



Hayden resident, Ortega, sentenced to 38 years for murder and attempted murder

Globe - Gila County Attorney Bradley
D. Beauchamp announced that on June
2, 38 year old Guillermo Ortega III was
sentenced to 38 years in the Arizona
Department of Corrections, for the brutal
domestic violence-related murder of his
ex-wife and the attempted murder of her
brother

According to Chief Deputy County
Attorney Shawn C. Fuller, who prosecuted
the case, Ortega was found guilty of
Second Degree Murder, Attempted
Second Degree Murder and four counts of
Aggravated Assault on May 6, following
a seven-day jury trial. The jury also
found that the State had proven three
aggravating factors - harm to the victims;
multiple victims; and that Ortega had
committed domestic violence offenses in
the presence of a child/children.

During the trial, the State presented evidence that on April 28, 2014, at approximately 5:45 p.m., Ortega attacked his ex-wife with a knife, following a brief domestic violence-related dispute the two had in her home, which was located in Hayden. The victim ran from the house following the attack and later succumbed to her injuries. While the victim was being attacked. her brother, was inside the home, heard a struggle and came to her aid. Ortega then attacked the victim's brother with a knife. After the attack, Ortega got rid of the murder weapon and fled the scene. He was apprehended several hours later in Pinal County.

At sentencing, the State recommended a total prison sentence of 46 years, the most permitted under the law - 25 years for Second Degree Murder, followed by 21 year for Attempted Second Degree Murder. Several members of the victim's family addressed the court prior to sentencing and requested that Ortega be sentenced to the maximum possible term. Prior to pronouncing sentence, the Honorable Robert Duber II found additional aggravating factors, including

that the murder was committed in a cruel manner and Ortega had previously been convicted of Felony Aggravated Assault in 2001

County Attorney Beauchamp commended the Hayden Police Department, the Department of Public Safety, the Golder Ranch Fire District, the Kearny Police Department, and the Pinal County Sheriff's Office for conducting the investigation that led to the successful apprehension and prosecution of Ortega. Mr. Beauchamp also thanked the Time Out domestic violence shelter for attending Ortega's sentencing in support of the victims.

Game and Fish concludes two-year poaching investigation; \$7,500 in fines, assessments levied

TUCSON, Ariz. – The Arizona Game and Fish Department recently concluded a two year investigation of four suspects involved in nine different poaching incidents in the Oracle, Mammoth, Globe and northern Pima County areas.

The charges included unlawful take, possession and transport of multiple deer as well as hunting license fraud, and resulted in \$7,500 in criminal and civil fines, which includes a civil assessment of \$4,500 for the loss of three deer, and two 10 year hunting license revocations.

Charged in the cases were Mario Barragan, Alfred Barragan, Pete Reynoso and Chelsea Hetrick. Charges against Reynoso and Hetrick were dropped in a plea deal.

Mario Barragan was involved in six different incidents, and was criminally fined \$2,302 and civilly assessed \$3,000 for the loss of two deer. In addition, his hunting license was revoked for 10 years.

Alfred Barragan was involved in three different incidents, and was criminally fined \$741 and civilly assessed \$1,500 for loss of one deer. In addition, his hunting license was revoked for 10 years.

"Poachers are not hunters, they are thieves stealing wildlife from the citizens of Arizona," said Regional Supervisor Raul Vega of Game and Fish in Tucson. "We will investigate and prosecute these cases to the fullest extent of the law, regardless of how long it takes to close them."


