





Kearny adopts budget and appoints new positions

The Kearny Town Council approved a resolution to adopt the 2014-15 fiscal year budget. The budget is set for \$5,071,087. The budget has been printed and published in the June 4 and June 11 editions of the Copper Basin as per state law. The council will have their final approval of the budget in July.

During the council meeting the council appointed David Herrera to the council to fill the position of Brad Richards. They also approved the appointment of David Orzell as the town magistrate and appointed Bob Jordan as the voluntary code enforcer. Orzell has been the town magistrate since 2008. Dave Collier and Dave Alexander were also appointed as deputy magistrates.

Jordan will serve as a voluntary code enforcer with the town. His voluntary position will be covered under

services agreement with Arizona Public Service. APS is requiring all of their municipal customers to renew their agreements. These new agreements are now the same across their coverage area and while the costs are slightly higher than previous agreements the costs are shared equally across the state.

County's tentative budget: balanced

FLORENCE - The Pinal County Board of Supervisors adopted the 2014/2015 fiscal year tentative budget in the amount of \$378,079,096.

The tentative budget, presented by County Manager Greg Stanley, does not raise taxes for the upcoming

year. Stanley explained that the general fund was decreased by \$9.6 million, while the overall budget increased by just over \$4 million due to monies set aside in the case any debt is issued for capital infrastructure.

Pinal County keeps on lowering its overall portion of each tax dollar it takes in. Based on the 2013/2014 fiscal year for each dollar of property tax paid, the county receives only 24 cents. This is quite a change since 2010/2011 where 31 cents was received into county coffers. The rest of the tax dollar portion goes to school districts, Central Arizona College, cities and towns along with other entities.

Some of the challenges faced by the Supervisors in

Hayden appoints new mayor

Last week during a special Hayden Town Council meeting, the council voted to appoint Councilmember Tommy Lagunas as the mayor of Hayden. Maria Munoz will remain as vice mayor. Munoz declined the position of mayor and suggested another member be appointed. This vote came following the resignation by former Mayor Charles Vega. Vega had to resign after pleading guilty to a felony.

During the regular town council

meeting the council handled several housekeeping items including the transfer of unencumbered 2012-13 budget appropriations from the general contingency. The council approved the library agreement with Gila County, and approved the use of lights for a volleyball fundraiser. The council

also approved an intergovernmental agreement with the Town of Winkelman for police protection. The cost of services for the Town of Winkelman will be increased based on the actual cost to employ an officer.

The council also approved opening the swimming pool after the fireworks.

of the new Leonor Hambly K-8 School. I look forward to making it place where all students can learn and reach their dreams. Having graduated from the Hayden-Winkelman School District makes me even more committed to ensure every student the best education possible," stated Pam Gonzalez.

The K-8 alignment is not a new concept, in fact, many bigger school districts have chosen the K-8 school alignment to improve classroom instruction and streamline curriculum and instructional practices. Perhaps one of the most positive

elements of K-8 alignment is student discipline. Keeping the middle school students in a traditional elementary classroom setting limits potential negative exposure to social issues facing high school students today throughout America.

Gregorich also said: "There will be no combination elementary school classrooms this school year. Combination classes are when multi-grade level students share the same teacher and the same classroom. This is sometimes done to improve instruction as well as save dwindling school funding dollars. Fortunately this year, the district enrollment remained steady, which allows the district to avoid the need for combination grade level classrooms."

"The moving of the middle school students will save enough money to make needed improvements throughout the district. Our district is fortunate to have a staff and community that values education and wants our school district to continue to provide a quality education for all of our students, as it has for the past 78 years," stated Gregorich.

County approves medical marijuana dispensary

At the regular session meeting of the Pinal County Board of Supervisors held on June 18, a decision was made on the application for a special use permit that would be used for a medical marijuana dispensary in Oracle. After listening for over an hour to a number of speakers from the public both for and against the dispensary, the supervisors voted 3 to 2 in favor of approving the dispensary location in the building located at 1880 W. American Ave. Voting against the measure were Supervisors Pete Rios and Cheryl Chase. The supervisors in favor of the measure were Steve Miller, Anthony Smith, and Todd House.

Around 20 residents of Oracle attended the meeting with some of them speaking out against the approval of the special permit. Pinal County Sheriff's Department Chief Deputy Steve Henry spoke about the concerns of the sheriff's department which included that it is still a violation of federal law, impaired driving while under the influence of medical marijuana, and the possibility that it will open the door to other crimes. Jim Knupp, public information officer for the Pinal County Attorney's Office also spoke out against the dispensary.

The Executive Director of Bloom Dispensaries, Lezli Engelking gave a power point presentation explaining her company's management policies in exceeding all regulatory standards mandated by the medical marijuana law and how Bloom believes in giving back to the community. She said that there have not been any problems in any of the state dispensaries. The dispensary in Oracle will be called Bloom Oracle. Others that spoke in support of the dispensary were Jesse Lopez, vice-president of AZ4NORML who answered questions pertaining to medical marijuana laws. NORML is the National Organization for the Reform of Marijuana Laws. A professional lobbyist also spoke in favor of medical marijuana and the dispensary. Someone pointed out that the medical marijuana law is a voter approved law and that

the residents of Oracle voted 55 percent to 45 percent in favor of medical marijuana. To view a video of the hearing go to the Pinal County Government site pinalcountyaz.gov. Rita Pena, owner of the building where Bloom Oracle will be housed was contacted a few days after the hearing. She said that she is glad that the building is now rented

She said that she is glad that the building is now rented and that it was difficult for her to attend the meetings because she felt people looked at her in a negative way. "I am more for having our community grow in a healthy way," she said. "I hope that true patients will have medical marijuana more accessible to them and that the revenue will help the community."



Pertussis confirmed in Gila County

Gila County has reported a confirmed a case of pertussis, also known as whooping cough, in the Payson area.

Pertussis is a contagious disease spread from person to person by coughing or sneezing while in close contact with others. It is most contagious during the cold-like stage to three weeks after it begins. Pertussis is treated with antibiotics and people may return to normal activities after five days of treatment and are fever-free.

Pertussis is called whooping cough, because, in older infants and preschool children, coughing is often followed by a whooping sound. Other symptoms to look for are mild cold-like signs and symptoms, accompanied by little

or no fever; coughing that worsens within one to two weeks and becomes intermittent, and may be followed by vomiting; and, increased production of mucus.

The Gila County Office of Health is advising its residents to stay vigilant. For maximum protection against pertussis, children need five Diphtheria Tetanus and acellular Pertussis or DTaP shots. The first three shots are given to infants at 2,4 and 6 months of age, which protects most infants but the effects of which tend to fade as they become toddler. Preteens will also need a TDaP, which is a pertussis booster. It is also recommended that pregnant women should receive it

during the third trimester.

If a person has been exposed to pertussis by a household member, or other close contact, they may be given a preventative course of antibiotics to prevent them from getting sick.

If you suspect that you may have pertussis, have been exposed, or, have any questions, please contact your primary care physician.

EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial constituents are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.

Constituents that may be present in source water include: (A) Microbials, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife. (B) Inorganics, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming. (C) Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential uses. (D) Organics, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff, and septic systems. (E) Radionuclides, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain constituents in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for constituents in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

developing a balanced budget is that new construction added to the assessed valuation is still slowly bouncing back. General Fund non-property tax revenues are growing modestly and issues with Immigration and Customs Enforcement along with potential fund sweeps are still undecided at this time.

Despite the challenges, the Supervisors have kept county priorities funded. Improvements to Hunt Highway are continuing with Phase I nearing completion in August. Phase II will begin at the end of the year. Pinal Airpark and San Manuel Airport are also continuing to grow as economic development assets of the county. Projects at both airports are included in this budget. Road safety and dust control projects are also figured into the tentative budget.

Looking at the general fund, 64 percent of it goes to Public Safety (Sheriff, County Attorney, Superior Court, Probation and Justice Courts). General Government operations takes up 23 percent, while Health Care and other expenses takes up the rest.

Once the Tentative Budget is adopted, it can be decreased or parts of the budget can be reallocated. However, the total budget cannot be increased. The Final Budget is to be heard and adopted on July 2, 2014.
