HWUSD public hearing scheduled on tax increase

The Hayden-Winkelman School District will be having a public hearing at 5:30 p.m., on July 10, 2013 at the HWUSD Board Room at 824 Thorne Avenue to discuss the District's

need to levy an additional \$118,000. The increase is above the qualify tax rate and requires Governing Board approval. This additional funding will increase the primary tax rate on a

\$100,000 home from \$578 to \$630.02 or \$52.02 per year. The Governing Board welcomes all members of Hayden-Winkelman to this hearing and Governing Board Meeting.

Forums answer many questions regarding Resolution Copper; one set for tonight in Superior

Resolution Copper has hosted two community forums to help the public understand the complexities of the pending mining project.

The first forum was held on June 12 and shared the economic benefits and impacts that the Resolution Copper project will have on Superior. The presentation was made by Danny Court who is an Economist for the Elliot D. Pollack Company. The company has completed an economic study and has determined that the project will create 1,400 direct jobs with Resolution Copper and 2,700 indirect jobs. These

numbers do not include the construction jobs that will be created prior to the mine opening. Court also explained how the project will save the local tax payers by reducing their property taxes to the school district and the county.

The second presentation was held on June 26, the topic of this forum was about the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). This particular subject has been highly controversial and opposition groups have said that current land exchange legislation will allow the company to avoid the NEPA process. Patty McGrath with Tetra

Tech explained how the NEPA process is used to regulate mining and other development projects. The NEPA looks at a project in a holistic way to determine what affects a project will have on the environment as well as cultural and other socioeconomic concerns.

McGrath explained that even if the project is constructed on private land a NEPA will have to be conducted. The NEPA or Environmental Review will need to be conducted because other public lands are near the project or roads, pipelines, or power lines will cross into those public lands, that alone will require the entire project to have a NEPA



review regardless of land ownership.

McGrath was not fully versed on the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange bill but was able to explain the NEPA process and share how the company will have to comply with the act. Vickie Peacey the

Environmental, Legal and External Affairs manager for Resolution Copper explained to the packed house that once the mine plan of operations was completed it would be submitted to the Forest Service, once the Forest Service receives the plan,

Forest Service officials will determine and initiate the necessary environmental studies needed. Peacey explained that Resolution Copper is expecting to have the Mine Plan of Operations completed later this year.

Overall both forums have allowed for ample time for those in attendance to have their questions and concerns addressed and discussed openly.

Resolution has four more community forums scheduled to address other project concerns such as the mining method, water use, tailings management and the land exchange legislation. The meetings are held at the Magma Club, 38 Kumpke Ct., Superior, from 6-8 p.m. The topic schedule includes:

CAC passes property tax increase, half than proposed

The Governing Board of the Pinal County Community College District (PCCCD), also known as Central

Arizona College, passed an increase in primary property taxes, though the increase was only half the amount initially proposed. The Governing Board set to increase the primary

property taxes about 23.7 percent. This would mean the tax increase on a \$100,000 home would go from \$161.18 to \$216.18, a bump of \$55. The Governing Board

voted 3-1 on June 18 to cut back the increase, instead moving in favor of an increase of 28 cents per \$100 of assessed property valuation. For example, those in the district with a \$100,000

home would only see a \$28 increase, from \$161.18 per year to \$189.18, in primary property taxes. This proposed increase is exclusive of increased primary property taxes

received from new construction. The increase also is exclusive of any changes that may occur from property tax levies for voter approved bonded indebtedness or budget and tax overrides.

Reduced fees for cosmetology program announced at GCC

Dr. Stephen Cullen of Gila Community College announces a significant reduction in course fees for the Gila Community College Cosmetology Academy (GCCCA) effective July 1, 2013. This means a total cost reduction of more than 50% for both the Cosmetology and Nail Technician Programs.

“We are able to offer this significant savings to students and their families who wish to enroll in the one-year program,” Cullen said. “This is a result of sound fiscal management and our

continued commitment to the deserving adult learners of Gila County.”

The training provides the opportunity to prepare for the state exam and transitioning in the beauty industry. The curriculum is the same as previously offered. The curriculum is approved through Eastern Arizona College.

The costs reductions are included in the required student kits and course fees. The cost reductions will make the program more affordable for students and within financial aid awards for

those who qualify through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). FAFSA is a program that provides students with financial assistance.

There is a call for admissions for the program on July 9th at 6:00 p.m. at the Gila Pueblo Campus. For more information pertaining to the program, contact Patti Bocardo at 928-425-8481. Gila Community College remains committed to providing viable workforce training to all of Gila County.

The ice cream was so easy to make in a small zippable bag: you add milk, vanilla and sugar, seal it, then in a larger zip bag add ice and rock salt and shake it for a few minutes and amazingly it turns to ice cream!

The youth enjoyed all the experiments and learning they had during this program.

Shipman Fire threatens town of Kearny; one home destroyed

Monday evening about 5 p.m. a lightning-caused fire forced evacuations for many residents of Kearny.

The fire began near the Gila River which has been dry for several weeks. Those dry conditions helped the fire to spread quickly,

advancing towards the Town of Kearny. Pinal County Sheriff's Office assisted the Kearny Police Department with notifying

residents of the evacuations. The evacuation of the Steven's Trailer park is still in effect and further evacuations have not been ordered.

In early reports it was said that the fire had spread to 200 acre. However by Tuesday morning the State Forester had reported that the fire had only spread to close to 100 acres and at press time the fire was only actively burning on five acres. Twenty fire agencies were on hand to assist with the blaze overnight. The State Forester also ordered a type 2 command team and an air tanker to help combat the blaze. Those crews were expected to arrive at the fire Tuesday morning. Once the Type Two Command team is in

place they will take over command of the fire.

Pinal County Animal Care & Control mobilized its emergency response trailer, which includes kennel space for dogs and cats whose owners may be seeking shelter. Livestock affected by the fire or smoke are being cared for by neighboring ranchers.

On Tuesday afternoon the fire advanced and burned the power lines between Kearny and Hayden. Due to the power outage the Hayden Town Hall was closed. At press time it was unknown when the power would be turned back on.

One residence and an out building were burned in the blaze. Thankfully there have been no reports of casualties or injuries.

Cell phone communication also remains limited due to damage of the Verizon Tower near Kearny.

The crews at the Copper Basin Railway also worked through the night to keep the tracks and land around the rail road wet. Highway 177 was closed for a while on Monday night but opened with the use of pilot cars around midnight. The Highway closed again Tuesday after the fire blazed up a second time.

The American Red Cross opened a shelter for those who were evacuated at the Ray Elementary School. The shelter did not officially open until 1 a.m., it took a while to get volunteers staffed at the Red Cross Shelter because a

large number of volunteers are still assisting with the Yarnell Hill and Dean Peak Fires.

State Senator Barbara McGuire, a Kearny resident, has maintained contact with Pinal County Emergency Management since the fire began. "I want to commend all the first responders who are on scene here. Fire crews from Kearny, Hayden, Winkelman, Dudleyville, Globe, Superior, the state forest crews, County Sheriff's office and the Red Cross are here working hard. Helicopters are also on scene dropping water on the advancing fire. It is very unnerving because the fire is so near my home but I am putting my faith in knowing that these crews are doing all they can."

Supervisor Pete Rios has also visited the evacuation center through the early morning hours. "Agencies and first responders have

trained for many years for just this type of scenario. Although wildfire response resources are stretched thin across the west, I have been impressed with the response to the Shipman Fire so far," Rios said. "This is a beautiful but vulnerable part of Pinal County and I pray that we can keep the property and vegetation loss to a minimum."

Pinal County Public Health officials recommend that people who have respiratory difficulty, asthma or other lung conditions remain indoors and take every effort possible to avoid the smoke. People with swamp coolers should limit their use to avoid bringing smoky air into their homes or businesses.
