




School Board seats open throughout the Copper Corridor

Are you concerned with our local schools having effective leadership and quality educational programs? If so, it is a great time to consider stepping up and running for election for the available positions on local school boards.

All governing board positions listed below have a term expiration of Dec. 31, 2022. The seats will be on the November 2022 ballots. Open seats include:

- Oracle – two seats with a four-year term each, which are currently held by Gary Terrell and Jeri Taylor; 73 signatures are required.
- Ray – three seats, which are currently held by Jason Wernett (two-year term), Jonathan Ramirez (four-year term) and Tino Flores (four-year term); 11 signatures are required.
- Mammoth-San Manuel – three seats, two with four-year terms, currently held by Terry Newman and Louis Madrid, and one with a two-year term, currently held by Michael Carnes; 15 signatures are required.
- Superior – four seats, one with a two-year term and is currently held by Henry Gutierrez; two with four-year terms that are currently held by Ricardo Provencio and Ignacio Magallanes; and one with a four-year term that is currently vacant; 11 signatures are required.
- CVIT – one seat (Superior School District) with a four-year term currently filled by Louie Rabago; 11 signatures are required.


The first form to file is the Candidate Statement of Interest. It can be downloaded here: <https://bit.ly/3JKLK8K>. This one does not need to be notarized and can be submitted in person, by mail or email to the Pinal County School Office (mkrumrey@pinalco.org).

Several locals have filed their intents to run already: Jeri Taylor for Oracle and Louis Madrid for Mammoth-San Manuel were the first to file. Also intending to run are: Donna Pedota (Oracle), Wendy Biallas-Odell (Oracle), Gary Terrell (Oracle), Augustine-Lou Hing (Superior), Ericka Vasquez (Superior), Hector Aparacio (Superior), Henry Gutierrez (Superior)

Once the Candidate Statement of Interest form has been received by the County School Office and date stamped, the candidate can begin gathering signatures on the Candidate Nomination Form-Nonpartisan and Petitions. Any gathered prior to the date stamp will be nullified. Submit to Pinal County School Office, 75 North Bailey St., Florence, 85132. The filing period for submission of this form and petitions is from 8 a.m. Monday June 10, 2022, until 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 11, 2022. Candidates may not circulate petitions before submitting a Candidate Statement of Interest form first.

Supervisor Cavanaugh to offer Copper Corridor farewell town hall; redistricting has resulted in change of Supervisors



On May 7, 2022, join Supervisor Kevin Cavanaugh for a farewell Town Hall in the San Manuel Community Center at 4:30 p.m.; 111 W. Fifth Ave., San Manuel, AZ 85631.



Redistricting requires that populations of Supervisor Districts be within 10% of each other, and District 1, formerly comprising the Copper Corridor, Coolidge and parts of Florence, was less than half the population of the largest district – San Tan. Redistricting also requires that districts be as compact as possible, so the County Management Team devised a map splitting eastern Pinal County into north and south sections. Supervisor Cavanaugh will now be responsible for portions of Coolidge, Queen Creek, the Ak-Chin, Gila River Indian Community, local members of the Pascua Yaqui Tribe, and the City of Maricopa.

Initially recognizing a need for broadband in the Copper Corridor to drive economic growth, Cavanaugh worked with County Managers to develop a plan utilizing existing fiber cable to bring new infrastructure to the Corridor. The project had been stalled when Supervisor Cavanaugh took office, and he pressed in and helped to allocate funding for the project.





In April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two

months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits

in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown.

The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community as a thank you for supporting us through these troubled times. Our newspapers (*Copper Basin News*, *Superior Sun* and *San Manuel Miner*) have been featuring local businesses and non-profits since the beginning of 2021, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, *Copper Area News* has featured 142 businesses and groups in the Copper Corridor.

Deb Kay and Rita Betti are two sisters who are unafraid of entrepreneurship. They have operated a variety of shops over their careers and both are artists who sell their art. Together along with Terry Nolan, another local artist, they have recently morphed their art gallery into a store that also features items that outdoor adventurers may need along with adding many new natural products.

Their new store is called "All Things

Desert."

You can still find a wide variety of art and work by local artists, priced very affordably. They discovered that many visitors to Superior are looking for specific items like high calorie meal replacement bars, hydration and electrolyte products and other accessories needed for outdoor adventures so they have added many of those products along with a hikers hut, within their store that includes the sale of lightly used hiking gear such as clothes, boots and back packs. Many of the products they sell are also natural products such as mesquite coffee made by Cappadonna Ranch. Several product lines made with Yucca like shampoo bars, soap and foot scrubs. Local baker Aravaipa Condor sells a variety of mesquite flour cookies and other natural fruit tapes along with other desert edibles.


