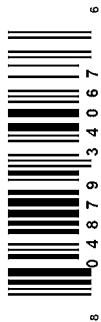

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Robust Land Management Needed to Prevent Wildfires

Arizona has a history of devastating wildfires. The Wallow and Horseshoe 2 fires torched over a combined half million acres in this state less than ten short years ago. The Woodbury fire — which has burned almost 100,000 acres to date — has threatened homes and ranches in my district and near my home in Globe. The inaccessible terrain, combined with inadequate land management practices, illustrates the importance of managing our desert lands and ensuring we're utilizing the right policies to prevent these catastrophic wildfires from occurring.

The desert ecosystem is complex. Perennial and annual

grass seeds lay dormant for years waiting on the volume of moisture like we received this winter and spring. They're ready to multiply and again produce their own seeds; the half shrubs and brush with deeper root systems have different protections in times of drought, dropping their leaves to protect the plants. If not used for managed grazing, the Arizona brush and grasses build up and become the fuel source for these catastrophic wildfires.

Using the recent Woodbury fire as an example, we can show that particular wilderness area has very few active grazing permits, and the fuel buildup needed just a small spark to result in such a sustained blaze. Essentially, it was only a matter of time because of the lack of management and fuel reductions. Land must be managed, or Mother Nature will choose to manage it herself.

Over the past 20 years, some groups have fought to lock up vast areas of land and prevent management activities such as logging, grazing, mining, and overall motorized access. However, these efforts have led to increased fuel

buildup and run counter to the intended goals of protection and conservation in these areas. Land management practices that enable fuel reduction are critically important to ensuring the health of our forest and wilderness areas, and preventing against the kinds of fires that have devastated our state in the past. When we manage our land in a responsible way, our rural communities and our state benefit. That means that we have the ability to make people's lives better, instead of investing staggering sums of money and risking the safety of our first responders to put out preventable fires on our own land.

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Fireworks and Celebrations

So just where were fireworks invented? It is said that they originated in 7th century China and were used for celebrations. Now that the warmer weather of summer is here, we will enjoy BBQs, parades, fun in the pool or at lakes and beaches. We will also enjoy fireworks displays especially on the 4th of July when our country celebrates its birthday. Beautiful and mesmerizing as a fireworks display can be, fireworks displays should be left to the professionals and not set off by people not trained in their proper use.

Each year there are many injuries and fires caused by the improper use of fireworks. According to the USCPSC (U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission) in 2017 at least eight people died and approximately 12,900 people sought medical treatment after a fireworks-related injury. Most of these injuries were due to amateurs trying to use professional-grade, homemade or other illegal fireworks.

While fireworks can be and are used throughout the year, the 4th of July is the one day each year when injuries and fires caused by fireworks are reported the most. The NFPA (National Fire Protection Association) estimates that fireworks cause and average of 1,300 structure fires, 300 vehicle fires and nearly 17,000 other fires. The NSC (National Safety Council) advises people to stay away from all consumer fireworks and if they want to see a fireworks display put on by professionals.

The following are some fireworks that are legal for consumers to buy in some states. But just because they are legal doesn't make them safe!! Check out the following list of fireworks that may be legal to purchase in your area. To be safe and obey the law, check with authorities first BEFORE making a purchase:

SPARKLERS – While often seen along parade routes,

at festivals and other events, parents don't realize that sparklers can burn at approximately 2,000 degrees! At this temperature some metals can melt and a spark from a sparkler can quickly ignite clothing.

BOTTLE ROCKETS – Are small rockets that have a stick/tail, are lit by a fuse and fired from a bottle or can. Many people, especially teens have bottle rocket "wars", firing them at each other causing head, chest and eye injuries.

ROMAN CANDLES – Shoot exploding shells from a tube but can cause severe burns to the hands of the person holding the firework which can result in loss of fingers

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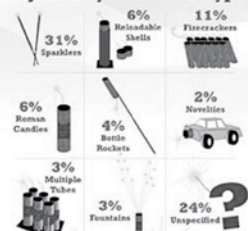
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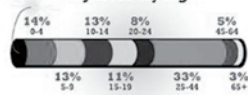
Fireworks Injuries

Fireworks Safety Tips

- Never try to **re-light** or **pick up** fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- Keep a **bucket of water** or a **garden hose** handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- Make sure fireworks are **legal** in your area before buying or using them.
- Light fireworks **one at a time**, then **move back** quickly.

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Sea Lions Swim Team

The Sea Lions attended a meet at the Miami Pool against the Globe Piranhas on Saturday. The Sea Lions won the meet 878-591.

The Miami Pool was built in a different era when the standard pool length was 40 yards, so the Sea Lions got the opportunity to compete in a 40 yard pool (instead of the standard 25 yard pool). This meant that the races were longer, making the meet a good test of conditioning for both teams. In most races, the additional distance was enough to affect the order of finish. It was common to see swimmers with the most endurance finish strong and pass other swimmers late in the race. In most cases, the Sea Lions were on the winning end. The Sea Lions won 62 of the 88 races at the meet.

Competing in a longer race is a good test of stamina and perseverance for most swimmers. However, for the swimmers who have just learned to swim, the additional 15 yards in pool length can be a real test. The 8 and under Sea Lions showed their toughness by completing their races and earning ribbons and valuable points for the team.

Johnny Smallhouse (12) and Mia Dale (14) both swam the maximum number events and won all of them.

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Local man retraces his father's D-Day journey

Tom Nunn of Oracle recently returned from a trip of a lifetime.

Tom, thanks to Road Scholar, an educational travel organization, was able to visit France and traced the route

of his father, James, who as a paratrooper in 1944 jumped behind enemy lines during the D-Day invasion.

Captain James Nunn was the Company Commanding Officer of the 507th Paratrooper Infantry Regiment of the 82nd Airborne. On June 6, 1944 at approximately 3 a.m., he jumped from a plane with his men, landing some seven or eight miles from Utah Beach. In the darkness, James

landed hip deep in water on a rock, severely injuring his ankle. He was taken to a nearby farmhouse where wounded soldiers were being treated for injuries by locals. James, because of his injuries was ordered to a hospital in London. He was unable to continue the mission with his regiment and lead them into battle. This was something that would bother James the rest of his life as he looked at it as a failure even though he would return to combat and be seriously wounded.

James was supposed to be in the hospital for three weeks but after three days he left the hospital and was able to catch a plane to Utah Beach. From there he hiked inland and caught up with his unit. He was in the Normandy Campaign for three weeks when he was shot through the mouth by a German sniper. The bullet took out some teeth and part of his jaw requiring a number of surgeries and ending James's time in the war. It nearly ended his military career.

James had joined the Army right out of high school in Abernathy, Texas and was 31 years old when he jumped in France. He later was discharged from the Army because of his wounds but was able to enlist in the Air Force following the war.

This is how the Nunn family ended up in Arizona as James was stationed at Davis Monthan and Williams Air Force bases. He was able to retire from the Air Force.

Following his death, James was buried with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery.

Tom said that his father never talked about his war experiences. Twenty-five years ago, Tom and his sister tried to talk their father into attending the 50th Anniversary of the D-Day landing, but "he didn't feel comfortable going and celebrating because he was not

there going with his men to accomplish the deeds his company had achieved." Tom attributes some of this and his dad's distant behavior towards his children to post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). Little was known about PTSD back then and these veterans did not seek treatment.

Tom became interested in where his father had been during the war and started researching where his dad's company had been during the Normandy Campaign.

"I wanted to go back to the areas in France to see if I could find places my dad had been," he said.

He was told about the Road Scholar program by his sisters and his wife. This past April he and his wife joined up with Road Scholar and traveled to France.

"I had a great time with that organization!" Tom said. "They take care of everything, transportation, lodging, meals, fees, and tips. Nothing you need to do except go along and participate."

They visited all the beaches involved in the invasion, Paris

and other interesting sites.

When Road Scholar heard about Nunn's story and the reason, he wanted to make the trip, they arranged for a private trip following the regular tour. They provided a guide and interpreter to retrace Tom's father's movements in 1944. Using the information provided by Tom's research, Army records and from his father's descriptions, they were able to find where his father landed when he parachuted into France. From there they found a railroad track and railroad station where James was placed on a rail car and moved to a farm house for medical treatment.

They found a farm house and the guide went to the house and inquired about its history. An old woman was living there. She got her 84-year-old husband who had lived in the area during the war. When he heard Tom's story about his father, he opened up and became very talkative. He took them to a farmhouse he said was used to treat not

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Nature Conservancy volunteers wet, dry mapping the San Pedro River

Each year for the past 21 years, more than 100 volunteers have worked mapping the 300 miles of the San Pedro River and its key tributaries. They map the river to record where there is water and where there is not.

This is a group effort involving The Nature Conservancy and its partners including: Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Arizona Game & Fish, Community Watershed Alliance of Benson, Cascabel Volunteers, and Mexican partners and landowners and volunteers.

For these volunteers it is a labor of love, braving the 100 plus degree temperatures to help protect the threatened river and the environment it provides for migratory birds and diverse wildlife.

On Saturday, June 15, volunteers wet/dry mapped the lower San Pedro River from the 7B Ranch area to where the San Pedro River meets the Gila River including tributaries such as Aravaipa Creek. These "citizen scientists" use GPS technology and cameras to record the

so badly wounded paratroopers. The old man's son lived in the farmhouse which had not changed in 75 years. The son invited them in to the house where they talked for a couple of hours.

The son brought out a box of relics he had found on the farm property. He told Tom

to take what he wanted from the box. Tom was reluctant but the Frenchman insisted he take something. Tom took a penicillin vial with an expiration date of 1944 on it, a metal fork, a cartridge and a piece of a silk parachute.

"It was far beyond what I thought

possible," Tom said.

Later, they were able to find the field within 100 yards of where his father was wounded.

"All in all, this was an experience of my hopes and dreams of accomplishing," he said.

Tom said he hopes to put his experiences of the trip into a journal to pass down to his kids.

"Thanks to Road Scholars for their help and guidance and the opportunity to fulfill a dream," Tom said, adding, "It was a fantastic experience!"
