

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Governor Ducey orders some business closures and postpones back to school

Within weeks of the end of Arizona Governor Doug Ducey's Stay at Home order in May, the State of Arizona experienced a rapid increase of COVID-19 cases. The increase in positive cases has thrust Arizona into the national headlines for the State's inability to get the virus under control. The Governor issued these new executive orders to help flatten the curve of the virus growth. He also highly recommended that Arizonan's wear masks, but did not mandate a statewide mask requirement.

Governor Ducey's order mandated bars, gyms, tubing and water parks closed for 30 days. The order also called for the cancellation of any events with over 50 people in attendance and limits the use of private pools to less than 10 people. Bars with Class 6 or 7 liquor licenses may continue to sell alcoholic beverages to go. The Governor also announced that

in-person attendance at schools must be pushed back to Aug. 17, 2020. Schools may start with an online class format, but cannot allow in person classes. Copper Area News will be working on a comprehensive story on how local school districts are working through these new timelines.

Public and private events with more than •

50 people are ordered to be cancelled or postponed; some accommodations can be allowed if physical distancing can be assured. The State Liquor Board will not be issuing any special event liquor licenses during these next 30 days. County health officials and the local jurisdictions will be required to enforce these orders.

Due to the ongoing surging growth of the COVID-19 Pandemic, the State of Arizona is also offering \$10,000 grants to nursing homes and long term care facilities to allow residents of those facilities to visit with their friends and family in a virtual format.

At press time, the Town of Superior has announced that its laser light show for the Fourth of July has been postponed and they will be closing the local swimming pool.

County offers financial relief to businesses in unincorporated Pinal affected by COVID-19; Rios urges businesses to apply

The Business Sustainability Program is a one-time reimbursement of up to \$15,000 to qualifying businesses for rent, mortgage and/or utilities expenses for a three-month period. Qualifying expense periods are either March-April-May 2020 or April-May-June 2020. Applications will be accepted from June 15 - July 15, 2020. Funding will be awarded on a first come first served basis to qualifying small businesses in unincorporated areas of Pinal County, so applicants are encouraged to apply early.

"I encourage all eligible businesses to apply for this funding opportunity. Times are hard and I understand that COVID-19 has seriously impacted many small businesses. Please take advantage of this grant and apply soon," said Supervisor Pete Rios.

To qualify, applicants must be a forprofit business, located at a physical, commercial address in an unincorporated area of Pinal County. Individual Arizona franchised businesses may qualify if the applicant location is within unincorporated Pinal County and the individual franchise location is not owned by a national chain or out-of-state corporation. At this time, non-profit organizations and home-based businesses are not eligible. Applicants

Strong social connections key to supporting families

As Arizona's early childhood agency, First Things First (FTF) recognizes that babies, toddlers and preschoolers need positive interactions with adults for healthy development. It's equally important that their parents and caregivers have positive connections in their community to help them face the challenges of parenting.

During these times of social distancing, FTF, along with community partners remind families that there are ways to reach out and find places to make these social connections - for example, within local communities of faith, online support groups and local health providers. Social connections that provide emotional support to parents is one of five protective factors that families are encouraged to develop as a way to mitigate or eliminate stress more effectively. The other four are parenting skills, concrete support through meeting basic economic needs like food and shelter, resilience (ability to manage and bounce back from challenges) and social and emotional competence in children.

"Having someone to reach out to is important when you're stressed and searching for support," said Sandy LaCava, community development manager at Southwest Human Development, which runs the Birth to Five Helpline, a statewide helpline that is partially funded by FTF.

The helpline is a free service for all Arizona parents or caregivers to call, text or email with questions about their young child's development. The helpline can also offer families connections to local resources and supports.

Before the coronavirus pandemic hit, the helpline had started meeting with parents to answer questions over online video chat.

"The specialists are able see mom or dad face-toface," LaCava said. "It's an opportunity to enhance that support."

Aside from help from early childhood experts, families can seek out social connections in a variety of ways. Immediate family can provide the support in home, or reaching out to non-immediate family, friends and neighbors through the use of video chat programs such as FaceTime, Zoom and Skype.

Support can also be found in communities with local organizations such as the Community Actions Human

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Resources Agency (CAHRA), a non-profit agency that provides Pinal County with services such as a food pantry and weatherization improvements for homes.

CAHRA understands that the overall health and wellbeing of the entire family impacts a child's ability to be ready for school and set for life. With this in mind, CAHRA provides services that benefit everyone in the home, knowing that work will deeply impact that home's youngest members, said CAHRA Executive Director Mary Lou Rosales.

"We know that children that have regular healthy meals do better in school," Rosales said. "The Food Pantry's goal is to provide those healthy foods. Weatherization benefits can also be felt by the cooler air in the home environment. Children and other household members feel better with cool air in the summer and warm air in the winter."

During this time, CAHRA has seen a dramatic uptick in the needs of Pinal County families. According to Rosales, the agency has seen a 51% increase in families asking for food donations and as the weather gets warmer, more






