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Ortega found guilty in killing of his wife, attempted murder of brother-in-law

Globe, Arizona - Gila County Attorney Bradley D. Beauchamp announced that on May 6, 2014, 38 year-old Guillermo Ortega, III was found guilty by a jury of six women and six men of Second Degree Murder, Attempted Second Degree Murder, and four counts of Aggravated Assault following a seven-day jury trial.

According to Chief Deputy Shawn C. Fuller,

who prosecuted the case, evidence was presented that on April 28, 2013, at approximately 5:45 p.m., Ortega attacked his ex-wife with a knife following a brief domestic violence-related dispute the two had in her home, which was located in

Hayden. During the attack the victim suffered fatal injuries to her neck.

While the victim was being attacked, her brother, who was inside the home, heard a struggle and came to her aid. The defendant then attacked the victim's brother with

the knife and attempted to kill him by stabbing him in the chest and the neck. After the attack the defendant fled the scene and was apprehended several hours later in Pinal County.

Ortega's sentencing is scheduled to be conducted

in Globe on June 2, 2014, at 3:30 p.m., before the Honorable Robert Duber II. Ortega is facing a mandatory prison sentence of up to 46 years.

County Attorney Beauchamp commended the Hayden Police Department, the

Department of Public Safety, the Golder Ranch Fire District, the Kearny Police Department, and the Pinal County Sheriff's Office for conducting the investigation that led to the successful apprehension and prosecution of Ortega.

The Oracle Market, the only complete grocery store in the Tri-Community, is offering more variety and has new products. The market is known for its full service meat counter where a butcher will slice to order your fresh deli meats and cheeses. They make their own chorizo (beef, beef and pork and pork) and breakfast sausage. Their steaks, pork and chicken are premium quality and they offer a selection of fish. Bratwurst and Italian sausages and bacon are sold by the pound. Marinated steaks as well as beef fajitas and carne asada are available. The deli provides fresh made salsa and pico de gallo along with cole slaw, potato, pasta and macaroni salads. The store makes their own homemade beef jerky. Special deli party trays can be made with 24

hour notice. A 10 percent discount is offered for large meat orders with 72 hours notice.

The Oracle Market is now a great place for a quick lunch. The market is offering breakfast sandwiches and is serving hot and cold food for lunch from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. Rotisserie chickens are made fresh daily and are available seven days a week. They are now

making fresh made to order deli sandwiches. They also have grab and go pre-made sandwiches, roasted chicken quarters and pre-packaged deli salads.

The Oracle Market offers Mexican food products such as La Estrella Mexican pastries, rolls and empanadas; Alejandros tortillas and bakery goods; masa and nixtamal; and Mexican Coca Cola in the bottle and assorted Fanta

sodas. Saladitos and apples and saladitos and lemon can be found at the cash register counter.

There is a small hardware section in the store offering small items such as screws, nuts and bolts and some plumbing supplies. They also have a propane tank exchange section.

Items from local producers are carried in the market. They sell local honey and carry coffee both whole beans as well as ground from Sky Island Roasters in Oracle. Pies and cakes from the Patio Café are sold in the store and organic non-GMO eggs from Huntington's Egg Farm are available.

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Medical marijuana card holder arrested for growing and illegally selling marijuana

A SaddleBrooke man was arrested late last month after detectives serving a search warrant at his home located a large amount of marijuana growing inside.

On Wednesday, April 30, 2014, the Pinal County Sheriff's Narcotic Task Force executed a narcotics search warrant in the 40000 block of E. Ballesta Rd, in the unincorporated area of SaddleBrooke, after receiving information that a man was selling high grade hydroponic marijuana from his residence. The tipster

reported he had a massive high grade marijuana growing operation and was looking to sell high grade marijuana he already had packaged for sale.

The search warrant uncovered a highly sophisticated marijuana growing operation including 97 hydroponic and soil-based marijuana plants. Detectives also found 64.2 pounds of packaged marijuana ready for sale, dangerous drugs (psychedelic mushrooms) and drug paraphernalia.

The 97 marijuana plants

were in various stages of growth.

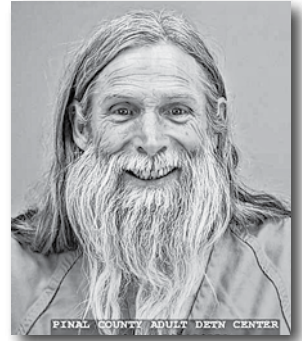
"An average six foot tall plant can produce approximately one pound of usable marijuana," said Sgt. Pat Ramirez, PCSO Public Information Officer. "These plants have a street value of \$2,000 each. The high grade hydroponic

marijuana has a street value of \$2,000 a pound."

Detectives, Ramirez explained, seized approximately \$194,000 worth of marijuana plants and \$128,400 worth of packaged marijuana. Detectives also seized \$1760 in cash.

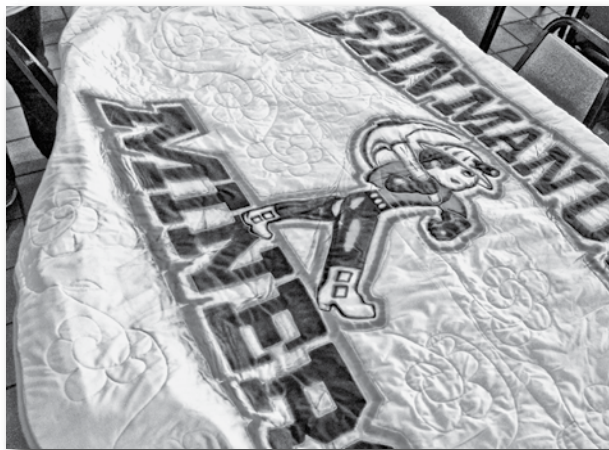

This year the 5/6 class constructed solar ovens which they used to cook

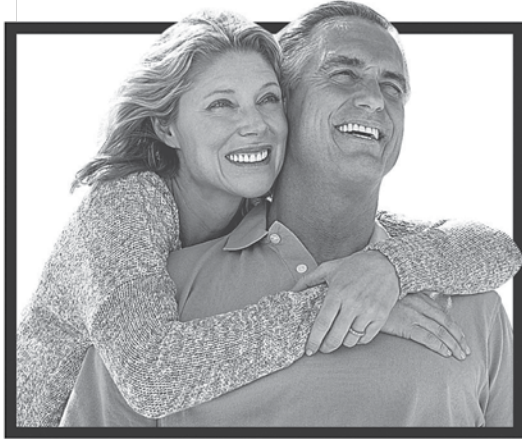
