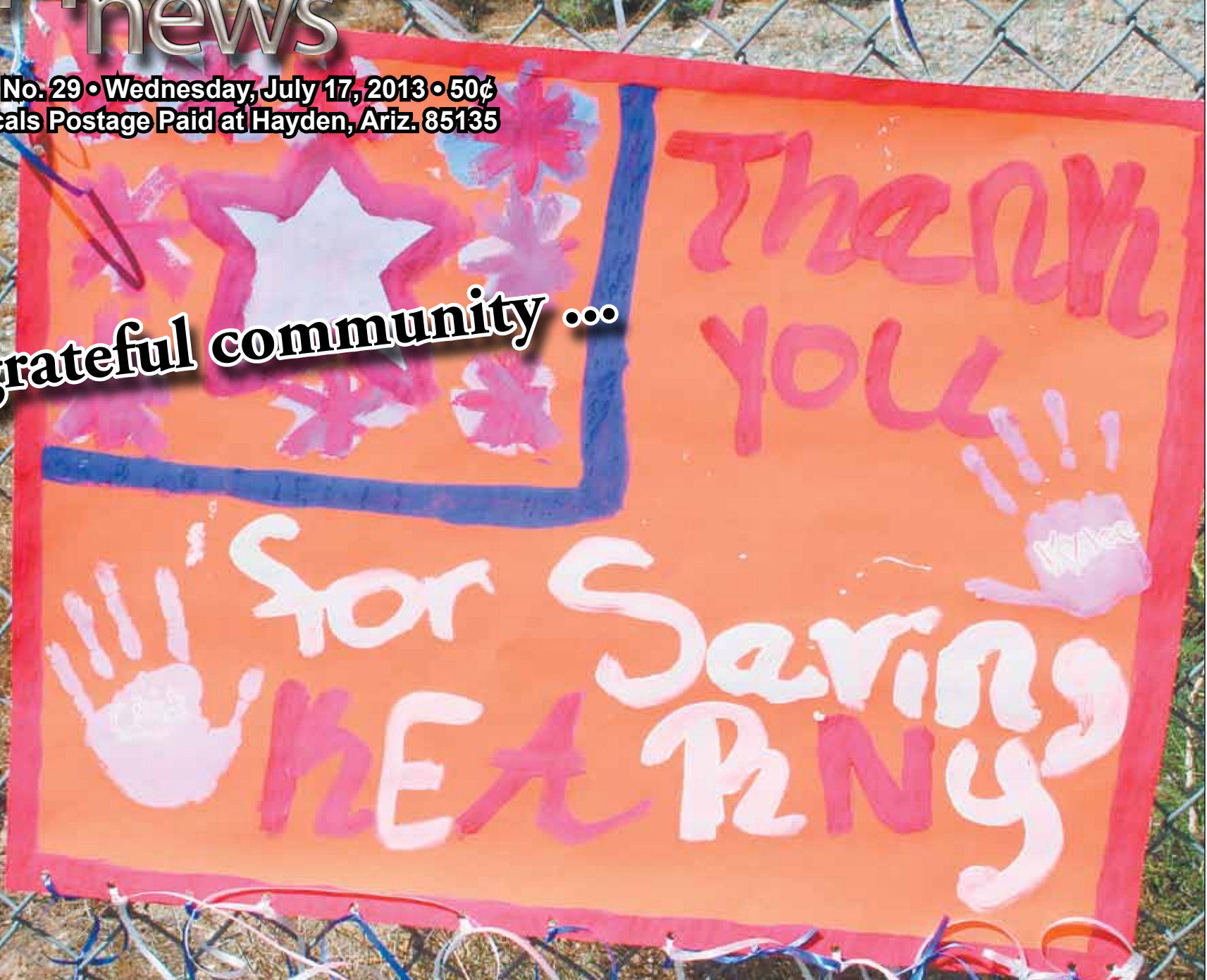

CVRMC electrical fire contained

On Tuesday, July 9, at approximately 5:20 p.m., an electrical fire began in the main power room located on the south side of Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center (CVRMC). A CVRMC Maintenance employee was on scene at the time of the incident replacing a fuse. An electrical explosion occurred and he suffered superficial burns to his face and second and third degree burns to his hands and forearms. He was treated in the ER and air ambulated to the Maricopa Burn Unit in Phoenix.

The fire was contained in the main electrical supply room with Canyon, Globe, and Tri-City Fire Departments responding to the scene. Power was automatically transferred to the emergency backup system when the electricity was shut

down. Administration of the hospital initiated the "Internal Disaster" protocol at approximately 5:40 p.m.

Emergency patients being transported by ground ambulance were diverted to other facilities while the Gila County Sheriff's Department and Globe Police Department controlled traffic at the south end of Hospital Drive. A registered nurse was also posted along with law enforcement to provide triage to emergency patients transported by private vehicle.

With all power shut down, patient areas and medical monitoring equipment continued, uninterrupted with emergency power. 25 patients were in the hospital (5 ER, 3 ICU, 11 Med/Surg, 6 OB) at the time the fire started and

Backpacks and school supplies arriving soon

SaddleBrooke Community Outreach is reminding parents and students that backpacks filled with school supplies will be available before the start of the school year for students that qualify. Backpacks are being provided for kids grades K-6 that qualify under the federal criteria

for underprivileged children for free or reduced lunch programs. Students that meet these criteria from Oracle, San Manuel, Mammoth, Winkelman, Kearny and Superior schools qualify. SaddleBrooke Community Outreach has identified 1,395 kids that qualify for backpacks. Each school has a list of qualified

students. If you are new to these schools or feel your child qualifies for the program, contact your school for more information.

Kindergarten through second grade will have their small backpacks filled with 12 pencils and a pencil sharpener; two glue sticks; two erasers; four two-pocket folders;

one package of wide rule paper; one box of 24 crayons; and a pair of blunt nose scissors.

Third through fifth graders will receive a medium sized backpack with 12 pencils and a pencil sharpener; two glue sticks; two erasers; six two-pocket folders; one package wide rule paper; 12 colored pencils; one

composition notebook; and eight washable markers.

The large backpacks for the sixth grade students will contain 12 pencils and a pencil sharpener; two glue sticks; two erasers; eight two-pocket file folders; two blue ink pens and one red ink pen; a composition notebook; and one ruler.

Part of the mission of

SaddleBrooke Community Outreach is to keep kids in school and improve their self esteem with programs like the Kids' Closet and the new backpack program. Look for the backpacks to be available for pick up in early August before school starts. For more information contact the elementary school in your district.

Back to School information listed for students, parents at Hayden-Winkelman Schools

It's that time of year again – the one where the parents rejoice and kids all groan.

Hayden-Winkelman Schools has released important information for students and parents about the coming school year.

Registration dates and times for students in kindergarten through 12th grade are:

Monday, July 29, and
Tuesday, July 30

Time: noon – 6 p.m.

Place: Hayden High School Lobby

High School Registration fee: \$20 per student (Cash only)

The Hayden-Winkelman School District will be proposing a \$2 extracurricular activity fee for all extracurricular sports and clubs. The governing board is expected to adopt the \$2 extracurricular activity fee for participation in each extracurricular activity at the July 24 Board Meeting. These fees will apply to extracurricular clubs and sports that are not part of the district or school's educational programs. This fee is required for the club and/or the extracurricular activities to be eligible for tax credits. The fee must be

paid prior to the start of each sport and paid directly to the school district.

School officials will also need a copy of your child's health insurance card to be put on file this school year.

Any new students will need birth certificate, immunization records, copy withdrawal form and transcripts.

Dress Code

As you prepare for the new school year please keep in mind the HWUSD adopted dress code policy, as it will strictly be enforced during the 2013-2014 school year. Students are encouraged to dress for success and in a manner that represents a serious approach to learning and work. Good taste is always in fashion and need not be expensive or trendy. The appearance of any student is the responsibility of the individual and his or her parent/legal guardian. Students should maintain an appearance that is not distracting to teachers or other students. Dress should not be detrimental to the educational process of the school. The following guidelines should be kept in mind:

- Clothing that advertises alcohol, tobacco products, violence, foul language or that is sexually suggestive or represents gang affiliation is not permitted on campus.

- Shoes or sandals must be worn on campus. House slippers are not appropriate. P.E., CTE classes and other school activities may require special footwear.

- Clothing that is transparent, exposes a bare midriff, shoulders or back is not permitted on campus. Halter tops and spaghetti strapped tops are not allowed on campus.

- Shorts/pants must cover the waist and may not be shorter than an extended arm while standing. Bicycle shorts and other tight or revealing clothing may not be worn to class. Sagging, excessively baggy or hanging pants are not appropriate.

- Student caps and hats are not allowed in the classrooms.

- In order to promote security for all and to be able to identify students, no hoods, snow caps, masks, or dark glasses may be worn in school buildings.

Guest Editorial: Resolution Copper cleans up century-worth of legacy mining

What does a century's worth of mining activity do to a landscape?

David Lira, a lifetime Superior resident, knows firsthand the impacts a booming mine has on a community and the families that call it home.

"If it wasn't for the mine there would've never been a Superior," he said. "With the mine come the jobs and all the people who make it their living. And that also brings the disadvantages mining has on the land," he said. "But that's what mining is."

Superior lies in the heart of the historic Pioneer Mining District, nestled between the border of Tonto National Forest and the red cliffs of Apache Leap. Its saguaro, arroyos and barrel cactus-covered hills are dotted with the remnants of more than a century-worth of legacy mining endeavors.

Lira was the quintessential jack-of-all-trades when it came to mining; he spent 47 years in the business. A mechanic and welder

by trade, he worked as a maintenance supervisor at the mill under Magma Copper Company and for a brief stint, served as Superior community liaison for BHP Billiton.

He was on the front lines the day in 1990 when heavy rains caused Magma's #3 and #4 tailings north of town to fail and the sand-like material breached low-lying properties between Pinal Street and the company fence line.

"When that happened, every underground miner had to come up and start shoveling tails off people's property," he remembers. As part of his job, he had to individually survey and test more than 120 affected private parcels for traces of metals and contaminants.

"Before then, we [Magma] never had an environmental person. Improvements to the monitoring system were implemented by the company around the late 80s," he says.

To many lifetime Superiorites the acres of waste-rock piles, process ponds and tailings

impoundments to the north of town are as familiar a landmark as Picket Post Mountain to the west.

To Resolution Copper Mining these legacy mining remnants are part of the extensive cleanup the company pledges to accomplish before commencing operations on the proposed mine at Oak Flat, explains Casey

McKeon, environmental manager at Resolution Copper. Reclamation and cleanup work is especially important to McKeon; she moved to Superior to work on the project and wants to see her town thriving and healthy.

"Resolution Copper plans to be part of the community for decades. We want our presence

to contribute to a better future, which is why we remain dedicated to reclamation work and to permitting and building a modern mine that is safe and a showcase of environmental stewardship," she said. To date, Resolution Copper has spent more than two-thirds of a \$50 million reclamation budget and plans to clean up about 1,500 acres of previously

affected lands near Superior. The company will simultaneously do reclamation work as it progresses exploration, engineering and environmental studies.

"Our focus for the future is to continue rehabilitating the West Plant site north of town until the job is done, and the majority of that cleanup work is being completed by

CAC's On Time Registration initiative goes into effect for the 2013 fall semester

PINAL COUNTY, Ariz.
– As part of an ongoing effort to prepare students to be more successful in the classroom, Central Arizona College is launching On Time Registration beginning with the 2013 fall semester. Starting with classes that begin after 4:30 p.m. on Aug. 16, students will no longer be allowed to

local contractors such as CRC [Copper Resource Contracting], Albo Guzman Trucking and Superior Environmental Solutions,” said McKeon.

Lira has high expectations for the future of Superior. He's hopeful that future will include many lifelong careers at Resolution Copper for Superior's youth. The project is expected to create 3,700 American job – 1,400 of those working directly for and at the mine. The mine will generate \$1 billion annually in economic benefits for Arizona, and create more than \$19 billion in federal, state and local tax revenue over its lifetime.

Staggering economic figures aside, for Lira, it all comes down to staying true to one's roots. “When Resolution gets going, and I hope they do, they need to take a good look at the community,” he says with conviction. “They need to hire locally as much as possible...

and just respect the hometown.”

He has an ally in McKeon. “We all have family and friends who call Superior home,” she says. “We want it to prosper. We share a sense of pride in the community. Our investment in and commitment to proper land rehabilitation is one way we have of demonstrating that pride.”

Water is essential to life. The desert plants, insects, and animals have learned how to adapt to the low humidity and intense heat of a Sonoran summer. But humans need to take special care to drink enough water to stay hydrated.

There is no set rule on how much is needed to drink, since the amount

of water taken in is dependent on how much is lost in perspiration, respiration and excretion. A good way to tell if you are sufficiently hydrated is urine color and output.

Urine should be pale yellow in color with no odor, and sufficient in volume. If urine is the color of apple juice, you need to drink more liquids. Remember to take

sufficient water with you when hiking. It's recommended that you take a minimum of one gallon per person. This may seem excessive, but

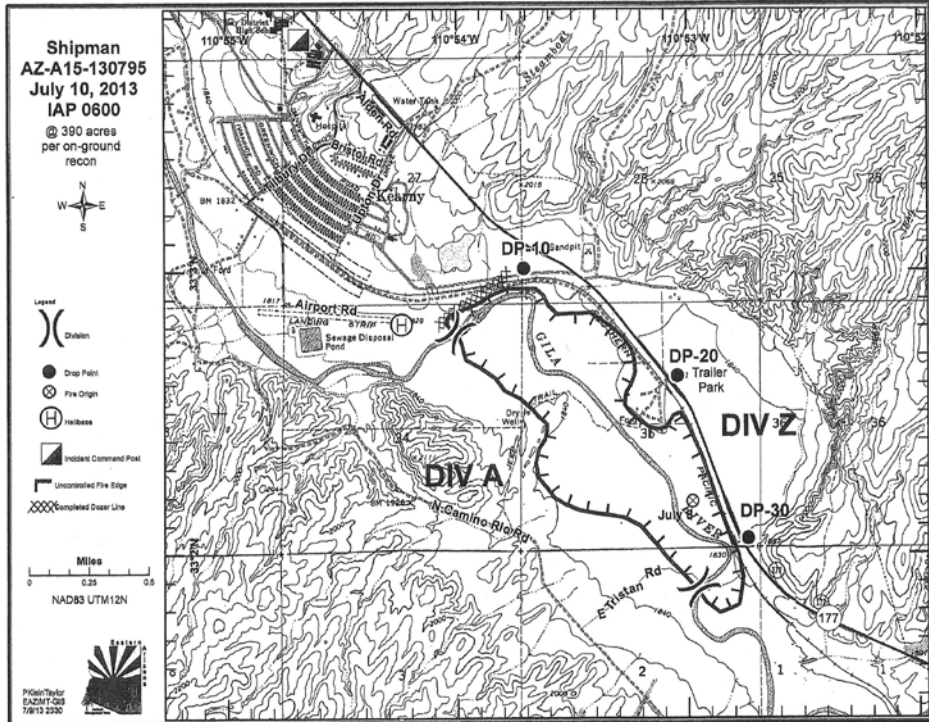

Eastern Arizona Incident Management Team reported Wednesday night that the Shipman Fire burning one mile southeast of Kearny is approximately 47% contained. This estimate was made prior to any of the monsoon storms of Wednesday night. The fire has involved approximately 518 acres.

John Philbin, the incident commander of the Eastern Arizona Incident Management Team, told Kearny residents that the firefighters still have a lot of work around the Stephens Trailer Park, but that homeowners should be able to return to the park by Thursday afternoon. Gas will remain off to the park until Friday. Philbin reported that the fire started after lightning struck the home of Frank Giroux. The home burned completely in 25 minutes. Philbin said that the number of firefighters on the scene is approximately 225.

Shipman Fire Operations manager Jeremy Human complimented all the fire crews and local fire departments on their response to the emergency. He also praised local police, volunteers and townspeople for their efforts. The school, he said, also played a big role.

Brian Gomez, Public Information Officer for the Red Cross, said they received lots of help and many items donated to help those who were staying at the shelter. In a press release update, Gomez reported that three people had

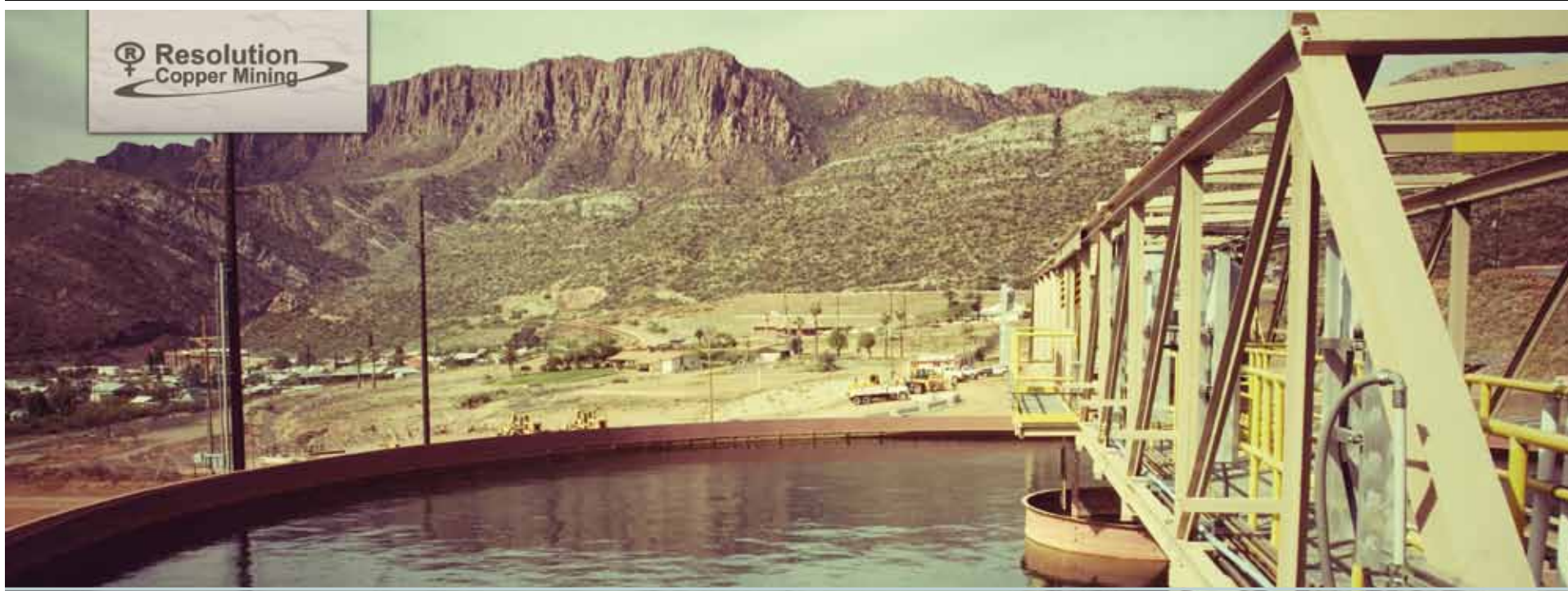

Reflections from the evacuation center

After watching the fire spread from a vantage point by the water tanks it was soon evident that we had a real serious situation. The LDS and Good Shepherd Church were opened for evacuees but as evacuations increased attentions were focused on

the Ray School Cafeteria.

Shelly Pacheco and Ramon Rubalcaba were keeping things under control there as families began arriving. Rene Pacheco was manning the command center at the elementary school. There are important observations people need

to keep in mind. We are a rural community, one that some agencies call remote. By the time that calls were made for help for evacuees, Red Cross workers had to be mobilized and sent on their way to Kearny, a place many had never heard of. Everyone who

came to assist came from the Yarnell, Doce and Kingman fires. The relief crew arrived the next night, and were from Tennessee also having just worked the Yarnell and Doce fires. The first Red Cross crew arrived at 1 a.m. and the cots, blankets, and pillows arrived at 3 a.m. from Casa

Grande. Because of the previous three fires this month supplies are almost depleted.

Children at the cafeteria were extremely well behaved; the two-year-old finally went to sleep at 5 a.m. after entertaining everyone. Older siblings helped with the younger

ones. In case of extended evacuations quiet time games or books for children would make good donations, limiting action games. If needed, arrangements for the children would have been made for games and recreation in another

you'll be surprised at how much water you will drink with exercise.

For other forms of physical activity, whether it is bicycle riding, horseback riding or sports, you should keep in mind the importance of remaining hydrated. When engaged in activities causing heavy perspiration, you may need

to replace electrolytes as well as fluid. Be aware of the signs of heat-related illnesses, for yourself and those around you:

Dehydration: headache, fatigue, lightheadedness

Heat cramps: muscle cramps

Heat exhaustion: nausea, dizziness, fainting

Heat stroke: lack of perspiration, confusion (call 911 as this can be life threatening!)

The Sonoran sun is intense, and the need to

protect your skin from its UV rays is vital if you plan to be outside for extended periods of time. The sun's rays are most intense from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. and dermatologists recommend that you use sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or greater, and wear long sleeves, a wide brimmed hat, and sunglasses during those hours.

Enjoy your recreation and trips out and about in the Sonoran desert but do it safely! Be sure to protect the children too.

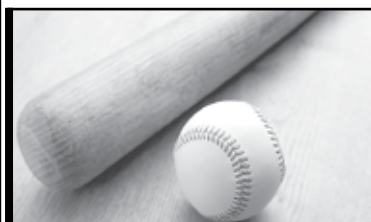

location. Donations of water kept coming in. Joyleign Wormwood, cafeteria manager, could not get to the cafeteria because of the road closure but gave instructions as to where toilet paper was stored. We found peanut butter, crackers and apples to help ease nervous hunger for those gathered. Keep in mind that school had been out for several weeks so supplies on hand were limited. During the power outage one of the Stephens evacuees brought in battery operated fans which were a blessing. Opening the cafeteria for evacuees was the wisest choice because food preparation was on site. When Joyleign was able to get through she set in motion wonderful food preparations with menu changes as the number of evacuees increased or decreased. My personal opinion is that the Red Cross workers were relieved not to have to deal with meal preparation. What can people do if and when these types of emergencies arrive? If you are ever evacuated it is imperative that you go to the evacuation center and sign in, even if you are not staying there, stating where you will be going. When cell phone service went out, people dropped by trying to locate friends or relatives. If names were not on the list there was nothing the volunteers could do. In addition to donations of water and ice, fruit, cookie and chip snacks are welcome, keeping in mind that people with diabetes need something different. Milk for young children is important. Most of the evacuees were from the 200 blocks and had just experienced

the fire the week before so there was a certain amount of shell shock. At first there were many who slept in their cars in front of the cafeteria. Cots are best suited for the younger generation. We were lucky; for those of you who were displaced multiply your time away from your home by eight days and you can really empathize with the other Arizona evacuees. Lots of activity was taking place on the Ray campus. As Orzell stated

during the community meeting Wednesday night, “We all realize the school is the hub of the community.” It was proven this past week. Rene Pacheco opened the command center at the elementary school and worked straight through 36 hours with no sleep. All other areas were for the firefighters to sleep, shower and eat. Even though the Red Cross and others can step in and help communities

it is important that people who know the community are on hand to answer questions and help with logistics. We may be rural but not ignorant, as a community there are great level headed leaders who are trained to step in and take over in an emergency. We made it through the ‘83 and ‘93 floods but of course there were no digital or cell phone cameras to alert the world. Each evacuee has their own story to tell and it

is important to listen to what they have to say, especially the children. I know I learned a lot by just listening and it doesn’t hurt to volunteer. You just have to get used to not sleeping.
