Pinal County Sheriff's Detectives are investigating an officer-involved shooting that proved fatal for a Kearny man

On Friday, May 8, Kearny Police Department requested the assistance of the PCSO-Criminal Investigations Bureau following a shooting that occurred in the 59700 block of E. Bidegain Pl., Kearny.

According to Tim Gaffney, PCSO Public Information Officer, detectives learned that at 11:03 p.m., a woman called 9-1-1 to report that her husband had returned to their house. The dispatcher reported hearing yelling and screaming in the background. The husband was later identified as Shaun Johnson, 35.

Kearny Police Officers told detectives that they had contacted Johnson earlier in the evening after he had been asked to leave a local bar; he had reportedly been causing a disturbance.

As KPD officers arrived in the neighborhood, they met the woman as she was walking down the street with her children. She told officers that her husband, Johnson, was inside the residence.

According to PCSO, as two KPD officers approached the residence, Johnson charged out at them, swinging a Samurai sword. "The officers gave repeated verbal commands for him to drop the sword," PCSO Sheriff Paul Babeu said, "but he refused." Johnson turned and ran behind the residence still carrying the sword. As officers chased after him, they rounded a corner and Johnson was waiting for them with the sword above his head in a striking stance.

"An officer who was 6 to 8 feet away from him feared for his safety and fired four rounds from his department issued handgun, striking Shaun in the chest," Babeu said. "(He) received emergency medical attention at the scene, but was pronounced deceased."

The case remains under investigation by PCSO detectives. PCSO Detectives are continuing with the investigation at this time.

Rose Law Group and the county supervisors

On April 24, 2015, the Rose Law Group sponsored a breakfast at their law office in Scottsdale for Pinal County Supervisors House and Smith.

The Group spokesperson released a written announcement concerning the breakfast that stated: "Rose Law Group has always supported District 4 Supervisor, Anthony Smith and District 5 Supervisor, Todd House as they have such a business friendly balanced approach to governance. We... are so happy to have them as County Supervisors....While there is no cost to attend (the breakfast), if you feel inclined to contribute to their campaigns as we do (Todd House campaign donation-2014-\$1000.00), contributions are limited to 2,500 per individual."

In February, 2015, the Rose Law Group argued for the approval of eight outdoor marijuana grow areas and approximately ten marijuana dispensaries in Pinal County. Supervisors House and Smith voted to approve a change to a zoning ordinance that can bring about the open grow farms, even though the Pinal County Planning and Zoning Commission voted 9-1 against the ordinance change, and the Pinal County Sheriff's Office and multiple citizens

CHAMPIONS!! Panthers defeat Miners to win State Championship

Superior softball head coach Martin Navarrette proved to be prophetic after the fifth-seeded Panthers won the Division IV State Softball Championship on Monday, defeating defending back-to-back champion San Manuel 3 – 0 at Arizona State University's Farrington Stadium.

After watching his team defeat San Manuel and Ray on consecutive Friday's in April, Navarrette knew his team was playing as well as it had all season.

"It's the best time to be peaking – going into the playoffs – and I expect big things going in," he told the Superior Sun after a 6 – 2 victory over Ray on April 24.

Then at last week's Sports Awards Banquet, the night before facing fourthseeded Ray in the quarterfinals, he told those in attendance, "Let's beat Ray – and you (*Superior Sun* reporter) can put that in the paper."

And, of course, the Panthers defeated Ray 5 – 4 to reach the semi-finals versus top-seeded Veritas Prep, a team with arguably one of the best pitchers in the state.

Instead it was Panthers' ace starting pitcher Ivie Lopez who looked like the best pitcher in the state, throwing a completegame three-hit shutout in the 1 – 0 victory and advancing the Panthers to the state championship game.

Lopez, a junior, who Navarrette called a

pitcher "nobody wants to face right now" at last week's banquet, was on her game again against the Miners, one of the best hitting teams in the state. Thanks to some outstanding defensive plays from shortstop Gabby Salcido, Lopez stifled the Miners, throwing a four-hit shutout against the two-time defending champs. She finished with six strikeouts in the game.

"I was relaxed to start, but a little more when we got a run to start the game," Lopez told AZPreps365.com reporter Les Willsey after her performance in the championship game. "Having a run to fall back on before they batted gave me a boost."

Lopez threw shutouts in three of the four games in the state playoffs, again making her head coach appear prophetic.

"She took the sticks out of their hands today," Navarrette told AZPreps365.com about his ace. "Their No. 2-3-4 hitters couldn't get anything going. She did a great job against them.The last four or five games we've been calling pitches for her. She seemed more relaxed, and in the tournament she's been right on it."

The Panthers got on the scoreboard early on a first-inning RBI single by team Co-MVP Cierra Navarrette that scored Jalisa Murray, who had reached on an infield single to start the game.

The score remained that way until the sixth when Phalicitee Thomas, who Navarrette announced as the Offensive

Player of the Year at the banquet, hit a tworun homerun, scoring Alicia Arriola who had singled.

"This was my second home run this year," Thomas told AZPreps365.com. "The first one was at our home field against the Miami Vandals. That one was nice, but this one was way bigger."

The Panthers' final win of the season gave them their second State Championship, the last one coming in 2007. They ended the season with a 10-game winning streak, including the last three of the playoffs against teams that were ranked No. 1 at one time during the season – fourth-seed Ray, top-seeded Veritas Prep, and third-seeded San Manuel.

"We had the toughest road to get here," Navarrette told azcentral sports. "We earned it."

Panthers' season ends after loss to Ray

The 10th-seeded Superior baseball team entered last Friday's quarterfinal matchup versus second-seeded Ray looking to avenge two regular season losses to the Bearcats. Unfortunately, for the Panthers, the third time was not the charm as they saw their season end in a 5-1 loss.

Superior, which finished its season 14 - 8, defeated San Pasqual Valley and Northland Prep before losing to Ray, a team that will play for the state championship on May 16.

After falling behind 2 – 0 in the first inning, the Panthers cut the lead in half in the bottom of the first on an RBI hit by Elias Olmos.

The score remained that way until the fourth, when Ray scored three runs to increase their lead to 5-1.


Superior ace Rickey Longoria pitched six innings and allowed only two hits in the game but surrendered seven walks, giving the Cats additional opportunities to score runs.



"Take advantage of all the clubs and programs," said Matthew.


"Challenge yourself and get out of your comfort zone," said Hunter.

SHS students earn a quarter of a million dollars in scholarships

For the record, I am opposed to the legalization of marijuana, as I am equally opposed to the recent raising of Pinal County property taxes. There are those who suggest that legalization of marijuana will lower property taxes, and perhaps that is true, but I doubt it. I propose however, that the connective costs to Pinal County taxpayers as a result of the negative effects (especially on our youth) of the legalization of marijuana will be – ultimately - colossal in both financial and societal perspectives.
