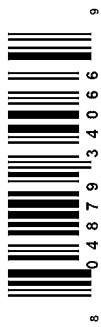

Superior Police Chief Alanis graduates FBI National Academy

Superior Chief of Police Francisco "Frank" Alanis has graduated from the prestigious FBI National Academy Session #286.

The FBI National Academy is a program of the FBI Academy for both active U.S. and international law enforcement personnel who seek to enhance their credentials in their field and to raise law enforcement standards, knowledge, and cooperation worldwide.

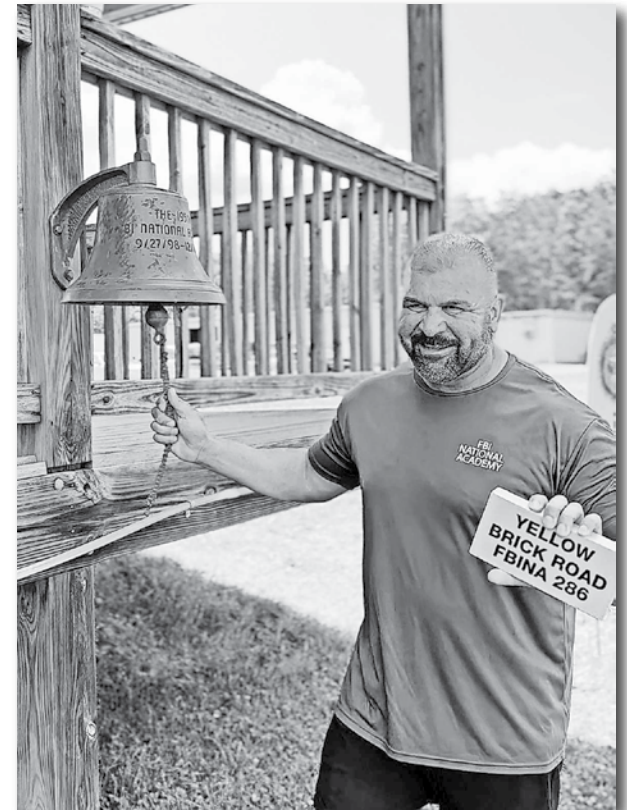
The FBI National Academy is a 10-week rigorous leadership course which challenges both mind and body. Students accumulate 17 hours of graduate and undergraduate course work through the University of Virginia during the 10-week course. Attendees are also pushed to their physical limits during the physical fitness portions of the academy, culminating with a 6.1-mile obstacle course known as the "Yellow Brick Road."

There are a several requirements to get into the FBI National Academy. Candidates must be in one of the following groups: leaders and managers of federal, military, state, sheriff, and municipal police agencies. Candidates must also go through a competitive nomination process. Participants are drawn from every state in the union, U.S. territories, and from over 160 international partner nations.

Chief Alanis was one of 243 attendees from across the United States and around the world who were selected to attend the 286th session. These attendees represent the top one percent of Law Enforcement Executives from across the globe.

The FBI National Academy is located at the FBI Academy on Marine Corps Base Quantico, Virginia. The FBI National Academy was started on July 29, 1935, in response to a 1930 study by the Wickersham Commission that recommended the standardization and professionalization of the law enforcement departments across the United States through centralized training. In 1935, China, Canada and Great Britain were among the first foreign nations to send candidates for attendance.

"Personally, it is surreal to be afforded this honor, for doing a job that already feels like a reward in itself, because of how much I enjoy It," Chief Alanis said. "I am

truly honored to represent the Town of Superior and the Superior Police Department."

This is a historic event for the Superior Police Department and Town of Superior. The Superior Police Department opened its doors in 1978. Chief Alanis is the first person from the department to attend the FBI National Academy.

Town thins fire fuels in Queen Creek

The Town of Superior has been working hard to improve the health of Queen Creek to restore water flow and improve the health of the native trees. This will make the creek safer for fire, reduce flooding, and improve the amount of water flowing on the surface. Invasive trees and scrub drink a lot of water, choke out native cottonwoods and other species, and burn too well. Fixing these issues should not only make the creek safer, but also more

attractive and usable.

Last week, the town began thinning fire fuels in Queen Creek to reduce fire hazards within the floodplain. This will include thinning of trees and brush to create a minimum of 8-foot spacing between trees. Treatments may include some removal of trees and shrubs in areas where they are too dense and will emphasize non-native species.

The work is paid for through a grant from the Arizona Division

of Forestry and Fire Management and will be completed by Siphon Draw Fire and Fuels. Depending on weather conditions, the work may be spread out over the next six months. A letter has been sent to all property owners along the creek notifying them of this work.

This section of fire fuels reduction is only part of a multi-year plan to improve fire safety for our community. The town has received three grants from DFFM to

achieve this objective totaling approximately \$375,000, three NCCC crew deployments valued at about \$420,000, and will have treated just over 50 acres by the end of this phase, including a 2 1/2 mile firebreak around the south and west of town, stretching from Highway 60 to State Route 177.

"We are just getting started, and adding new protected areas and maintaining those we have already created will be a never-ending project for the town," said Todd Pryor, Town Manager.

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-668

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA, SUPPORTING FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID. WHEREAS the Arizona Mayors Education Roundtable is a unique, nonpartisan, collaborative action group committed to achieving the statewide postsecondary attainment goal of 60 percent. According to the National College Attainment Network, one of the best indicators of postsecondary enrollment and persistence is completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); and WHEREAS submitting the FAFSA often the first step in the financial aid process - provides students with opportunities to access federal and possibly state and/or institutional resources to pay for college and career training programs; and WHEREAS Arizona ranks 49th in the nation for the percentage of high school seniors completing the FAFSA. As of April 21, 37.4% of the 2023 high school class has completed the FAFSA (National College Attainment Network FAFSA @ Tracker), fairness is the foundation of the American system and reflects traditional American values; and WHEREAS, More than a dozen states have either adopted or are considering universal FAFSA policies that expand access to financial aid and help make college more affordable for students. These policies tend to provide support and options for students; include waivers, opt-out, and no-harm provisions; and obligate local education agencies to oversee implementation; WHEREAS, Seven states - Louisiana (2017), Illinois (2020), Alabama (2021), New Hampshire (2021), Texas (2021), California (2022), and Kansas (2028) - have adopted FAFSA completion, or a suitable alternative, as a requirement for high school graduation. The year after the state mandated financial aid planning for high school graduation, Louisiana's FAFSA completion rate increased 26%. High school graduation and postsecondary enrollment rates have also increased, and the state currently ranks second in the nation, behind Tennessee, for FAFSA completions. NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT given the evidence and growing trend to require FAFSA completion for high school seniors, the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Superior, hereby resolves to:

1. Promote the Arizona Promise Program and FAFSA completion resources.
2. Support FAFSA completion events and workshops in their communities.
3. Call upon the Arizona State Board of Education to make FAFSA completion a high school graduation requirement while ensuring that students are supported through the financial aid process and no harm comes to students who formally opt out.
