No Tax Rate Increase for HWUSD

Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District Tax Rate for 2021 will not increase this year, although Small School Adjustment A.R.S. § 15-905.01 requires the District publish a Truth in Taxation notice.

“The Truth in Taxation notice is misleading,” said Superintendent Jeff Gregorich. “The truth is that while the total tax levy will increase, the district’s tax rate will not change. The district’s primary tax rate this year will be 11.8875, which is exactly the same tax rate as last year. In fact, the district’s

primary tax rate has been frozen for now for six straight years. In addition, the Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District has no secondary tax rate or any intentions of passing bonds or overrides.”

He added, “The small school adjustment helps our district provide quality educational programs for students without passing long term bonds or overrides. These additional funds allow small rural school districts the ability to have the needed resources to operate our schools with equity.”

Truth in Taxation Hearing Notice of Tax Increase

In compliance with §15-905.01, Arizona Revised Statutes, Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District is notifying its property taxpayers of Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District’s intention to raise its primary property taxes over the current level to pay for increased expenditures in those areas where the Governing Board has the authority to increase property taxes for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020. The Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District is proposing an increase in its primary property tax levy of \$965,630.

The amount proposed above will cause Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District’s primary property taxes on a \$100,000 home to be \$704.28. Without the tax increase, the total taxes that would be owed would have been \$413.17.

These amounts proposed are above the qualifying tax levies as prescribed by state law, if applicable. The increase is also exclusive of any changes that may occur from property tax levies for voter approved bonded indebtedness or budget and tax overrides.

All interested citizens are invited to attend the public hearing on the proposed tax increase scheduled to be held July 1, 2020 at 3:00 p.m. at the District Office.

The Shipman and Kearny River Fires have taught us how devastating wildfires can be to our

community.

Once again the current conditions are a perfect storm for a repeat of these tragic events. As residents and homeowners we have the responsibility to protect our community and property by clearing weeds, dry grass, and dead trees from our property. We are asking all residents to take the time to be proactive and assess the fire dangers surrounding your property and clear your property as appropriate.

Kearny Town Code 10-1-15 covers offensive premises and will be utilized to bring properties into compliance. If your property is deemed to be offensive under the town code the person responsible for the property has ten days to rectify the violations given on the written notice from the Kearny Police Department. Violation of this code is a class 2 misdemeanor with a fine of up to \$750.00. For additional information on the Kearny Town Code please contact town hall or the Kearny Magistrate Court.
