Young people are moving out of rural Arizona. Local First Arizona is asking: What can help them stay?

(May 19, 2023) — Young people between the ages of 16 and 24 from rural Arizona are wanted to give feedback about jobs, housing, educational and recreational opportunities in their communities and why they have stayed or moved away.

Small towns and cities are facing a similar challenge: Young people are moving to larger cities, causing local jobs to remain vacant and threatening the long-term viability of communities.

The survey will ask young Arizonans what they love

about the rural places where they grew up and how towns can support them to stay. What do they need and want in terms of careers, education, housing and recreation to continue to call rural

communities home?

The survey of rural youth and young professionals is being conducted by the nonprofit economic-development organization Local First Arizona in collaboration with the

Partnership for Workforce Innovation.

“As Arizona’s Rural Development Council, Local First Arizona is working closely with rural, tribal and business leaders to meet the needs

of workers and employers across the state,” said Kate Stuart, Local First Arizona senior programs manager for rural development. “We are seeing critical challenges to recruiting employees in rural areas, even when businesses waive just about all qualifications and provide on-the-job training, and to retaining the young workers they do hire.”

“This survey will provide important feedback for local leaders so they can better serve young singles and families as they develop industries, housing developments, training programs and community activities in rural Arizona,” Stuart added.

Local First welcomes responses to the online survey from young people in rural communities anywhere in Arizona, but

More delays announced for Resolution Copper permitting

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced on Thursday that they needed more time for tribal consultations and to review the Resolution Copper Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS). They made the announcement by briefing the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals that more time was needed for review and tribal consultation.

In March an attorney from the United States Forest Service

announced that the FEIS would be re-released sometime this spring during his testimony to the 9th Circuit Court en banc hearing for the Apache Stronghold vs U.S. Government. The case for Apache Stronghold is contending that the approval of the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and subsequent approval of the Resolution Copper FEIS would violate their rights to practice their religion freely if the Oak Flat Campground is destroyed or not available to be used.

Many close to the project were expecting the EIS to be re-released in the next few weeks.

The Resolution Copper FEIS was first pulled for further review in March of 2021, and during the summer of 2022, additional tribal consultation was ordered.

There is no estimated timeline when the consultation would be completed.

is focusing specifically on eight communities:

Bylas, Holbrook, Globe, Hayden, Kingman, Miami, Superior and Winkelman.

These communities represent a spectrum of success and complexity in growing their younger demographics. Responses from residents in these areas will provide valuable insights to other cities and towns looking for answers.

For example: Hayden, in Pinal and Gila counties, has lost nearly half its working-age population over a decade. The 19-64 age group has shrunk from 575 to 296 over that time, according to the 2020 U.S. Census. Seven percent of Hayden's residents work in the town, with 80% commuting 25 to 95 miles away to jobs as far as Phoenix, according to a study by the Partnership for Workforce Innovation.

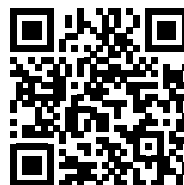
The youth exodus is a phenomenon that many rural areas in the country have been grappling with. Census data show that deaths outnumbered births in eight out of 15 Arizona counties and more than 50% of U.S. counties in 2020, which can indicate fewer younger workers available to replace retiring Baby Boomers. This

can impact job growth and the sustainability of essential services such as healthcare and education.

"Young people are essential to sustaining vibrant local economies in rural Arizona," Stuart continued. "They are the future civic leaders and champions that every community needs for long-term success to create great places to live, build businesses, grow careers, raise families and enjoy a high quality of life."

Local First Arizona will debut the findings of the research with rural and tribal leaders at the 16th Annual Rural Policy Forum in Miami in Gila County on Aug. 3-4 and share it with rural communities over the coming months.

Superior High School graduates earn over \$360,000 in scholarships

The Superior High School hosted the annual scholarship ceremony. This year the rough estimate is over \$360,000 in scholarships and education awards were received by the graduating class.

One of the largest scholarships, the prestigious Flinn Foundation scholarship was awarded to Nathan Taylor.

That scholarship is valued at over \$130,000 and includes study abroad opportunities during his college career.

Mira Estatico was awarded a \$44,000 scholarship to Northern Arizona University where she plans to attend in the fall and Analise Hollenbeck was awarded a \$5,000-a-year scholarship from NAU as well. Jasmin

each from the Martinez Family scholarship fund. The Robert Gus Hernandez scholarship was awarded to Nicholas Mendoza.

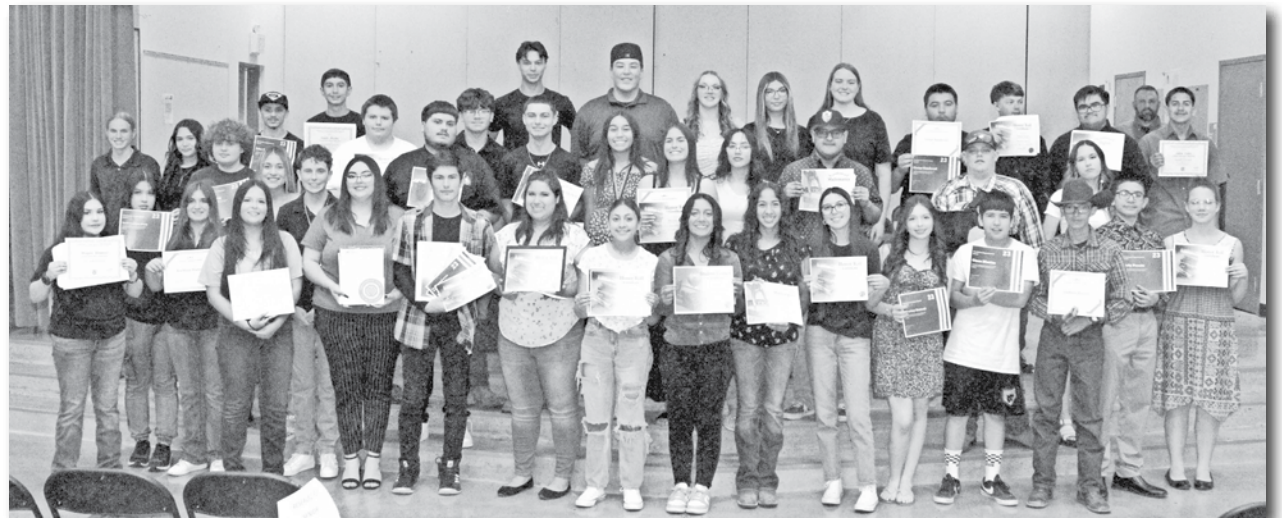

Gliders take to the skies over Superior!

The Town of Superior has long had an airport with a dirt runway. The airport is often used for military training and most recently the U.S. Forest Service has used the airport for wildland fire fighting training. It has been a focus of the Town Council to find additional uses for the airport that help to grow the local economy.

This past weekend, a Scottsdale based company, Aerial Engagement, hosted a glider flying event at the Superior

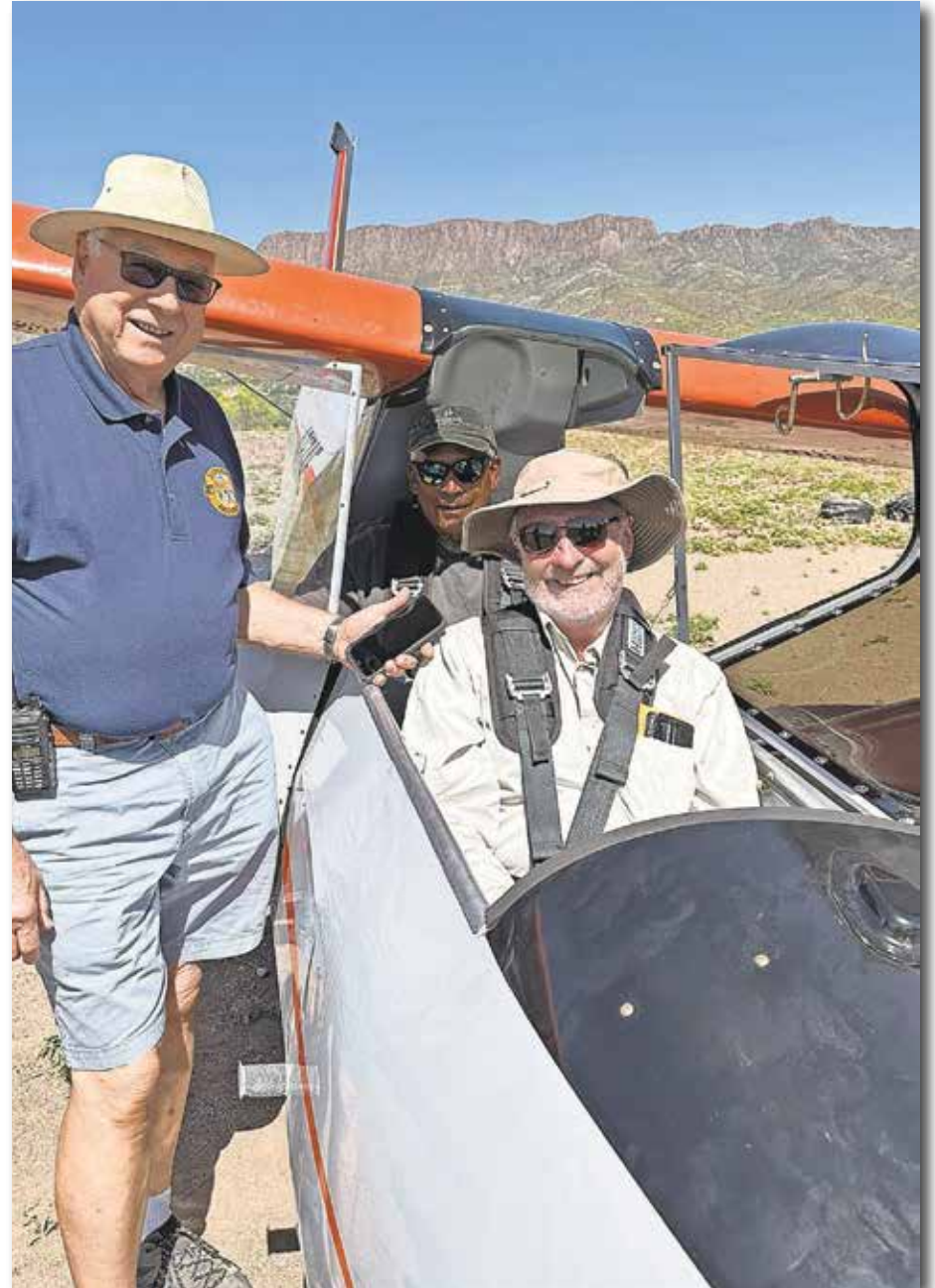
Airport. The gliders are propelled into the air using a winch, then the gliders soar using the air thermals and winds. Pilots from as far away as the United Kingdom attended the glider flying event in Superior. Many of the regional airports are seeing increased traffic and are no longer as viable for the glider flying, which is creating an opportunity for the Superior airport to attract glider pilots to the area.

During the May Superior Town Council

meeting, the Council approved a lease agreement with Superior Soaring LLC and Fledgling Youth LLC, to rent classroom space at the Roosevelt/Town Hall building. Both are businesses under the Aerial Engagement family of businesses. The organizations plan to offer flight simulation training as well as offer a flying school for youth to learn how to fly gliders and other aircraft.

Development is limited at the Superior airport until the Town can have water,

sewer and electrical infrastructure constructed at the airport. Recently Senator Sinema announced that she has requested a congressionally-directed spending appropriation of \$4.1 million to fund the installation of water infrastructure and fire hydrants for the airport and the Boyce Thompson Arboretum. While the funding is not yet fully approved by Congress, the project is on the list of projects to be funded in Arizona.



This was the first glider to launch at the Superior Airport last week. Its pilot is from Great Britain.
