

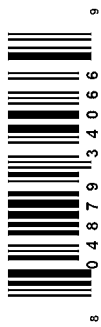

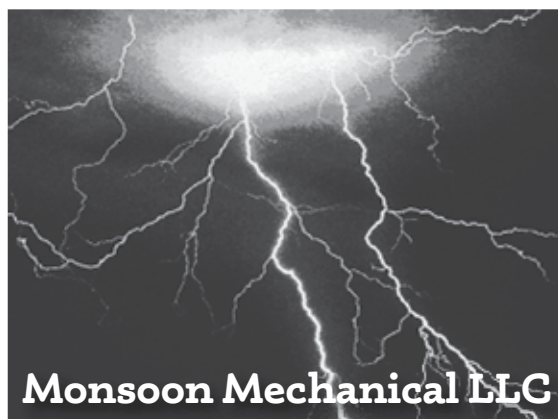

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR, ARIZONA DESIGNATING THE TOWN MANAGER AS AGENT FOR THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR TO OFFICIALLY SUBMIT THE FISCAL YEAR 2022 HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND GRANT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM WITH THE ARIZONA STATE PARKS BOARD AND TO SIGN THE DOCUMENTS AND AGREEMENTS NECESSARY TO RECEIVE HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND GRANT ASSISTANCE. WHEREAS, the Legislature under A.R.S. §41-503 has authorized the establishment of the Historic Preservation Heritage Fund Program providing funds to the State of Arizona and other eligible applicants for the purpose of preserving historic and prehistoric resources; and WHEREAS, the Arizona State Parks Board (BOARD) is responsible for the administration of the program within the State, setting up necessary rules and procedures governing application under the program; and WHEREAS, said adopted procedures established by the BOARD require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications, signature authorization, the availability of local matching funds, and authorization to sign a Participant Agreement with the BOARD; and WHEREAS, the proposed project must be consistent with the Arizona Historic Preservation Plan; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF SUPERIOR ARIZONA hereby: Approves the filing of an application for an FY 2022 Historic Preservation Heritage Fund grant assistance; and Certifies that the Town of Superior will comply with all appropriate state and federal regulations, policies, guidelines, and requirements as they relate to the application; and Agrees to comply with all appropriate procedures, guidelines, and requirements established by the BOARD as a part of the application process; and Certifies that the Town of Superior has matching funds in the amount of \$0.00 from the following source(s): N/A.; and Appoints the Superior Town Manager Todd Pryor as agent of the Town of Superior to conduct all negotiations, execute, and submit all documents including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, billing statements, etc. which are necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.
