

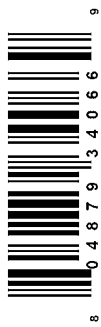

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OBITUARY

Ramiro 'Milo' Ramirez



Ramiro "Milo" Ramirez was born in Jerome, AZ on Sept. 26, 1925 to parents Ignacia and Miguel Ramirez and entered into heaven into the Lord's arms on the morning of March 28, 2021.

Milo spent his early youth delivering milk in the town of Jerome. In 1943 at the age of 18 he joined the US Navy and was stationed in Guam to provide

protection for the US occupied island until 1946 when he was honorable discharged. He was awarded a US Victory Medal for his service.

Upon Milo's return to Jerome he met and married Sara Carreras and stated a family. During that time he began working in the Jerome Copper Mine until its closure in 1953. Milo quickly found a new job at the Magma Copper Mine in Superior, where he worked in Exploration and Development of deep copper ore beds as a diamond driller. He was also managing director of the house limited on behalf of all Trafalgar Drilling Company for 30 years until the mine closed in 1982. He also worked for the University of Arizona in Tucson to drill for Exploration and Development of Core Samples for the U of A.

Milo then served as a security guard for Pinkerton Security in Superior until his retirement. Over the years he was a devoted husband and he cared for his wife of 50 years up until her death in 1996.

Milo continued to remain active by welding, yard

cleaning, and volunteering at the community food bank. Most days you could find him at the Senior Citizen's Center or Church.

Milo was a loving father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. He is survived by his three daughters, Terry (Richard) Coronado, Josie Ramirez, and Della Ramirez; 6 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. Milo was preceded in death by his wife, Sara, and great-grandson, Jessie Michael Casillas Ramirez.

He will be greatly missed and never forgotten. His legacy of hard work, strength and dedication will continue on through his family.

Services for Milo were held Friday, April 2, 2021 at Superior Funeral Home. He was laid to rest at Fairview Cemetery.

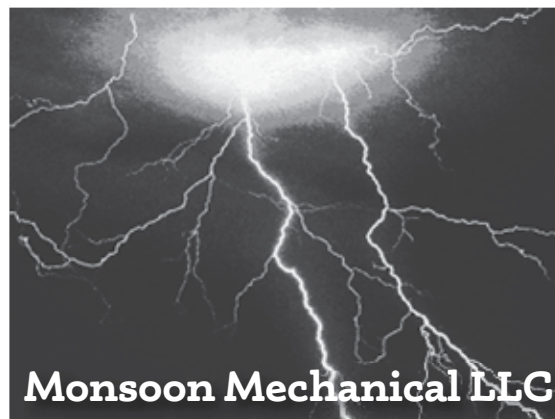

ADOT says lane restrictions and delays to be expected on Pinto Creek, Winkelman Bridge projects

Motorists on US 60 between Miami and Superior will encounter lane restrictions and delays Wednesday, April 7, through Friday, April 10, for the Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project.

Flaggers and restrictions are scheduled Wednesday and Thursday from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Friday 7 a.m. to noon.

The restrictions are necessary while crews haul girders for the new bridge to the work site and place them to form the bridge.

While delays will generally be limited to 15 minutes, longer delays are possible during peak travel times.

Motorists should proceed

with caution, slow down, watch for equipment, and follow the directions of flaggers and law enforcement.

Winkelman Bridge

Motorists crossing the Gila River Bridge on State Route 77 in Winkelman may encounter delays the week of Monday, April 5, while crews remove concrete barriers, pave, and complete other work on the new bridge deck.

Work is scheduled during daylight hours. Delays of approximately 15 minutes are possible.

Drivers should follow the direction of flaggers. Temporary signals will continue to control traffic when flaggers are not present.

The overall project is on track for completion by early June.

Drivers should slow down and watch for construction personnel and equipment.

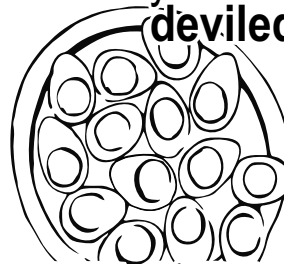
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Superior PD, Copper Corridor Community Substance Abuse Coalition to co-sponsor drug take-back event

Don't dispose of unused or expired medications by flushing them down the toilet. Instead, bring expired and unused pills, powders, patches and ointments to a drive-through drug take-back event April 24 at the Superior Senior Center, 360 Main St., from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. Drop off your medications without leaving your car. Pills, powders, patches and ointments are accepted but do not bring needles, inhalers or liquids. Copper Corridor Community Substance Abuse Coalition and Superior Police Department co-sponsor this event.

This event coincides with the Drug Enforcement Administration's Take Back Day.

With opioid overdose deaths increasing during the pandemic, the Drug Enforcement Administration announces its 20th Take Back Day is scheduled for April 24th. At its last Take Back Day in October, DEA collected a record-high amount of expired, unwanted, and unused prescription medications, with the public turning in close to 500 tons of unwanted drugs. Over the 10-year span of Take

Back Day, DEA has brought in more than 6,800 tons of prescription drugs. With studies indicating a majority of abused prescription drugs come from family and friends, including from home medicine cabinets, clearing out unused medicine is essential.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the U.S. has seen an increase in overdose deaths during the COVID-19 pandemic, with 83,544 Americans overdosing during the 12-month period ending July 1, 2020, the most ever recorded in a 12-month period. The increase in drug overdose deaths appeared to begin prior to the COVID-19 health emergency, but accelerated significantly during the first months of the pandemic.

The public can drop off potentially dangerous prescription medications at collection sites which will adhere to local COVID-19 guidelines and regulations in order to maintain the safety of all participants and local law enforcement.

DEA and its partners will collect tablets, capsules, patches, and other solid forms

of prescription drugs. Liquids (including intravenous solutions), syringes and other sharps, and illegal drugs will not be accepted. DEA will continue to accept vaping devices and cartridges at its drop off locations provided lithium batteries are removed.

Helping people dispose of potentially harmful prescription drugs is just one way DEA is working to reduce addiction and stem overdose deaths.

Superior spring athletes back in action, posting wins

After a winter season with no sports due to COVID-19, athletes at Superior High School are back in action on the baseball and softball diamonds.

As of April 5, 2021, the Superior high school baseball team stands with an even 3-3 record. The team's season started in March with a win against Lincoln Prep. The Panthers have been battling to keep their record even or positive. Their second game was a loss to Miami. The third was a win against the Hayden Lobos. The fourth and fifth games were losses to Florence and Tempe Prep. Their last game on Saturday, April 3, against Coolidge, the team was able to even out their record.

"We finally showed up and came to

play," said Coach Manuel Ortega. "We were focused and mentally ready for this game, unlike our previous two games. We hit the ball really well as a team."

Coach Ortega also mentioned notable players.

"Our whole team played really well, but some outstanding players for that game were Matthew Cruz, who went 4 for 5 with a grand slam and 6 RBIs, he finished a triple shy of the circle. He also started the game on the mound, and got the W with 8 strike outs," he said.

Other notable players were Nathan Duarte, and Adam Navarrette who both went 2 for 4, and had a couple RBIs as well. The final score of the Coolidge game was 15-4, Superior.

"Our expectations for the rest of the season is to bring the championship trophy back home," stated Coach Ortega.

"In order for us to do that, we need to get better still. We need to be focused and ready mentally when we have games."

On April 7, the panthers will travel to Lincoln Prep for their seventh game, and the second against them.

The softball team stands with a 4-0 record.

The girls season started with a win and a 14-point difference against Miami, with a final score of 18-4. The next game, against Hayden ended with a larger point difference, with a 26-4 win. When playing against Florence the girls completely shut them out with a 20-0 victory. Their last game was on March 27, against Chandler Prep. The girls walked away with another win to add to their clean record. The final score of the Chandler Prep game was 21-9.

"The game versus Chandler Prep was

challenging, as we were down several players and had to move players into positions they had not practiced," said Coach Alfonso Lopez. "We had an outstanding performance from our junior pitcher Danika Bryant, going all 7 innings and keeping us in the game until our bats came alive with a 10-run sixth inning."

Another noteworthy player is Alisha Garcia going 5 for 5 at the plate.

"The girls are working hard, and are determined to get back to the championship game again. It's been a rough year and they're happy and feeling blessed to just have the opportunity," said Lopez, "We have a small squad this year, but we are expecting great things, as they are hard workers and making great progress thus far."

On Friday April 9, they will face off against Hayden for the second time.
