OBITUARY

Carlos Ruiz Martinez

Carlos Ruiz Martinez, 91, passed away on June 21, 2018 in his home in Superior surrounded by his children. He was born in Dos Cabezas, Arizona on June 15, 1927 and moved to Superior in 1936 at the age of 9.

He was a graduate of the class of 1949 of Superior High School. Carlos started working at the Sawaia's White Spot Market at the age of 14 as a grocery bagger and delivery person. He retired from the Market as a butcher after 27 years. Carlos worked as a timekeeper for Magma Copper Company for 10 years and Pinal County for 5 years before retiring again in 1989.

Carlos was in the United States Army during World War II stationed in Oster, Japan. He was honorably discharged and returned to Superior in 1947 and married his high school sweetheart Gloria Mariscal in the original St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Superior on June 5, 1949. They celebrated 68 years of matrimony in 2017 before she passed away in December.

Carlos is preceded in death by his lifelong love, Gloria, his parents Liberato and Delphina Martinez, brother Liberato, sister Petra Chavez, and grandson Bobby Martinez.

Carlos is survived by his six children, George (Olga), Gloria (Al), John, Virginia "Gina", Carlos (Patricia), and Tony (Christine); 12 grandchildren, Louie, George, Keone, Jesirae, Xavier, Michael, Matthew, Carlos, Felicia, Tony, Jacob, and Makayla; 17 great grandchildren with one arriving in November and 6 great-greatgrandchildren with one arriving in September. He is also survived by many special nieces, nephews, and cousins.

Carlos was elected to the Superior School Board in 1956 and served the Superior Community until 1976. He also served as a volunteer for the Superior Fire District for 25 years, from 1948 through 1973. Carlos was a member of the VFW, a lifelong member of the United Superiorities Foundation, and attended the bi-annual Safari's regularly. Carlos volunteered, with his wife at the Superior Chamber of Commerce welcoming visitors to the town because they



were enthused about anything to do with the Town of Superior. Carlos' greatest legacy is his family who he was devoted to his entire life.

Rural by Choice hosts Arizona Film Commission

The Superior Town Hall was the site of an informational presentation and meeting with Studio 48 - Arizona Film Commission. The presentation was hosted by Rural by Choice and Copper Corridor Economic Development Committee. Sponsors and supporters were Arizona Public Service (APS), Gila County **Economic Development** Corporation and the Town of Superior. Mayor of Superior, Mila Besich-Lira handled the welcome and introductions.

Director of Studio 48 -Arizona Film Commission, Matthew Earl Jones was the key speaker. He is a former line producer from Los Angeles and familiar with Hollywood and the film industry. Director Jones gave an overview of the benefits of filming in Arizona. Some of these included: over 300 days of sunshine, lower production costs, variety of outdoor scenic vistas, free use of state roads and state parks, streamlined permitting processes, experienced crews and talent, pre-negotiated discounts for hotels, rental vehicles, restaurants, and more.

He talked about Arizona trying to position itself as

the Home of Independent Production which is the fastest growing segment of the industry. One of the goals is to get rural communities involved in selling their areas as possible film sites. They have a Film Resource **Coordinator Program** and are recruiting coordinators. The Film Resource Coordinator

is a volunteer position. Their job is to work with local businesses in the community to offer discounts to film production companies and identify potential film locations and resources. These coordinators should be someone with an outstanding knowledge of their area and community. Upon gathering photos/

videos of location sites, local talent, businesses willing to give discounts, the information will be entered into a national and global data base on the Arizona Film Commission website which will connect with film production companies around the world.

The Tri-Community and Copper Corridor area

have a history of working with the film industry. If local communities work together with the Studio - 48 Arizona Film Commission they may be able to attract the growing film, new media, advanced technology industry to the area, which can add to the economy. Film production companies tend to spend money locally in restaurants, hotels, hardware stores, gas stations, etc.



Resolution Copper hosts community update on reclamation

Resolution Copper hosted a community update last week on the reclamation of the west plant area and the historical preservation research being done by the company.

Officials from the company announced that many of the buildings will start to be torn down in the coming weeks along with the capping of contaminated land around the smelter. They also announced that the smoke stack/smelter will be coming down in October or November. Originally, they announced the structure would be torn down in September. The reclamation is required under a voluntary consent decree ordered by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality, which requires Resolution Copper to remediate environmental damages by previous and historic mining operations. The project must be complete by 2020 as per the orders of the decree.

Resolution Copper has hired Westland Resources to conduct Architectural and Industrial Archeology for the Smelter and mine property. Officials from Westland Resources shared some of their historic findings. One interesting fact they shared is that Col. Boyce Thompson was in Russia attending to a Red Cross mission when he met with another mine investor, it was in Russia in 1917 that they decided to build the smelter. Their historical findings included help wanted ads to build the smelter and buildings. Westland Resources is also conducting oral-video histories of people who worked at the mine, especially those who worked in the smelter and mill areas.

Westland Resources explained that they are following all State Historic Preservation Office requirements to ensure that the necessary documentation is recorded in perpetuity. They are exceeding the state and national standards by conducting in-depth imaging, modeling along with the video interviews of former employees.

The Town of Superior and Resolution Copper have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding that allows both parties to conduct research and outreach on how best to formally memorialize the mining history and culture of Superior while also interpreting the mining technologies of the present. The Company and Town are required to present three ideas by December and then those three concepts will go through a project feasibility and sustainability process to determine which project(s) will be best suited for Superior. Ideas are being taken by the Town of Superior at Town Hall and Rebuild Superior Inc.


