



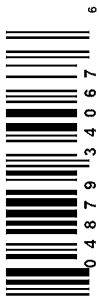

State Trust land closures announced

Due to extremely high fire danger, exceptional drought conditions, resource availability, and increased fire activity, the Department of Forestry and Fire Management and the Arizona State Land Department will implement closures to State Trust Land throughout Arizona. These closures are also in conjunction with our USFS partners.

As of 8 a.m. on June 25, 2021, closures will be implemented on state-owned and managed lands in all 15 counties. All state-owned and managed lands are closed to entry for recreational purposes, including hunting, camping, and off-road vehicle use. Target shooting and fireworks are prohibited year-round.

Closures apply to the following state-owned and state-managed lands within all 15 counties including:

- All State Trust lands outside incorporated municipalities.

- All State Parks outside incorporated municipalities – State Parks remain open with fire restrictions in place. Please refer to <https://azstateparks.com/fire-safety/> – for park-specific fire restriction information.
- Full shutdown of all operations; except organizations on mineral soil involving road excavation, watering, grading, gravel surfacing, and rock crushing may continue with special permission. Contractor will provide fire guard for three hours after shutdown.

Exemptions include:

- Persons with a written fire entry and activity permit that specifically authorizes the permitted to be on the land. This may include such persons as grazing-permit holders when entry is needed to gather, move, or otherwise manage their permitted livestock, special-use authorization holders when access is needed to maintain emergency or other communications

Don't get hot at ADOT workers during wildfires; crews working in their own communities to keep people safe

Some motorists upset with road closures due to multiple fires burning in Arizona are taking their frustrations out on ADOT personnel staffing the roadblocks.

ADOT does not decide which roads to close. Closures are determined by fire incident commanders who work in conjunction with law enforcement and ADOT, and motorists may face legal penalties for attempting to get around a barrier or other method used to shut down a

road.

"We understand that especially for people who live in areas affected by a wildfire, this is a very stressful situation for the entire community," said Rod Lane, an ADOT District Engineer who has handled fire-related closures for a number of years. "Our maintenance crews who close these roads do it to ensure that emergency

operations, and others.

- Any federal, state, or local law enforcement officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting organization in the performance of an official duty.
- Resident owners and lessees of land within the closed area.

Any closure exemption must be approved by the State Forester.

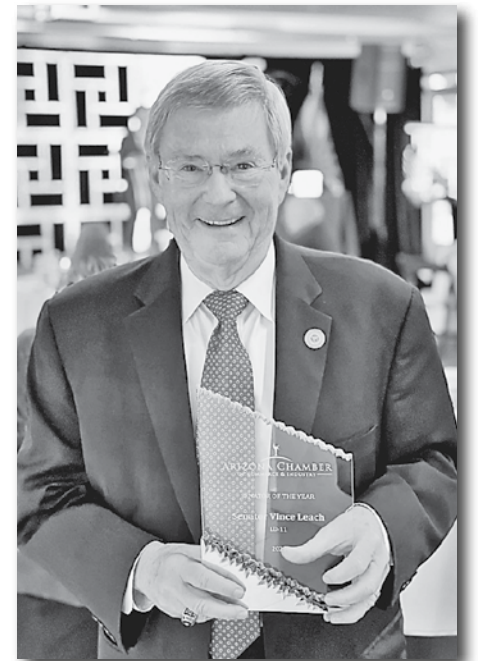
Senator Vince Leach named Senator of the Year

Young pianist to perform at friend's benefit concert

If you want to talk music, Annalupe Rodriquez, 17, of Oracle might be a good place to start.

She has played the piano for 11 years under the training of Elaine Helzer of Oracle, as well as taken voice lessons from her.

But that is not all she has accomplished. She also plays the French horn and guitar.

She graduated from Canyon del Oro High School this year where she sang in the choir, accompanied choruses and choirs, performed with a chamber music group and played in the orchestra, as well as getting to travel to New York to perform while in high school.

She said she had a playing partner with the accompaniments.

"He was really good with improv – adding all the extra notes. I can't do that, but I can sight read (play a song she has never seen before with few if any mistakes.) So we made a good combination," she said.

When the suggestion was made to fellow

student Isaac Tineo of San Manuel to do a benefit concert to help raise money for his grandfather, in typical Annalupe style, she volunteered to perform as well.

The two will combine their talents to help raise \$55,000 in donations to help Daniel Tineo of San Manuel get urgently needed brain surgery to remove a tumor on his pituitary gland.

Their joint concert is planned for Saturday, July 10, at 2 p.m. at the Oracle Piano Society's Center for the Performing Arts. Attendees will be asked to make a donation in lieu of ticket sales and are asked to please wear a mask. There will be a bake sale after the concert.

Annalupe is the daughter of Juan and Maria Rodriquez, who own DeMarco's restaurant in Oracle. She plans to attend the University of Arizona to earn a performance major in piano, while continuing to work on her voice.

While playing partner Isaac leans toward classical music, Annalupe lists jazz as her favorite.

"I can feel it and like the sound," she said.

She is also an avid reader and likes journaling.

"I like to write it out by hand, not use a computer. I like the feel of the pencil in my hand."

Her parents are very proud of her.

"When we lived Mexico we had nothing. And we had nothing when we got married. We wanted our children to have more than we had," Juan said.

"We wanted to open doors for our children and music was Annalupe's door. We wanted them to do something they liked and to be happy," Maria said.

Her dad added, "She listens to us."

Dr. Stephen Cook, the founder and artistic director for the Oracle Piano Society and the faculty/director of the online conservatory has worked with Annalupe preparing for her university auditions and said she is the most advanced of Elaine's students, describing her as "fantastic" as well as "hardworking, dedicated and unique."

COPPER CORRIDOR (June 18, 2021) – As Arizona’s early childhood agency, First Things First (FTF) recognizes that while every child develops at their own pace, developmental and sensory screenings are a way parents can learn about their child’s development.

Screenings can also catch concerns that can point to a delay or possible disability.

“Screenings are important because they identify delays and allow parents to connect with support services,” said FTF Senior Director for Children’s Health Vincent Torres. “They promote positive childhood health and development and readiness for school.”

The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that pediatricians talk with families about their child’s development at every well-child visit between birth and 3 years old, and conduct developmental screenings at 9, 18 and 30 months of age.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic, many families put off well-child visits for their young child, Torres said, causing these regular screenings to have been missed.

But another problem arises if a health provider is understaffed and doesn’t have time to conduct the basic screenings that parents assume are happening, said Esther Turner, a senior program coordinator for the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension, Pinal County, which provides developmental and sensory screenings.

Data shows that for many children, even before the pandemic, those screenings were not happening. For example, the 2018-19 National Survey of Children’s Health found that only 28% of Arizona parents surveyed said that they were asked by a health care provider to complete a developmental screening tool about their young child in the past year.

Programs like the Cooperative Extension try to fill the gap by offering screenings conducted by staff working with a variety of parenting education or family support services in the community. They also do screenings in some preschool classrooms.

“Kids don’t know any better and they can’t tell you what they don’t know,” said Turner, whose FTF-funded program provides developmental and sensory screenings for young children in Pinal and Gila counties. “They only know what they’ve seen or heard their entire life.”

In addition, there’s a fear or stigma for parents when talking

about developmental screenings.

“We’re not looking for problems,” Turner said. “Instead, we explain to parents that we’re looking to show you ‘this is normal development. Your kiddo is right now, on target.’”

And if the screening shows an area of concern, then the parent is referred to the child’s pediatrician for additional screenings or intervention.

“We want parents to be comfortable and let them know that they are the expert on their child,” Turner said. “The parent sees the child throughout the day. They are the expert and by letting them be a part of the process, they feel active in their child’s development and growth.”

If you are a parent or caregiver of a child 5 years old and younger, you can make a difference by monitoring your child’s physical, mental, social and emotional development and discussing your observations with your health care provider.

Please remember that all children develop at different rates. What is typical for other children may not be the same for yours. There are a couple of resources to help parents and caregivers identify concerns regarding their child’s development and make the most of those early doctor visits.

The first is the Ages and Stages Questionnaire, which parents can complete online. It includes a series of questions regarding your child’s development and behavior. The results of the questionnaire are emailed to parents within a couple of weeks and are intended to be used to follow up with a health provider regarding any identified issues. Free access to the questionnaire is available through Easterseals, Make the First Five Count website, <http://www.easterseals.com/mtffc/> under Take the

Screening.

FTF provides a digital Ages and Stages guide to help families know if their child is meeting typical developmental milestones – the things most children can do by a certain age. How their child plays, learns, speaks, acts and moves offers important clues. Available in both English and Spanish, it is adapted from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Ages and Stages guides.

Another resource is the free, statewide Birth to 5 Helpline (1-877-705-5437). There, nurses and developmental experts will give you tips on which milestones your child should have achieved for their age and help you decide if a follow up with your health provider is needed.

“We have the chance to help children learn properly and not having them have to relearn once they’re in kindergarten,” Turner said. “These are things that people think can wait until kindergarten, but we have five good years. Let’s get it right for them from the beginning.”

responders can use the roads to access fire areas, evacuate residents and keep people out of harm’s way. We’re doing our best to keep everyone safe.”

This also highlights the comprehensive nature of the work performed by highway maintenance crews. During most of the year, crew members do pavement work, repair guardrail and clean up roadside trash. Incidents such as wildfires highlight the crews’ commitment to public safety first and foremost.

ADOT crews sometimes encounter motorists who are angry and demand to be allowed to drive on a closed highway. Brett Rupp, an ADOT Highway Operations Technical Supervisor in Payson says, “ADOT maintenance crews live in and around the communities we serve and some of us have had to evacuate ourselves and our families. It’s unfortunate when one of our crew members is confronted by an upset motorist because people may not realize what that person standing in the heat and smoke for several hours is going through. His or her home may be at risk, but they are still on the job protecting the community.”

Oracle State Park introduces design of new wildlife blind

Oracle State Park and the Friends of Oracle State Park have announced that a new Wildlife Blind may soon be constructed at the park.

Right now, Friends of Oracle State is working with park management to obtain “cultural clearance” in order to demolish the crumbling old blind and build the new one. Cultural clearance is required to verify that the site is not of historical or archeological significance. Based on general knowledge of the site, they expect to

receive clearance. In addition to the Wildlife Blind, the Friends are asking for cultural clearance for the 300’ x 100’ area in front of the blind and 60’ x 100’ area behind the blind. This area around the Wildlife Blind will be designated for improving habitat, part of its long term vision.

Once they have the go ahead, the Friends will reach out to the community and conservation groups, such as the Audubon Society, for support.

“We are happy to say we already have a FOSP member who has committed \$5,000 to the project, and we have several others who are interested,” the Friends said in an email to members.

An estimate obtained in February 2021 for demolition of the old blind and construction of the new Wildlife Blind was approximately \$15,000. Due to increasing building material costs, the Friends expect the final estimate to be higher.

The Friends of Oracle State Park Board has also begun cleanup and repair of the Sisters’ Cottages and the Adobe Homestead House. The initial work has involved replacing rotting boards, patching holes to stop rodents, and cleaning. In December 2020, the park implemented pest and rodent control in these structures. In May 2021, the FOSP board submitted a proposal to the State outlining goals for the project. This is an extensive project which will require most of our attention once the Wildlife Blind project is completed.

The Friends are also working with the Oracle State Park Manager on signage for the geology program in the park. The long term goal of the park management is to have an interpretive Geology program with signs describing the Oracle granite, geological history, and

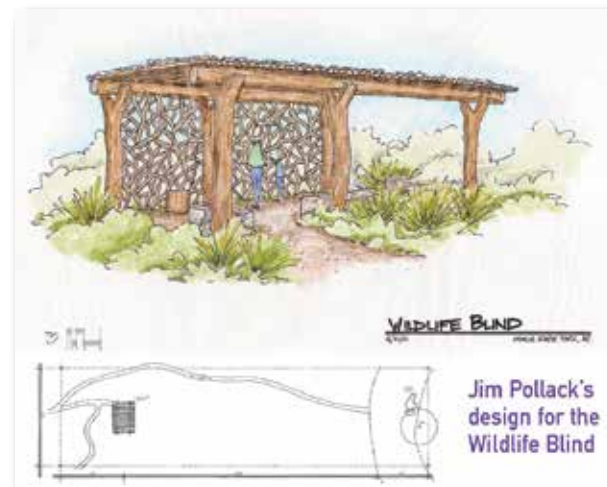
