

Lobos head into the 1A baseball semi-finals May 13

The Hayden baseball team continues its trek towards the state finals, after a week of two victories.

The Lobos claimed their round one win against Lincoln Prep. The Lobos took the lead early with a 6-run first inning. Lincoln Prep spent the game trying to break past Hayden's tough defense, and came close, but fell short by 1 run. The game ended with a final score of 8-7, sending the Lobos into

the quarterfinals.

"It's a team we beat twice, and it's hard to beat a team three times, especially in a playoff game. It was a good win. We stress a lot of team play, everybody has their role on that team, and they keep on doing their roles, and their getting better and better every game," commented coach Robert Lorona.

The Lobos traveled to Williams on May 7, to face them in the quarterfinals. The boys came back victorious, beating the Vikings 9-1, sending them to the semifinals to face Mogollon.

"To go up there and play an away game that's about a four-and-a-half-to-five hour trip, and to come out with a good win from our team, it's a big deal," commented coach Lorona.

Ray's playoff plans ended in the quarterfinals.

The Bearcats competed in two state playoff games during the past week. On May 3, the Bearcats hosted Fredonia in the round one playoff game. The boys took it to the Lynx, gaining a 3-run lead in the first inning, and continuing to grow it, until they beat Fredonia in the fifth inning with a final score of 13-0.

On May 7, the Bearcats traveled to Mogollon to play them in the quarterfinals. The boys had a rough start to the game, not being able to post any runs until the third inning, already down by 8 runs. The Bearcats tried to keep up the momentum, but by the end of the fifth inning, Mogollon had Ray beat by 10 runs. The game ended with a final score of 5-15, closing out the boys 2022 baseball season.

The Ray and Hayden softball teams both closed out their seasons after suffering losses in the first round of playoffs. Ray fell to Desert Christian 2-12 and Hayden took a heart-breaking loss, 7-8, to Mohave Accelerated.

Bennie was born in McNary, Arizona on Feb. 18, 1939,




