Mary Fernández Romero

Mary Fernández Romero passed away peacefully in the early evening, Tuesday, June 22, 2021. She was two weeks shy of her 90th birthday. Mary was born July 5, 1931 in Lumberton, New Mexico to José and Ignacita Fernandez, one of 12 children.

On Dec. 29, 1951, she married her husband Criss Romero in Lumberton, New Mexico after they met in Santa Fe where they had both moved for work. They immediately moved to Superior, AZ in 1952, where she and Criss resided for their remaining years.

Mary was an unassuming but nontraditional woman. She worked during a time when women were expected to attend to the home. She and Criss adopted two boys, Criss Jr. and

David. Her experience as a young woman made her committed to an advanced education for her children, and taught them both to read before they began the first grade.

Mary was a strongly religious woman and a person of social justice. She was a participating union member, and she supported various nonprofits through donations, and was a participant in Habitat for Humanity. She and her husband were known to their family and to the community as generous with resources, not collecting rent during strikes, and helping people pay their utility bills during hard times. Mary was generous with their knowledge and affection, the kitchen and home filled with family at special times like Easter.

Mary is survived by a large loving family including her husband, Criss Romero; her son, Criss Romero Jr. and his husband Johnny Melichar; her son, David Romero; granddaughter, Avenicia Romero, and her mother, Alfreda Tsosie.

She is also survived by her sister, Juanita Valdez; niece, Mary Jane Maestas; nephews, Danny Valdez, and his wife Lucinda, and Teddy Valdez. She also leaves behind many nephews and

nieces. All of these she cherished and touched deeply.

Services for Mary were held Wednesday, June 30, 2021, at St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church – St. Mary's Center. She was laid to rest in Fairview Cemetery, Superior, AZ.

Pinal County and Town of Superior to host sandbag event to promote post-fire flooding preparedness

To prepare for post-fire flooding, Pinal County and the Town of Superior will be providing sandbags at the Superior Airport located at 101 Airport Road. The event will take place on July 2 and 3 from 5 a.m. to 1 p.m. Pre-filled sandbags will be available for residents with a limit of 50 bags per family household.

Sandbags will also be available after 9 a.m. on July 2 at the following locations: Boyce Thompson Arboretum, Spirit of Truth Baptist Church (Top of the World), and Queen Valley Fire District. Sandbags will remain available at these locations until gone.

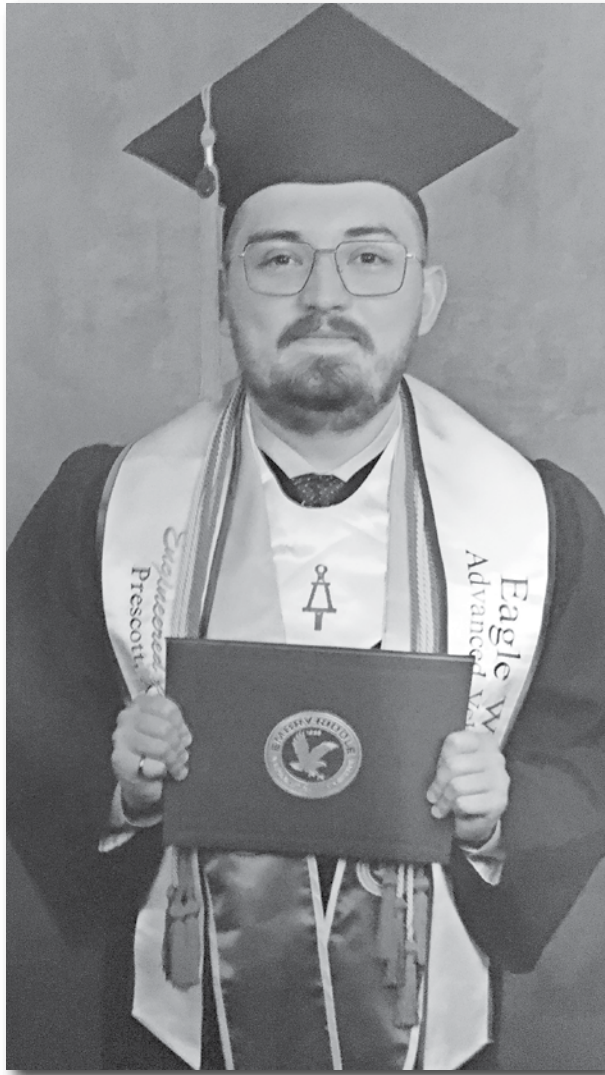
After an intense wildfire, burned vegetation and charred soil form a water-repellent layer blocking water absorption for years. During rainfall, water bounces

Support Local: Boyce Thompson Arboretum

In April 2020, COVID-19 brought much of Arizona's economy to a screeching halt. All businesses not deemed "essential" were ordered closed by Arizona's governor Doug Ducey.

The lockdown continued for nearly two months. When Gov. Ducey finally gave the go ahead to reopen, businesses slowly began the road to recovery. Even those listed as "essential" had a challenge with this economic recovery.

Many small businesses and non-profits in Arizona didn't survive the lockdown. The businesses that did survive are hanging on as best they can. *Copper Area News* wanted to give something back to the local business community. Over the next several weeks, our newspapers (*Copper Basin News*, *Superior Sun* and *San Manuel Miner*) will be featuring local businesses and non-profits, encouraging our readers to Shop at Home, stay local and support our local businesses. To date, *Copper Area News* has featured 75 businesses in the Copper Corridor.

As the COVID-19 Pandemic took its toll, businesses, families and even local non-profits had to adjust their strategies to keep their missions moving forward while working through the pandemic.

The Boyce Thompson Arboretum is one of the most special of Superior's and Arizona's treasures. Founder, Col. Boyce Thompson grew this botanical garden when he invested in the development of the Magma Mine. For generations, copper mining and the Arboretum would be capstones to Superior's economy and sense of place. Col. Boyce Thompson wanted

to study the plants of the world's arid deserts, and his collection and the research he started is reaching 100 years old.

The Boyce Thompson Arboretum was founded on April 1, 1924 and was designated Arizona's first non-profit research institution on Oct. 5, 1927. The Arboretum opened to the public on April 6, 1929. It is believed that the Arboretum is Arizona's oldest non-profits still operating today.

The Boyce Thompson Arboretum was scheduled to host a spectacular grand opening for the Wallace Desert Garden collection in March of 2020, and, as the early days of the pandemic affected the world, leadership at the Arboretum were forced to cancel the event and delay the opening of the garden until it was safe to host a celebration and open it with some fanfare. The Wallace Garden opened to the public in October of 2020. What many did not expect during the pandemic was the importance of outdoor recreation, public gardens, hiking trails, parks and places that allowed people to recreate and also be physically distant would become critically important.

The Boyce Thompson Arboretum was already undergoing a transformation prior to the pandemic's arrival, the board of directors had decided to end a long standing tri-partite agreement with Arizona State Parks and the University of Arizona and operate the Arboretum under its own leadership and governance. The pandemic created a new challenge but management, staff, and the board of directors quickly got to work to ensure that the Boyce Thompson Arboretum would

safely remain open to provide respite from the pandemic and be a safe refuge for all who wanted to venture out. In 2020, the park saw record breaking attendance reaching 100,000 visitors to the Arboretum, even without special events and field trips. There was fear that lay offs would need to occur due to the pandemic, lack of visitation, and heading into the heat of the summer created some stress, but remarkably there are 36 staff members still employed today and the team is expected to grow in the coming years.

The Arboretum quickly became an easy escape for those living in the metro areas, but also a safe place for residents of Superior and the Copper Corridor to enjoy time outdoors. The Boyce Thompson Arboretum is a 343-acre park, with 3,900 plant species and there are 4.75 miles of trails to explore. The gift shop has a variety of unique gifts, souvenirs, and for those who wish to garden, there are always some plants available for sale (the Spring and Fall Plant sales are the best time to purchase). Throughout the seasons there is an opportunity to see the Arboretum with a different view. In late fall the leaves of the Chinese pistachio trees change into a bright orange hue. Winter, you can see how the cooler air and moisture change the appearance of the cacti and foliage. Spring comes alive with the return of the infamous Turkey Vultures and the colors of wild flowers. While the heat may scare many off from a visit to the Arboretum in the Summer, come early in the morning to see animals moving about the park but most importantly see the blooms of Saguaro and Prickly Pear.

Superior and the Boyce Thompson Arboretum have always been connected but the Arboretum was just outside of the Superior town limits – that was until February 2021 when the Arboretum was officially annexed into the Superior town limits, making Superior the official home of the Boyce Thompson Arboretum.

Despite a very close call, the Boyce Thompson Arboretum was saved from the ravages of the Telegraph Fire. The blaze came within 100 feet of several plant collections on their western boundaries. Officials from both the Town of Superior and the Boyce Thompson Arboretum have commented that the Arboretum will play an important role in helping to re-propagate the desert plants that have burned in the Telegraph fire.

With COVID restrictions lifting, events, classes and guided tours will return to the park. Admission is \$15 for adults and \$5.00 for children. For July and August they will host Arb After Hours which will feature evening hours at the park (5-7 p.m.), light food and adult beverages, tickets are \$20. The events will be held on the Second Fridays of July and August to correspond with the Downtown Superior Second Friday activities. There are a variety of membership options that allow daily access to the park. Summer hours for the Arboretum are 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. (closed Tuesdays) June through August. Winter hours begin in September and hours are 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Last admissions are the hour before closing. Learn more about the Boyce Thompson Arboretum online at www.tbarboretum.org.
