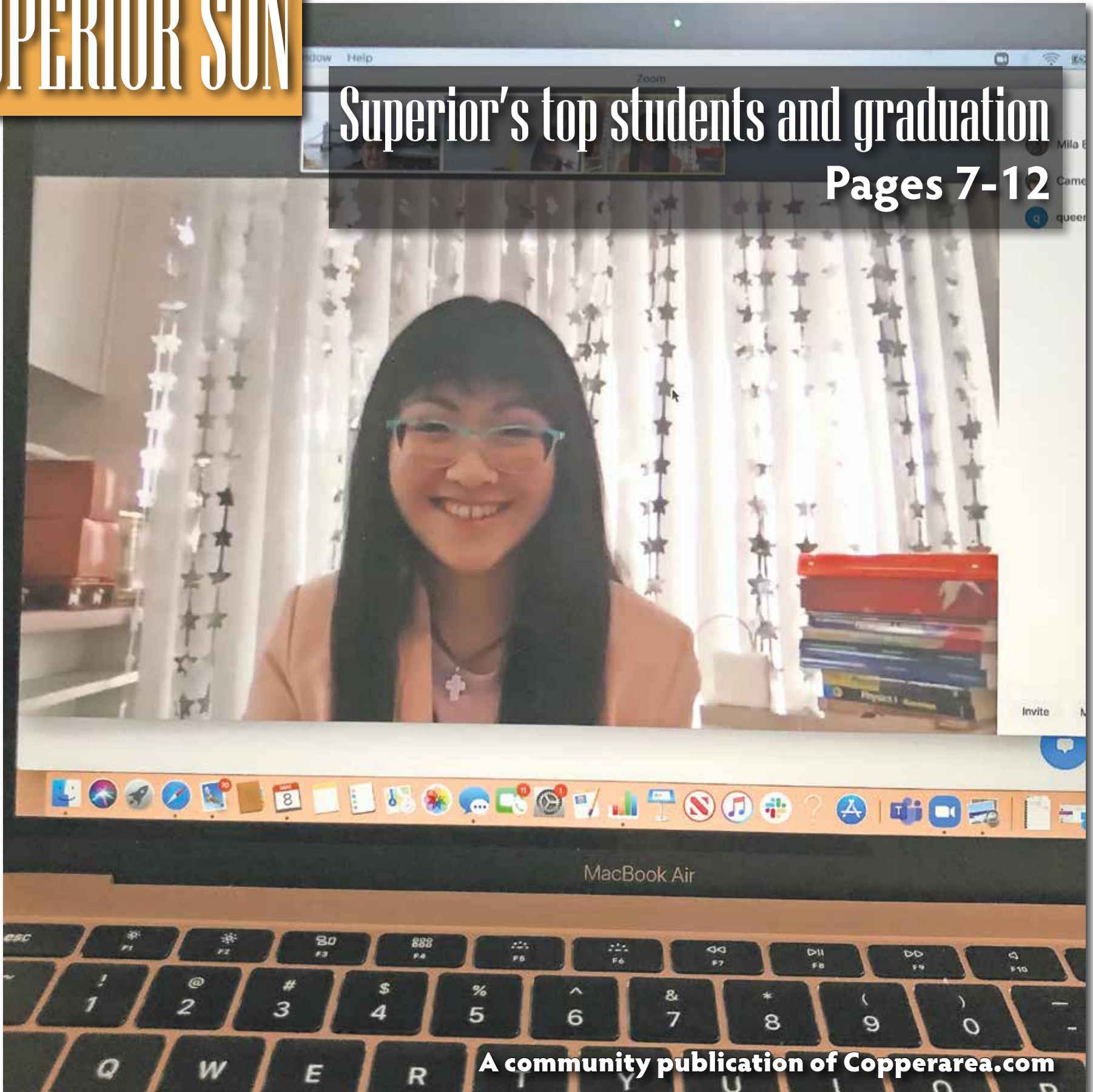
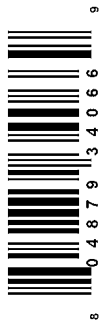

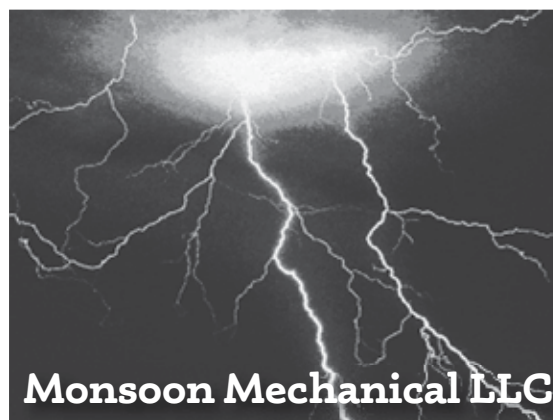

MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day, celebrated on the last Monday in May, honors all of the men and women who died fighting for our country. These men and women dedicated their lives so we can be a free nation.

Having a day to honor the soldiers who lost their lives started after the Civil War (1861-1865). The original name was Decoration Day.

Decoration Day was started on May 5, 1868 by General John A. Logan, Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, head of the Organization of Union Veterans to honor union soldiers who died in the Civil War. It was called Decoration Day because family members of fallen soldiers decorated their graves with flowers.

The first service to honor fallen soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery was held on May 30, 1868. President Ulysses S. Grant

was present at the ceremony and General James Garfield gave a speech.

Decoration Day originally only honored the soldiers who died in the Civil War. After World War I it was changed to all soldiers who lost their lives in war.

On May 11, 1950 Decoration Day was changed to Memorial Day. In 1966, Congress along with President Lyndon Johnson declared Waterloo, New York the birthplace of Memorial Day, and President Richard Nixon declared Memorial Day a federal holiday in 1971

The official flower of Memorial Day are red poppies. People celebrate Memorial Day by placing flowers on soldier's graves, flying flags at half-staff, attending parades and remembering soldiers who lost their lives.

REFLECT AND REMEMBER

The lunc is an American poetic form similar to Japanese Haiku, but shorter and less restrictive. A lunc consists of three short lines dealing with a single topic. It may follow one of several forms.

The first form counts syllables. Line one is 5 syllables, line two is 3 and line three is 5. For example:

**The soldier fights, bleeds,
even dies,
to serve his country.**

A second form counts words. The first line consists of three words, the second 5, and the third 3 again. For example:

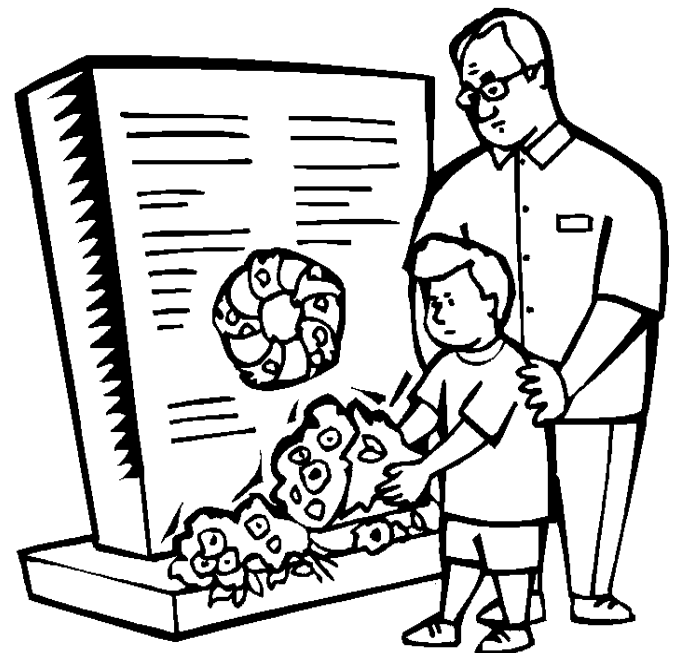
**The soldier goes.

Well it's finally here ... the HOT weather we expect since we live in Arizona. It may be here a bit earlier this year than in years past, but it is here nonetheless. With the heat and hot weather in mind this is a good time to refresh what we know about heat and how

it can affect our health.

Did you know there are three levels of heat related health issues? While some are mild as they progress with no intervention, they can potentially become life-threatening.

Before we get into the levels of a heat-related illness, what causes a heat-related illness? A heat-related illness is caused when the body is not able to properly cool itself. Normally the body cools itself by sweating during extreme heat or physical exertion. A high body temperature can cause damage to the brain and other vital organs.

So, who is most at risk for developing a heat-related illness? Older adults, the very young, and people with chronic diseases. Some factors, but not all, that might increase your risk of developing a heat-related illness include things like:

- High levels of humidity
- Heart disease
- Obesity
- Mental illness
- Fever

- Poor circulation
- Dehydration
- Sunburn
- Prescription or illegal drug use
- Alcohol use

It is not only those with existing health issues who may be affected by high heat and temperatures. Young and healthy people can be affected if they participate in strenuous physical activities during hot weather.

So, what can you do to help you and your family stay cool? Try these suggestions:

- Wear appropriate clothing. Choose lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.
- Stay cool indoors. Stay in air-conditioning as much as possible. A fan can help provide comfort but they aren't effective when the temperatures are in the high 90's. Take a cool shower or bath.
- Schedule outdoor activities carefully.
- Pace yourself. Cut down on exercise during times of high heat.
- Wear sunscreen. Use "Broad Spectrum" or "UVA/UVB protection".

• DO NOT leave kids or pets in hot cars! Temperatures in a vehicle can climb to life-threatening levels in a relatively short time.

- Stay hydrated. Drink more fluids, regardless of how active you are. If your physician has you on medication for water retention, check with your doctor on how much water you should consume.
- Replace Salt and Minerals: Heavy sweating removes salt and minerals from the body that need to be replaced. A sports drink can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat. If you are on a low-salt diet, have diabetes, high blood pressure, or other chronic conditions, talk with your doctor before drinking a sports beverage or taking salt tablets.
- Make sure you also keep your pets hydrated!! Leave them bowls of cool, clean water.

While everyone can experience a heat-related illness the most susceptible groups are the very young, the elderly and those with certain medical conditions. When

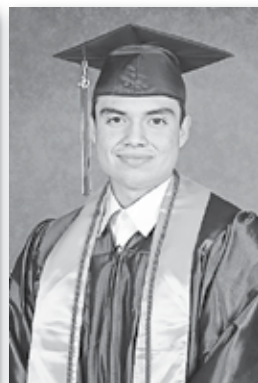

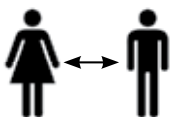

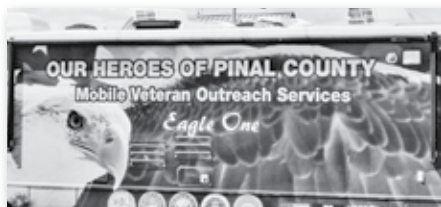
