# Sea Lions win medals at the League Championship Meet

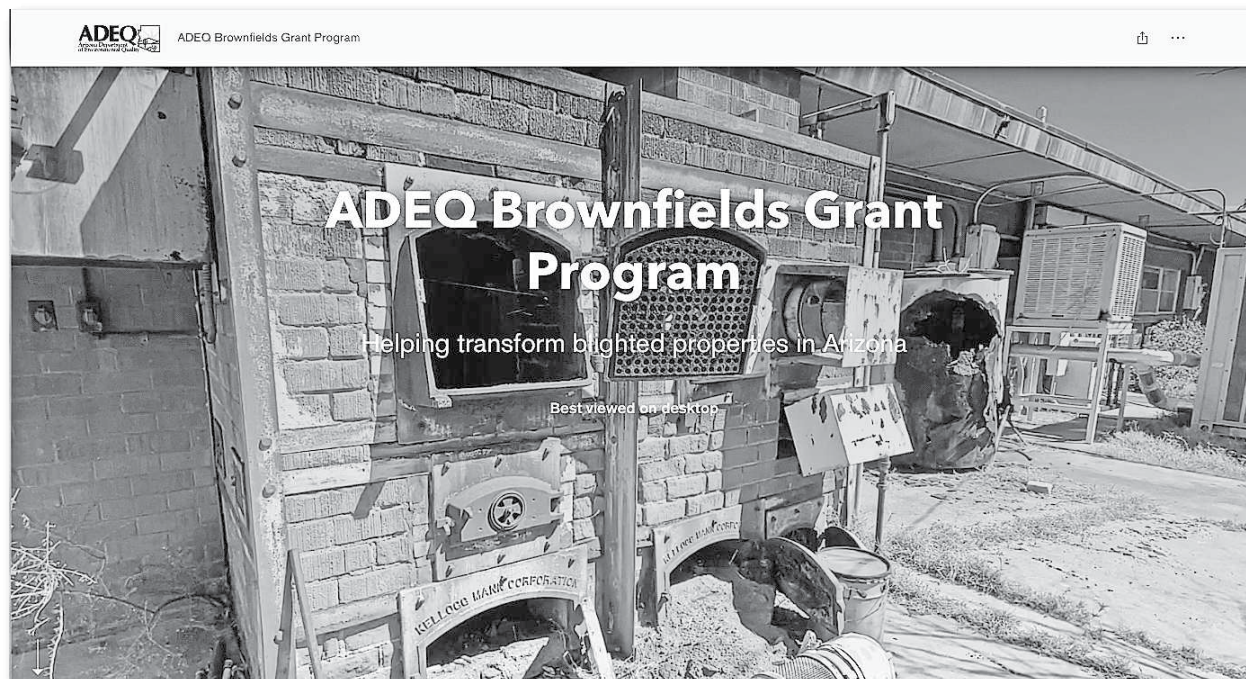
The Central Arizona League Championship Meet was held at the Florence Aquatic Center on July 15. The Sea Lions took home the 3rd place team trophy. Team scores were Coolidge 901, Tucson 846, Sea Lions 681, Florence 618, Globe 522, and Eloy 13.

Several Sea Lions Swimmers earned medals by finishing in the top 3 in their events at the meet. Grayson Downing, Bradley Tafoya, Jordan Doucette, Kori Andrade, Alianna Riney, Colt Nehrmeyer, Jocelyn Hudson, Rexy Simons, Isaac Olson, and Juliana Ramirez all won individual races to become League Champions. ## ADEQ launches Arizona Brownfields Grant StoryMap

Tool shows how millions in brownfields grant investments in Arizona communities are cleaning up blighted properties and reaping public health, environmental and economic benefits

Arizona communities have leveraged brownfields grants to revitalize blighted properties statewide since 2005. Brownfields grants help municipalities and nonprofits identify and reduce environmental hazards, mitigate public health threats, create new business opportunities, increase tax revenues and restore impacted properties to beneficial reuse.

“Brownfields grants are a wonderful avenue for municipalities and nonprofits to address local environmental issues. These projects serve the people

of Arizona by giving good attention and care to these properties that too often become obstacles to a community’s ability to grow,” said Arizona Department of Environmental Quality Director Karen Peters.

To start this year’s grant cycle, the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) introduces its Brownfields Grant Program Online StoryMap (<https://bit.ly/44zAztM>), an ArcGIS tool anyone can use to view and read all the stories behind the brownfields

# Arizona Trail Association receives support from Governor and Legislature

The 2023 Arizona budget includes a historic \$500,000 investment in the Arizona National Scenic Trail. The bipartisan budget shows the dedication of elected officials to support outdoor recreation and conservation efforts.

I am also grateful to the Arizona Trail Association for their stewardship and for understanding that sacred sites must be acknowledged and respected,

and for educating everyone on their website that this trail is on ancestral lands of indigenous people. Our quality of life, history, culture, and public health depend on these important natural resources.”

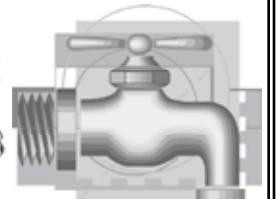

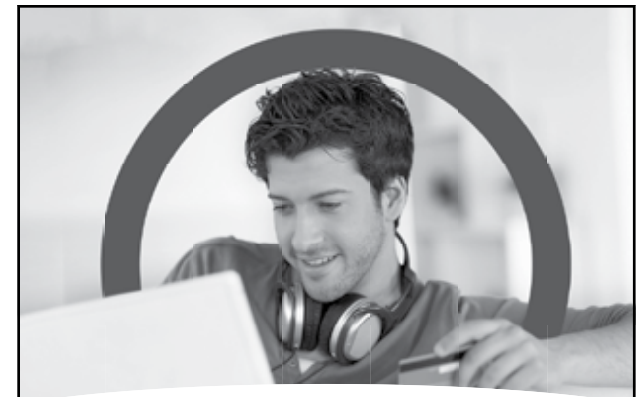

# Keeping your furbabies cool during the heat wave

Summer is in full swing, and with that, temperatures across the country are reaching alarmingly high levels. Here in Arizona, the heat is even more intense.

It's hard to beat the heat even with easy access to air conditioning, icy drinks and refreshing swimming pools. And it can be just as hard for dogs and cats on these sweltering days.

To help pet owners keep their pets cool despite the rising temperatures, Best Friends Animal Society, a leading animal welfare

organization working to end the killing of cats and dogs in America's shelters by 2025, is offering the following tips:

- Exercise dogs during the cooler morning or evening hours, not in the intense afternoon heat.
- Keep pets indoors during the hottest parts of the day. Quick walks and bathroom breaks are fine in extreme heat but try to keep pets in the shade.
- Be aware of the temperature of the sidewalk, asphalt, sand, or even packed dirt as these can

cause burns to your pet's paw pads if they are too hot.

- If pets do spend time outside during the day, ensure that they have access to shade at all hours of the day.
  - Dogs on tethers are especially vulnerable because they could become tangled out of reach of shade or water.
  - Provide pets with fresh, cool water at all times as most dogs won't drink hot water no matter how thirsty they are.
  - Dogs who are older or overweight, have a thick coat or a pushed-in nose are especially at risk of overheating.
  - Dogs with bald patches or minimal coats may need sunscreen. Consult a veterinarian.
  - Never leave your pet in a parked car when the outside temperature is above 70 degrees. Many studies show that the temperature inside a car on a 70 -degree day can rise to 89 degrees in ten minutes, and to 104 degrees in as little as a half hour. Dogs and cats can't sweat like humans, so they pant to lower their body temperature. If they're inside a car, recycling hot air, panting gives no relief, and heat stroke can occur quickly.
- "Heat stroke can occur when an animal's temperature rises to a critical level," says Dr. Erin Katribe, Medical Director, Best Friends Animal Society. "Normal body temperatures for dogs and cats range from 100 to 102.5 degrees. When a dog's temperature rises to 108 degrees, or to 106 degrees for a cat,

they can suffer irreparable organ damage or worse."

According to Dr. Katribe, signs of heat stroke include heavy panting that does not resolve as the pet rests, increasing distress, a tongue color that is dark red to almost purple, weakness or collapse, hyper-salivation, vomiting and labored breathing.

If you suspect a dog or cat is suffering from heat stroke move him to a cooler environment immediately and apply cool water to the abdomen, ears, and footpads. Once they are stable, bring them to a veterinary clinic as quickly as possible. Katribe warns, things may be happening internally that are not obvious from the outside.

# APS record shattered: Customers' energy use sets new peak twice in two days

After 17 straight days of temperatures at or above 110 degrees and air conditioners cranking to keep Arizonans cool, Arizona Public Service (APS) customers demand reached 8,191 megawatts (MW) on Saturday, July 15. That set the peak for the most electricity used at once in APS history.

“APS is ranked as one of the most reliable electric utilities in the country, and during this heatwave when customers need us the most, we deliver with dependable, around-the-clock electricity,” said Ted Geisler, APS President. “I’m very proud of the entire APS team – from the planners who start strategizing years in advance to our operators, customer care team and field crews who showed up during extreme conditions for Arizonans and met their record-breaking demand for power.”

APS customers first made history Friday, July 14, shattering the previous energy demand record, set in 2020. APS Vice President of Resource Management Justin Joiner said multiple factors contribute to increases in electricity use, including temperatures, humidity and more people and businesses moving to Arizona.

“On days when the temperature is sweltering, we take an all-of-the-above approach. We’re using all the tools in our toolbox— from solar power to natural gas— to make sure customers can count on us for electricity every second of the day,” said Joiner. “Our power plants are running smoothly, and the energy supply is robust. That’s what proactive, year-round planning looks like.”

Here’s a look at the numbers:

- APS’s prior all-time record was 7,660 MW set on July 30, 2020.
- On Friday, July 14, customers

surpassed the record, using 7,798 MW of energy.

- Friday’s record was broken Saturday, July 15, with 8,191 MW of energy consumed at once, resulting in the highest amount of combined energy use in APS history.

- Sunday, July 16, customers’ peak energy demand was 7,962 MW, well above the peak set in 2020, and above Friday’s peak, but not enough to break the new all-time peak set Saturday.

How APS Maintains Power Supply  
APS plans years in advance to continue serving customers with reliable and affordable energy. Resource planners secure a diverse energy mix to meet demand, like solar and wind power, battery energy storage and the APS-operated Palo Verde Generating Station, the largest nuclear power plant in the U.S. and the country’s largest producer of clean energy. When temperatures cause demand to increase, APS’s strength and resilience comes from utilizing flexible resources like natural gas to keep homes and businesses cool over long stretches of extreme heat temperatures.

Each year APS invests more than \$1.5 billion to maintain and upgrade the grid, replacing aging electrical equipment and installing new technology. APS crews maintain more than 38,000 miles of power lines and use advanced smart technology as well as drones and robots to detect potential issues with equipment before they cause problems. Customer Tips as Summer Heat Continues

APS customers typically use the most power between the hours of 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. While APS is well prepared to deliver the energy customers need as summer continues, conserving power



during peak hours of the day can help customers reduce energy bills while supporting grid reliability.

For those on APS time-of-use plans, (Time-of-Use 4 p.m.-7 p.m. Weekdays and Time-of-Use 4 p.m.-7 p.m. Weekdays with Demand Charge), try pre-cooling your home. Set your thermostat a few degrees lower than normal before 4 p.m. and then set it a few degrees higher than normal during the on-peak period of 4 p.m. to 7 p.m.

Service your air conditioner annually to ensure it runs efficiently and change air filters monthly.

Think 1, 2, 3 and turn your thermostat up a few degrees. For every one degree you raise your thermostat, you can save 2-3% on energy cooling costs. (When on vacation, turn it up more.)

Use a smart thermostat to “set it and

forget it.” We offer special rebates and discounts on the APS Marketplace.

Close curtains and blinds during the day.

Use fans to feel up to 5 degrees cooler. Set ceiling fans to run counterclockwise and remember fans cool people, not rooms, so turn off when you leave.

Earn bill credits. Join APS Cool Rewards (residential) or APS Peak Solutions (business) – programs that reward customers for conserving energy during times when usage is highest.

Switch to LED lighting. LED bulbs emit 90 percent less heat than traditional incandescent bulbs.

Limit oven use; when possible, use the microwave, toaster oven or outdoor grill instead.

Stay informed. Use the APS mobile app

transformations we helped make happen. This GIS-driven tool was created and launched primarily by two ADEQ interns.

With just a click and a scroll, anyone can see photos and read stories about historic structures and main streets redeveloped to boost tourism and community services, new greenspaces created, and health care facilities added where they are most needed.

“Arizona’s brownfields grants help create opportunities for our communities that weren’t there before,” said ADEQ Brownfields Coordinator Travis Barnum. “When a blighted site is cleaned up, it’s a boon to local families and businesses, and with this online story map, you can see

their inspiring stories all in one place.”

In fiscal year 2023, ADEQ awarded \$1,275,000 in brownfields grants to support 17 projects to assess and clean up brownfields sites, including two in the Copper Corridor:

- Globe, AZ: The City of Globe took ownership of a defunct commercial space that struggled to keep tenants after the anchor business moved to a new location. The City of Globe approved a reuse plan for the site as a new firehouse station. Before the existing structure could be demolished, the building materials needed to be cleared of asbestos containing materials. ADEQ awarded the City of Globe \$52,000 to remove the asbestos from the building

to make way for the new fire station.

- Superior, AZ: The Town of Superior acquired the historical Superior High School which is being renovated into a new Town Hall as well as a campus for job training, entrepreneurial support and co-working, featuring library services, a senior center, community recreation, and more. Our \$155,000 grant covered the cost of safely removing asbestos from the former high school, allowing renovations to go forward.

ADEQ both administers a state-level brownfields assistance program to provide brownfields grant funds and helps municipal and nonprofit applicants prepare successful federal grant applications.
