Ellie Brown announces bid for Copper Corridor Justice of the Peace

Ellie Brown is announcing that she will be on the Aug. 2, 2022, Primary Ballot as a candidate for Justice of the Peace, Copper Corridor, Precinct 5. Precinct 5 serves the communities of Eagle Crest Ranch, SaddleBrooke, SaddleBrooke Ranch, Oracle Junction, Oracle, San Manuel, Mammoth, Dudleyville, Kearny, Superior, Riverside, Top of the World and Superior. She seeks your support and vote.

With 31 years of experience serving Pinal County and the Copper Corridor communities in various capacities, Brown pledges to provide the residents of the Copper Corridor a justice of the peace that puts the needs of the people first, with fairness, accountability and efficiency. She adds a commitment to give everyone an opportunity to be heard in court before an ethical, impartial,

independent and calm-demeanor judge.

“Good judges understand that their demeanor in the courtroom helps lay the foundation in allowing participants in the legal process to feel that their position is being heard; defendants, legal counsel, law enforcement and victims,” she said.

Employed for 26 years full time with Pinal County as a Justice of the Peace, Justice Court Supervisor, Judicial Liaison, Justice Court Computer Field Trainer, Administrative Manager and Director, Ellie is prepared, experienced and qualified in running both court locations of the Copper Corridor (Oracle and Superior) both judicially and administratively.

“Running a court is not just putting on the black robe and ruling on cases. It is the duty of the court to be fiscally responsible, that administrative staff is properly trained and educated, respectful and helpful to the public. It is my responsibility to have the justice scales balanced and to listen to both sides before rendering a judgement. It is my judicial duty to adhere to the Criminal and Civil Rules of Procedure, Arizona Revised Statutes, Reports and to hold my moral compass according to the Arizona Judicial and Ethic Canons,” she explained.

Ellie has been serving the Copper Corridor as a Judicial Pro Tempore for the past five years. She has served several of the Justice of the Peace locations throughout Pinal County. Her appointment(s) was through both the Superior Court Presiding Judge and the Pinal County Board of Supervisors. Ellie was just recently hired part-time as the Presiding Magistrate Judge for the Town of Superior. Her duties begin in July 2022.

The county’s Justice Courts mostly handle criminal misdemeanors, traffic violations, civil filings, protective orders, eviction actions, search warrants and small-claims cases. Court proceedings mostly pertain to warrants, pretrials, trials, in custody/jail and other proceedings due

to motions filed before the court.

Ellie’s community service includes being on several Board of Directors serving as Chair, Secretary or member – this includes Oracle Community Center, Sun Life Health, Oracle Fire District, OWN Oracle network and St. Helen Catholic Parish. This doesn’t include her 40 years + of volunteer service and dedication to the community.

Ellie is married to Steve Brown and they have a blended family of three grown children, three granddaughters and pets. She holds a master’s degree in educational leadership, a bachelor of science degree in administration and management, a Certification of Public Management, completion of the Arizona Supreme Court Orientation and countless hours of court operating judicial educational training. Ellie was born and raised within the Copper Corridor, Precinct 5.

“As a Justice of the Peace, I make decisions that impact everyday life and it is important that people know that I have the diverse life and work skills, empathy, years of experience in the judicial process and higher education that qualifies me to represent and be their elected Justice of the Peace. My reputation as a judge precedes me in being fair, honest, patient, understanding and a good listener. I issue timely and impartial judgments based on the evidence/testimony presented to me,” she said.

Brown, a Republican, is seeking election to preside over the Copper Corridor Precinct 5, of which she played a role in forming nearly eight years ago. She will need to defeat one other Republican primary challenger before moving forward to the general election ballot in November. 

Deadline looms for school board elections; petitions must be filed by July 11

Are you concerned with our local schools having effective leadership and quality educational programs? If so, it is a great time to consider stepping up and running for election for the available positions on local school boards.

All governing board positions listed below have a term expiration of Dec. 31, 2022. The seats will be on the November 2022 ballots. Open seats include:

- Oracle – two seats with a four-year term each, which are currently held by Gary Terrell and Jeri Taylor; 73 signatures are required.
- Ray – three seats, which are currently held by Jason Wernett (two-year term), Jonathan Ramirez (four-year term) and Tino Flores (four-year term); 11 signatures are required.
- Mammoth-San Manuel – three seats, two with four-year terms, currently held by Terry Newman and Louis Madrid, and one with a two-year term, currently held by Michael Carnes; 15 signatures are required.
- Superior – four seats, one with a two-year term and is currently held by Henry Gutierrez; two with four-year terms that are currently held by Ricardo Provenco and

Ignacio Magallanes; and one with a four-year term that is currently vacant; 11 signatures are required.

- CVIT – one seat (Superior School District) with a four-year term currently filled by Louie Rabago; 11 signatures are required.

The first form to file is the Candidate Statement of Interest. It can be downloaded here: <https://bit.ly/3JKLK8K>. This one does not need to be notarized and can be submitted in person, by mail or email to the Pinal County School Office (nobrien@pinalco.org).

Several locals have filed their intents to run already: Jeri Taylor for Oracle and Louis Madrid for Mammoth-San Manuel were the first to file. Also intending to run are: Donna Pedota (Oracle), Wendy Biallas-Odell (Oracle), Gary Terrell (Oracle), Michael Carnes (Mammoth-San Manuel), Augustine-Lou Hing (Superior), Ericka Vasquez (Superior), Hector Aparacio (Superior), Henry Gutierrez (Superior) and Tino Flores (Ray). Louie Rabago is the only candidate to have filed his statement of interest for CVIT.

Once the Candidate Statement of Interest form has been received by the County School Office and date stamped,

the candidate can begin gathering signatures on the Candidate Nomination Form-Nonpartisan and Petitions. Any gathered prior to the date stamp will be nullified. Submit to Pinal County School Office, 75 North Bailey St., Florence, 85132. The filing period for submission of this form and petitions is from 8 a.m. Monday June 10, 2022, until 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, July 11, 2022. Candidates may not circulate petitions before submitting a Candidate Statement of Interest form first.

A few have submitted their signed petitions including Louie Rabago (CVIT), Michael Carnes (M-SM), Jeri Taylor (Oracle), Donna Pedota (Oracle), Wendy Biallas-Odell (Oracle), Gary Terrell (Oracle) and Henry Gutierrez (Superior).

CASA Volunteer needed for Susie and her siblings

A CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate) volunteer is needed for 8-year-old Susie and her siblings. The Department of Child Safety removed this child and her siblings from the care of their mother due to a long history of substance abuse and neglect, where Susie was exposed to mother's substance use, and her sibling was hospitalized due to severe withdraw symptoms after birth. Susie's mother has refused to participate in reunification services. Susie's father has neglected his children and failed to protect them. He has moved to another state and does not have contact with the children. The father has refused to participate in the child's case or reunification services. Susie is the oldest of three children that have been separated from each other due to the inability to find family that have the capacity for all three young children.

Among the CASA volunteer's responsibilities: Visiting Susie and her siblings at least once a month to monitor their progress and needs in their current placement, connecting with her care team to be aware of her physical and mental health concerns and providing recommendations to the judge on what you find to be the best permanency option.

Are you willing to give approximately 15 hours per month to advocate for an abused or neglected child in our community? No experience is necessary, and comprehensive training is provided at no cost to the volunteer advocate. Once certification and training are complete, CASA volunteers spend time learning about the child and their needs, gather information about the child's

Ninth Circuit Court rules in favor of the Resolution Copper Land Exchange

On Friday, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco ruled that Resolution Copper Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Compensation Act must be upheld.

The Apache Stronghold group appealed a lower

court's decision, saying that if the mine is allowed to open and the land is exchanged it will prohibit their right to worship and limit their freedom of religion. It is reported that the Apache Stronghold group will appeal the Ninth Circuit Courts decision to

the Supreme Court. They have 45 days to file a case.

The 2-1 ruling was based on whether the United States Government can do what it wants with its land. The court ruling explained that the mine would not prohibit tribal members from worshipping.

The Save Oak Flats bill proposed by Rep. Raul Grijalva has not made much progress through this Congress. The Save Oak Flats bill would repeal the

land exchange legislation and would prohibit mining in the area. The land exchange bill was passed in December 2014 under the National Defense Authorization Act.
