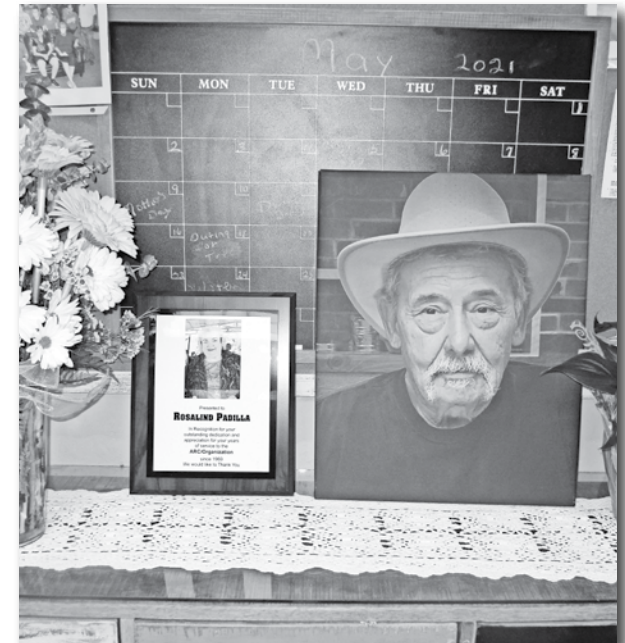

Wildfire destroys buildings in Riverside

Last Wednesday, a wildfire in the Riverside area grew to approximately 20 acres before firefighters were able to get it under control. The Simmons Fire destroyed multiple structures and other personal property before being extinguished.

Joanna Almaraz's home was destroyed along with an

unoccupied house, several sheds, a shop building, an RV and other vehicles. Joann told the Copper Basin News that she had just changed shifts at work or she might have been asleep in her house.

There were no injuries or deaths.

According to Tiffany Davila of the State Forestry

Department, the fire was sparked by someone grinding and then spread to multiple structures.

Sports were different and two entire seasons were cancelled. Athletes had to learn how to participate wearing restrictive masks. Club gatherings were held via Zoom.

With all the obstacles, students persevered and thrived. Three students in particular have risen to the top. Sarrah Perez is this year's Valedictorian, while Lyana Romero and Manuel Guillen share the number two spot as Salutatorians.

Sarrah Janise Perez is the daughter of Julian and Maribel Perez. She has two sisters, Marlis and Aliyana. Sarrah played volleyball, basketball and softball throughout her high school career and was the president of the National Honor Society and Student Council. She was also a member of the Athletic Club and Junior Chamber.

Sarrah plans to attend the University of Arizona and major in business administration. She plans to continue as a graduate student and earn her master's degree in public health. She would like to be a healthcare administrator.

Lyana Romero is the daughter of Abe and Barbie Romero. She has two siblings, Alyssa and Chacho. Lyana played softball and was on the cheer squad. She also was involved in National Honor Society and Student Council.

Lyana will be heading to Flagstaff and Northern Arizona University where she will earn her degree in dental hygiene.

Manuel "Manny" Eduardo Guillen is the son of Nina Ruiz and the grandson of Betty Ruiz. He has two sisters, Jasmine and Anita Guillen. Except for this year, the "pandemic year," Manny has played basketball, baseball and football. He is a member of the National Honor Society (and has been since his freshman year), and participated in Student Council and was the sophomore class president.

Manny plans to attend the University of Arizona and pursue a degree in electrical engineering.

This class, much like last year's class, has seen so many things go sideways due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The change it has wrought has been dramatic.

"I believe every single one of my classmates and I have the ability to positively make a change in our world," Sarrah said, "big or small."

Manny concurs.

"I see it as this generation is learning to be mentally strong by going through difficult times and overcoming them," he said. "I believe we will make an impact by being prepared for whatever the world may bring us."

Lyana has her wishes for her classmates: "I want them all to be successful in their own way, and to make a difference and always expect change."

High school has had its ups and downs for all students. There are things most graduates are ready to bid farewell to and some things that will be missed.

Lyana will miss seeing her teachers and classmates every day. She will not miss rushing out the door, trying to be on time.

Manny will miss the sports, the underclassmen and "being in school instead of adult responsibilities." He really won't miss having to ask somebody to use the bathroom.

"I am going to miss seeing my teachers and classmates every day and especially miss playing sports," Sarrah said. "My teachers and classmates helped me throughout high school years in many ways. Sports also really played a big part in my life throughout high school. They kept me healthy physically and mentally, taught me the best life lessons, and it was fun to be able to play with teammates who became more like sisters."

Sarrah and the two Salutatorians are looking forward to the next phases of their lives. Sarrah looks forward to meeting new people, making money and traveling. Lyana is more than ready to get started on her bachelor's degree in dental hygiene and Manny is looking forward to becoming educated and growing as a person.

A decade from now, all three see themselves firmly in their careers, living their best lives and raising families. When asked what they envision for their community and what it would take to make them return as adults, all three had different answers.

"I want my community to continue to improve itself as a community. I've seen the struggles and strengths of those who live in my community and I would like to come back and be able to give back to those in need, and provide my assistance in any way," said Sarrah.

Lyana said, "I wouldn't want it to change. I like the way it is – peaceful and quiet. I would come back to visit family and want to retire here."

"I would hope for my community to grow economically," Manny said, "so I can open up a business here one day."
