

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Pinal County Public School Districts - The Fabric of Our Community

For over a century, public school districts across Pinal County have been the fabric that holds our communities together. The excitement of game night, sounds of a band or choir performance, civic projects our students have participated in, fun of Homecoming, excitement of the Prom, joy of listening to the elementary Christmas concerts and the pride and excitement anytime one of our teams competes for a state championship are just a few of the many ways that our school districts help to bring our communities together. The pride shown by our alumni and strong positive bonds between our teachers and students allow our school districts to be the glue that binds our communities together and allows our children to have a positive childhood.

At the same time, as the largest employer in the community, our school districts are critical to the local economy. Eighty percent (80%) to eighty-five (85%) of our budgets go into salaries and benefits for our employees. Research shows that this money has a ripple effect on the local economy and is spent several times over in the community. Our employees, your friends and neighbors, buy homes, have spouses and children working in the community, and shop at our local restaurants, grocery stores and other retail stores. This investment and reinvestment of the school district budgets in our County





is critical for the success of our communities and for the local economy.

This year the Arizona Legislature has an unprecedented budget surplus, and the state is experiencing historic gains in revenue. With over \$4.6 billion in ongoing and one-time revenue our Legislature is in the position to continue to support and build a stronger economy for our local communities and our state. As the Superintendents of the public schools in Pinal County, we believe that the time is right for a historic investment in K-12 education. By providing a substantial investment in public education our Legislature can ensure the continuation of a strong local economy.

Superintendents from around the state are asking for support from the business community, our local governments and our parents for the K-12 Education and Workforce Development priorities. These priorities will provide \$860 million in permanent funding for K-12 education and \$200 million of one-time funding for capital improvements. This \$1 billion investment in K-12 education provides for money to go to the base support level for school districts. What is important about this is that it means that our administrations and Governing Boards can make the decisions on how to spend the increased funding. We believe that local control is critical in making decisions on how to spend additional funding. Local control is important because we know what is best for the students in our communities.

The educational priorities will also provide additional money for Career and Technical Education to support workforce development in Pinal County. Additional money will also be provided to help with the education of our most vulnerable students. This additional money will go to help students in special education or in areas of high poverty.

Finally, the priorities provide a process for which to

address fundamental issues within the K-12 funding formula to ensure that school districts can spend these additional funds. Addressing the Aggregate Expenditure Limit (AEL), exempting Proposition 301 from the AEL and eliminating Proposition 123 spending limits, will ensure that this historic investment in K-12 public education has the maximum positive impact on our students across the County.

Our children are our future. The role of our school districts in creating the fabric that holds our communities together requires a continued investment in our children's education. Strong, healthy school systems means a strong local economy, which supports a strong state economy. Please ask our Legislature to support the K-12 Education and Workforce Development Budget priorities in order to support the local community.
