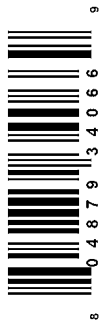

OBITUARY

Holy Ong Hing

Holy Ong Hing, 90, passed away June 3, 2020.

He was born in Superior, Arizona, in 1930, to Ong Chun and Helen Hing. Holy was one of 10 kids and was the fourth oldest child. He was an infant when his family moved to China, returning to America in 1937 when war began with Japan. His father was the first Chinese-American in Arizona to ever build a house for his wife and family.

While growing up in his historic house, Holy attended Superior High School and it was there that he learned to play tennis from his older siblings. He says he wasn't very

good at the beginning, but worked hard on his game and eventually made it on the University of Arizona's varsity tennis team from 1949 to 1954 – possibly one of the first Asian-Americans to play on the U of A varsity tennis team.

Holy (aka Holly) won against all the top tennis players coming in from Tucson High. Every year, he enjoyed playing and beating their rival, Arizona State University. After graduation he taught school at Picacho Elementary School for four years. In 1961, he took over Save Money Market, the family's grocery store in Coolidge, which his father bought in 1946. Holy was married in 1962 to Lola from Hong Kong and together raised four Arizona high school state tennis champions. Their kids won eight state singles tennis titles and helped Coolidge High win five state team championships. His son Paul is now a teaching pro in Southern California continuing his dad's lineage.

Besides tennis, Holy loved following a myriad of sports especially watching the Suns, the Diamondbacks, the Arizona Cardinals and his beloved Wildcat teams. He also enjoyed watching his grandkids play basketball, baseball, soccer, volleyball, tennis, and softball. During his time in California he stayed active by dancing, singing, and teaching mahjong at the senior center. Even though Holy lived in California the past 14 years, his heart was always in Arizona. He would visit at least three times a year and lunch at the Coolidge senior center, read at the Coolidge Library, hang out at The Legion and the VFW, sing karaoke at The Goose, and breakfast at Tag's. Holy touched many lives. We will miss his cheerful exuberant presence and we can

all be thankful he cherished every moment he was here. He loved attending church, interacting with the congregation, and was proud to serve as an elder at his church in Daly City, CA.

He is now with the angels and survived by his four children, Paul Hing (Kim Korljan), Tod Hing (Maria Yap), Glenn Hing (Cyndi Hing) and Lisa Hing (Alan Wang); and grandchildren, Brandon, Paris, Dylan, and Caitlyn Hing, and Nathan and Alana Wang; and his siblings, Ally Hing (Jane), Robert Hing (Alice), Mary Yee (Herbert), Grace Hing, Joyce Hing-McGowan (Gary) and Bill Hing (Lenora); sister-in-law, Ruthann Hing; and brother-in-law, Kim Chu (Cindy). He was preceded in death by his wife, Lola; parents, Ong Chun and Helen Hing; sister, Lilly Fong; sister, Minnie Fong; and brother, Johnny Hing.

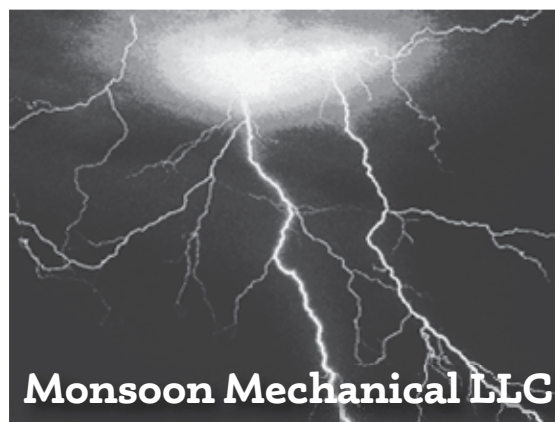

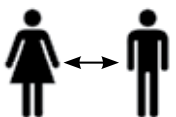
Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.

Plan for overnight ramp closures at US 60, State Route 177 interchange in Superior June 22-25; drivers should also expect paving work on US 60 tentatively starting June 29

The ramps at the interchange of US 60 and State Route 177 in Superior will close to traffic overnight the week of Monday, June 22, for paving.

Two ramps will be closed each night between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. In addition, SR 177 will be reduced to a single lane near US 60 with traffic controlled by flaggers.

Motorists should use an alternate route between US 60

and SR 177 during the closures.

Daytime paving work on US 60 between Superior and Top-of-the-World is tentatively scheduled to begin the week of June 29.

Pinal Democrats support striking miners

Pinal County Democrats were given a warm reception by the striking Asarco miners on Friday, June 5th, as they delivered food and checks to the recently reopened food pantry in Kearny. The visit was a demonstration of support for collective bargaining and for the United Steel Workers (USW) Local 915 critical food distribution operation.

More than 1,700 Asarco miners in Arizona and Texas have been on strike since October 2019. Manny Armenta, USW spokesman in Arizona, told KOLD News 13 last year, "We've been in negotiations for over a year now trying to make some sense about this and to try to get a fair agreement. This is a last resort, we don't like going on strike but when we get pushed against the wall we are going to take action and we did." Armenta said many workers had not received a pay increase in about 10 years, and according to various reports, the proposal would more than double the out-of-pocket

contribution individual workers would have to pay for healthcare.

There are signs the strike is having an effect on Asarco and its parent organization, GrupoMexico. Along with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, the strike has cut Asarco production by about half.

One of the Democratic volunteers was a retired mine worker who had briefly worked in Kearny decades before and had the opportunity to discuss more recent operations with some of the striking miners. Another of the volunteers who lives in Coolidge, discovered that she and one of the miners have a mutual friend who is also a relation to a third miner who was there. These Local 915 members are more than steelworkers or union members, they are family. The Pinal County Democrats are proud to stand with them as they fight for fairness.
