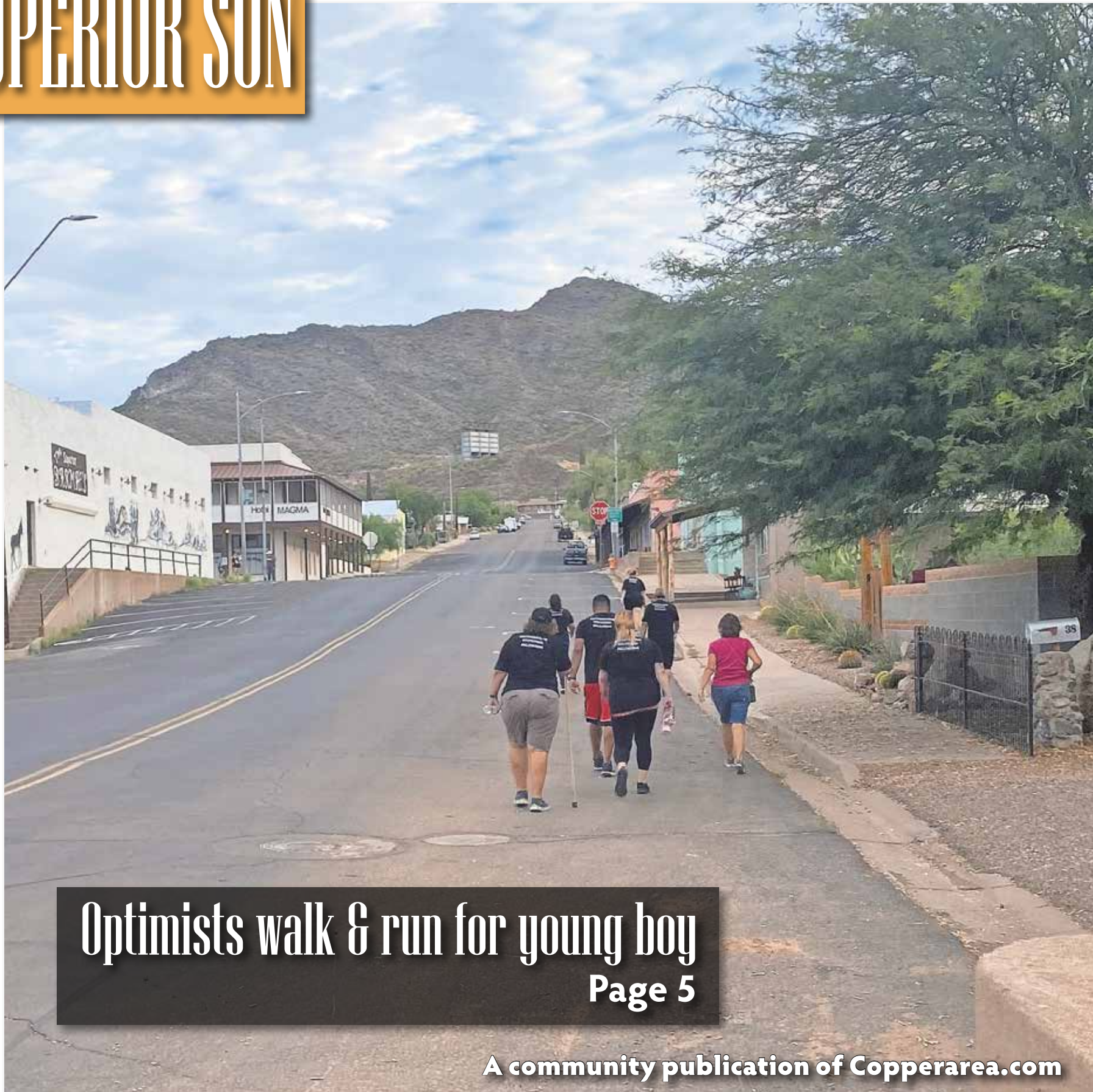


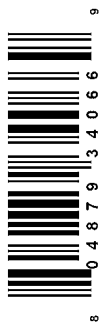

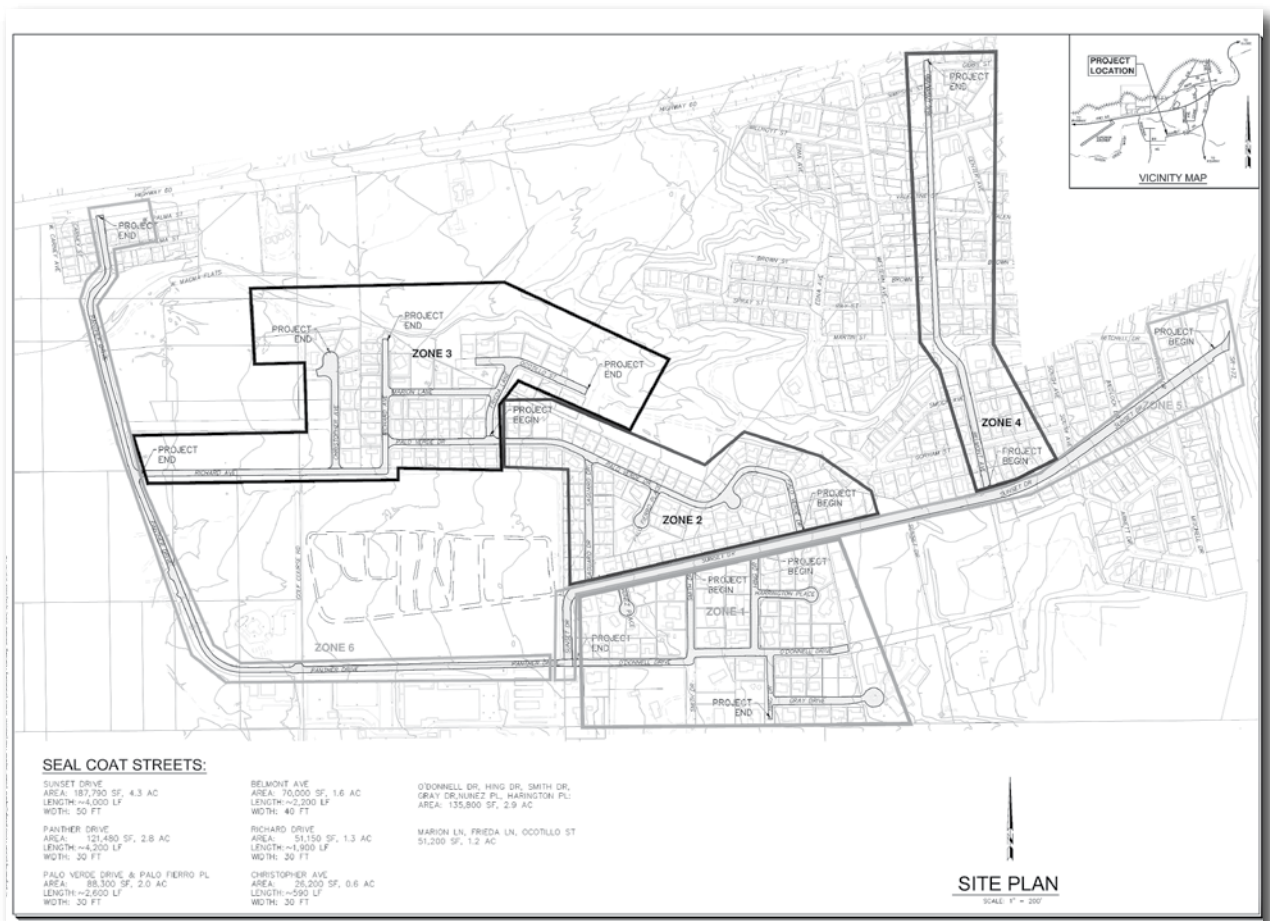

Town of Superior to complete south side roadwork

The Town of Superior will complete street maintenance on the south end of town over the next month. This will include using a seal coating product to limit the water penetrating the pavement to reduce potholes and extend pavement life. This has been used extensively on the north end of town with excellent results.

The work will be completed from July 19, 2022, through Aug. 19, 2022, from 4 a.m. to noon, Monday through Friday, but will be done by the zones in the attached map. Work will be early in the morning to avoid the heat, but the equipment is not loud and should not cause any undue disturbance. Letters will be dropped off at affected households in each zone the week before work starts. Please **DO NOT** park your cars on the road in that zone from 4 a.m. to noon until the project is complete.

VOTERS BE AWARE: Pinal County Election human error affects Superior Mayor and Council elections

Earlier this month, Pinal County Election officials were notified that several municipal elections were left off the ballots of the Permanent Early Voters List (PEVL) early ballots. Pinal County determined and announced via a press release that it was a human error, but did not elaborate exactly on how this human error happened. Last week, Pinal County confirmed the process for voters in the seven communities affected by the ballot issues. Superior was affected along with Mammoth, Apache Junction, Casa Grande, Eloy, Maricopa and Queen Creek.

All registered voters in the Superior municipal town limits will be mailed a supplemental ballot with only the mayor and council election candidates, these ballots are expected to be mailed out by Friday, July

15. Voters should mail those ballots back or drop them off at one of the County Recorder ballot drops boxes which are listed below.

Voters in Superior will need to vote for the Mayor and three council seats Mayor Mila Besich is running un-opposed. There are four candidates running for three council seats: incumbent candidates Vice Mayor Michael Alonzo and Councilmember Gilbert Aguilar are seeking re-election and their names will be on the ballot. Amy Byrd and Elizabeth Magallanez are running as write-ins. Voters will need to write in their names on the designated place on the supplemental ballots. Byrd and Magallanez did not complete candidacy paperwork prior to the ballot deadline, both met State election requirements to be write-in candidates for the Superior Town Council election.

Voters who received an early ballot with the Federal, State and County elections should fill out their original ballot and return it before July 26, 2022. Voters who vote in person on election day should go to the designated polling location in Superior (Saint Mary's Center) to cast their votes for the Federal, State and County elections and mail in their supplemental ballot for the municipal ballot before July 26. You may also drop off your supplemental (municipal election ballot) or early voting ballot at one of the locations listed below if you chose not to mail in the ballots.

If a voter spoils their supplemental or their original primary election ballot, please contact the Pinal County Early Voting office at 520-509-3555 to request a replacement. If a ballot is spoiled after a mail in ballot

deadline you will be able to visit the supplemental ballot replacement location at the Superior Town Hall located at 199 Lobb Avenue. The location will be open on election day Tuesday, Aug. 2, 2022, from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Voters requiring more information about their ballot or voting procedures should contact the Pinal County Citizen Contact Center at 520-509-3555 or email at communications@pinal.gov.

Where can I return my ballots in person:

While there is not a specific location in Mammoth to drop off your early ballot, these are the other county wide ballot drop boxes are available 24 hours a day until 7 p.m. on August 2, at:

Board of Supervisors approve solution to early ballot errors

At a Special Board of Supervisors Meeting on Tuesday afternoon, the Board approved a definitive solution to the errors found on early voting ballots that left city and town contests off the ballots in seven Pinal County Municipalities: Apache Junction, Casa Grande, Eloy, Mammoth, Maricopa, Queen Creek and Superior.

* Please note that Maricopa County voters in Apache Junction and Queen Creek are not affected. All other cities and towns are not impacted, and voters should continue to vote as normal.

Voters who had requested an early ballot in the above cities and towns will now be sent a Municipal Only ballot, which they will need to complete and return if they wish to vote in their city or town election. Early voters should complete and

return their original early voting ballot for Federal, State, Legislative, and County races if they wish to vote in these contests.

Any voter who has already voted or has returned their early voting ballot will also need to complete the municipal ballot to vote in city and town contests. Municipal contests on the original ballots in the seven impacted cities and towns will be invalid and will not be counted. Your votes in Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests will be processed as normal.

In addition, there will be in-person voting at polling sites on Election Day for Municipal contests in the seven impacted cities and towns. These will be voted on a separate ballot to Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests.

If you live in Unincorporated Pinal

County and see a city or town contest on your ballot, you can complete Federal, State, Legislative and County contests on your ballot and return it as normal. The city/town contests on your ballot will be invalid and not be counted if voted.

This afternoon's meeting is viewable below. Elections Director David Frisk addressed the Board of Supervisors and explained that he took full responsibility, that errors were human in nature, and had nothing to do with the statewide voter registration database, referred to as AVID, or any other equipment. Vice-Chairman Jeff Serdy gave city and town representatives, candidates in city and town contests, and members of the audience the opportunity to address the Board and to ask questions.

Pinal County leadership would again like to take this opportunity to express regret over the situation that has been caused by these errors and wishes to reassure voters that we will work diligently to ensure the Election runs as smoothly as possible from this point onwards with full integrity and transparency.

What this Means to Pinal County Voters

- If you requested an early ballot in the impacted cities or towns, you will now be sent a Municipal-Only Ballot.
- If you have already returned your early voting ballot, you will still receive and need to complete the Municipal-Only Ballot if you wish to vote in your city or town contest.

Ellie has been serving the Copper Corridor as a Judicial

Ellie was just recently hired part-time as the Presiding Magistrate Judge for the Town of Superior. Her duties begin in July 2022.

Court proceedings mostly pertain to warrants, pretrials, trials, in custody/jail and other proceedings due to motions filed before the court.

Ellie’s community service includes being on several Board of Directors serving as Chair, Secretary or member – this includes Oracle Community Center, Sun Life Health, Oracle Fire District, OWN Oracle network and St. Helen Catholic Parish. This doesn’t include her 40 years + of volunteer service and dedication to the community.

Ellie is married to Steve Brown and they have a blended family of three grown children, three granddaughters and pets. She holds a master’s degree in educational leadership, a bachelor of science degree in administration and management, a Certification of Public Management, completion of the Arizona Supreme Court Orientation and countless hours of court operating judicial educational training. Ellie was born and raised within the Copper Corridor, Precinct 5.

“As a Justice of the Peace, I make decisions that impact everyday life and it is important that people know that I have the diverse life and work skills, empathy, years of experience in the judicial process and higher education that qualifies me to represent and be their elected Justice of the Peace. - You should complete and return your original early voting ballot for Federal, State, Legislative, and County races if you wish to vote in these contests.
- Municipal contests on the original early voting ballots in the seven impacted cities and towns will be invalid and will not be counted. *ONLY votes in Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests on the original early voting ballots will be registered.
- If you voted in-person at an early voting site and reside in one of the impacted cities or towns, you will need to either return to a voting site to vote your municipal-only ballot or contact early voting on 520-509-3555 and request a municipal-only ballot be mailed to you.
- There will be in-person voting at sites on Election Day for Municipal contests in the seven impacted cities and towns. In the impacted areas, you will be given TWO separate ballots: one for city and town contests and one for Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests.
- If you live in Unincorporated Pinal County and see a city or town contest on your ballot, you can complete Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests on your ballot and return it as normal. *The city/town contests on your ballot will be invalid and not be counted if voted.

AN ORDINANCE LEVYING UPON THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF THE PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN OF SUPERIOR ARIZONA, SUBJECT TO TAXATION A CERTAIN SUM UPON EACH ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) OF ASSESSED VALUATION SUFFICIENT TO RAISE THE AMOUNT ESTIMATED TO BE REQUIRED IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET, LESS THE AMOUNT ESTIMATED TO BE RECEIVED FROM OTHER SOURCES OF REVENUE; PROVIDING FUNDS FOR GENERAL MUNICIPAL EXPENSES, ALL FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING THE 30TH DAY OF JUNE 2023.

WHEREAS, by the provisions of State law, the ordinance levying taxes for fiscal year 2022-2023 is required to be finally adopted not later than the third Monday in August 2022.

WHEREAS, the County of Pinal is the assessing and collecting authority for the Town of Superior, the Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the County Assessor and the Board of Supervisors of the County of Pinal, Arizona.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona, as follows:

SECTION 1: There is hereby levied on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of the assessed value of all property, both real and personal within the corporate limits of the Town of Superior, except such property as may be by law exempt from taxation, a primary property tax rate of \$5.6914 for the fiscal year ending on the 30th day of June, 2023. If this tax rate exceeds the maximum levy allowed by law, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Pinal is hereby authorized to reduce the levy to the maximum allowable by law after providing notice to the Town.

SECTION 2: It is the intent of the Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona to levy the primary property tax for operations for the Town of Superior for fiscal year 2022- 2023 will equal \$ 633,827.00 dollars.

SECTION 4: Failure by the County officials of Pinal County, Arizona, to properly return the delinquent list, any irregularity in assessments or omissions in the same, or any irregularity in any proceedings shall not invalidate such proceedings or invalidate any title conveyed by any tax deed; failure or neglect of any officer or officers to timely perform any of the duties assigned to him or to them shall not invalidate any proceedings or any deed or sale pursuant thereto, the validity of the assessment or levy of taxes or of the judgment of sale by which the collection of the same may be enforced shall not affect the lien of the Town of Superior upon such property for the delinquent taxes unpaid thereon; overcharge as to part of the taxes or of costs shall not invalidate any proceedings for the collection of taxes or the foreclosure of the lien thereon or a sale of the property under such foreclosure; and all acts of officers de facto shall be valid as if performed by officers de jure.

SECTION 5: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

Errors were identified on early voting ballots that have impacted city and town contests in seven municipalities which includes Superior

plus Casa Grande, Eloy, Mammoth, Maricopa, and the Apache Junction and Queen Creek portion of Pinal County

How are you impacted?

- If you received an early ballot, you will now be sent a municipal-only ballot that you must use to vote in your city or town contests. You should complete the Federal, State, Legislative, and County contests on your original ballot and return it by August 2, 2022.
- If you voted in person at an early vote site, you will need to return to any early vote center before July 29, 2022, to complete a municipal-only ballot to vote in your city or town contests.
- If you plan on voting on Election Day (August 2, 2022), you will vote your city or town contests on a separate municipal-only ballot at your Polling Site.
