about Native American cultural resource studies and monitoring being conducted for the Resolution Copper Project at the next CWG meeting on Wednesday, April 10, at 6 p.m. in the Superior Chamber of Commerce meeting room. Guest speakers will be LeRoy Shingoitewa and Scott O'Mack from Westland Resources, who are overseeing the work currently underway, mostly by Native American tribal members and specialists.

The CWG includes residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, Hewitt Station, Globe, Kearny, Winkelman, the San Carlos Community and around the area. The group deals with the social and environmental issues, science and policy, and the pros and cons of the proposed Resolution Copper Project. Topics

include environmental impacts, health, safety, natural resource issues, engineering, water quantity and quality, geology, economics, air quality, community investments, recreational changes and other related subjects.

Meetings are held at the Superior Chamber of Commerce at 165 W. Main St. in Superior from 6-8 p.m., most often on the second Wednesday of each month. The public is welcome, and time is reserved on the agenda for everyone's comments, questions, and discussion.

child with a Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) volunteer, however, will leave the foster care system two-and-a-half months earlier, on average, compared to a child without a CASA volunteer. Studies show children with a CASA volunteer receive more services that are critical to their well-being than children without an advocate, and those children are more likely to achieve educational success.

"CASA volunteers are a constant for the child in a time of chaos," said Leverance, "A child may have multiple social workers, attorneys, therapists and foster placements throughout the life of the case but only one CASA volunteer, which can make all the difference for the child's future."

CASA of Gila County is a member of the National Court Appointed Special Advocate Association (National CASA), a nationwide network of programs in nearly 1,000 communities. At the heart of the movement are nearly 77,000 highly trained volunteers who advocate for the best interests of more than 250,000 of America's children who have been abused or neglected. In Southern Gila County, there are 6 volunteer advocates fighting for the best interests of 5 children, but 70 more children need the care and support of a CASA volunteer.



Oracle State Park named to top three hiking trails to explore in April

PHOENIX – Spring weather and Arizona State Parks and Trails go hand-in-hand! This is the perfect time of year to lace up your boots, grab your water bottle, and hit the trails

Because there's an extensive network of trails in the more than 30 parks around the state, we narrowed it down to our top three springtime hikes that are sure to please with views and adventure alike.



Up next: Apr. 5 at Arizona Lutheran Academy and Apr. 9 vs. Hayden. Both games are scheduled for 4 p.m.



Bearcats start new winning streak




