COVID-19 takes the life of community leader Roy Chavez

The COVID-19 Pandemic has not discriminated, and it has taken its toll on the entire Copper Corridor and as Arizona continues to be a hotspot, Superior has realized its fifth death due to COVID-19.

While the death of the beloved and longtime Hayden-Winkelman teacher, Kimberly Chavez-Lopez-Byrd made national headlines, her brother Roy Chavez was fighting COVID-19 in a Valley hospital. On the afternoon of Friday, July 17, 2020 Roy "Potts" Chavez lost his battle with this raging, savage, virus.

Roy devoted his life to community service. The lists of boards and commissions he served on throughout his life were numerous, not to mention times he pitched in to help coach parks and recreation programs. He was elected as a Town Councilmember, Mayor and was hired as the Town Manager in Superior. He was the first Mayor to be directly elected by the voters of Superior. During his career as an elected and staff person, he helped to lead a variety of new ideas for community improvements such as the Queen Creek Riparian Restoration plan and downtown amphitheater, plans that are being brought

into fruition today. He was a founding member of the Superior Optimist Club, served as President of the Superior Chamber of Commerce and Superior Rotary Club. He helped to breath life into Superior during the 1980s and 1990s when things were much more dire for the community.

Later in his career, he became an advocate for Saving Oak Flats, serving with the "Concerned Citizens and Retired Miners" group. His oftentimes controversial position against Resolution Copper brought to light some of the inequities of the 1872 Mining Law and the potential for environmental destruction of the project. His voice was heard at the local and state levels but his voice and advocacy were also heard in the national and international news.

His voice carried with a booming, jovial tone and he was often the community Master of Ceremonies for parades, an announcer for hundreds of sporting events and the prompter of the oohs and ahhs of fireworks shows for decades. While he was a fighter for what he believed in, he brought joy to people's lives through his work as a

DJ and bar owner. He was a friend many could call on and, in his time of need, his friends rallied for him. His ability to assist with golf tournaments raised hundreds of thousands of dollars throughout his life.

He was also a teacher; he served as substitute teacher in San Carlos prior to his death and over the years also worked for the Superior and Hayden-Winkelman school districts. He was the father to Josh and Andrea Cruz, a brother, a friend and community leader who truly never stopped caring for his community of Superior. He also taught the value of community service to others, and many will tell stories of the times Roy called on them to "help" with community projects or how he inspired them to "get involved"

This is just a glimpse into the life of Roy Chavez, taken from our archives and our memories at the *Copper Area News*. He will be missed by everyone who knew him. Our communities are better because of him, even if we all did not agree with every position he took. Our team at *Copper Area News* mourns with his friends and family.

Copper Corridor businesses receive over \$4.2 million in Federal PPP loans

While headlines across the nation focussed on the very large businesses such as Ruth Chris Steakhouse, AutoNation and other large corporations who received Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans, businesses across the Copper Corridor also received some of this much needed funding. The Copper Corridor region received roughly \$4.2 million dollars from 136 loans that were less than \$150,000. In addition to these loans, 19 loans were awarded that over \$150,000 but exact amounts were not listed. The combined loans programs saved approximately 1,159 jobs in total.

The PPP program was designed to help companies with fewer than 500 employees maintain their payrolls and cover expenses for two months such as rent and utilities. These PPP loans will convert into grants and not have to be paid back if the businesses maintain their payrolls and keep their businesses operating.

In addition to these federal programs, Pinal County also offered a Business Assistance Support Grant to businesses in unincorporated Pinal County. The Town of Superior also issued \$97,000 to 21 small businesses operating in Superior. Both Pinal County and the Town of Superior used their CARES funding, which was granted from the State of the Arizona allocation of CARES funding that was

released by Governor Doug Ducey, to create their grant programs. The Town of Superior utilized the services of Local First Arizona to manage the grant applications and make the awards. Pinal County filed a lawsuit against Governor Ducey to release the CARES funding to communities and counties that did not receive a direct allocation of CARES funding. Cities and counties with populations over 500,000 received direct allocations of CARES funding from the Federal Government. The smaller cities and counties in Arizona had to wait for the Governor to release funding to the smaller counties and cities.

The federal programs were a life saver for the Boyce Thompson Arboretum. The funding allowed the park to remain open and retain their staff. The ongoing watering and maintenance of the plants at the Arboretum is not a task that could be left undone. The funding helped to keep the Arboretum growing and also ensured that guests to the park had a safe place to participate in physically distant recreation. The federal applications were challenging for many businesses and several called upon the help of Senator Kristen Sinema's office to help move the process along.

Businesses in Globe were the largest recipients, saving 736 jobs and \$2.6 million in loans under \$150K. The only town that did not have any businesses receive any PPP funding was Hayden. The business types varied from non-profits, LLCs and corporations.

MSM PK-12 School offers blended learning due to COVID-19

It is nearly that time of year again – the time when kids head back to school (and parents dance their happy dance of freedom).

This year, though, school is likely to look a whole lot different than it did in years past.

With the COVID-19 pandemic still active in Arizona and cases seemingly still on the rise, Governor Doug Ducey issued an executive order that schools not open for face-to-face instruction until Aug. 17.

Mammoth-San Manuel PK-12 School has made some changes to its procedures to accommodate this later start date and the recommended safety protocols for preventing the spread of COVID-19.

Registration packets including a form for preferred learning choice, device needs, bus preferences and more have gone out to families whose children attend school in San Manuel. The forms are due back to the school by Friday,

July 24, either by dropping them off at the school in the “book house” in front of the school or emailing them to Nancy Davis at davisnc@msmusd.org. The school will also be providing a bus to pick up the forms. (See the schedule below.)

This year, parents have the choice of two options for schooling their children: An all online learning experience; and A blended learning experience where students would be at school in person two days a week in combination with online learning at home.

For the blended learning option, students will be assigned to an “A” or “B” schedule to prevent all students being on campus at the same time and promote social distancing. For families with more than one child, parents can request that all children be on the same schedule.

School officials caution parents that the

After four years I was honorably discharged and began my Law enforcement career with the Department of Corrections. I worked shift work and was subject to mandatory hold overs when we were short staff. I again was honored to serve alongside dedicated Correction Officers. This was my first opportunity to observe the criminal justice system and how it operated. The pay was a little better than the military and I am thankful for the experience.

In 1994 I began my career as a Peace Officer as a Patrol Deputy in District One Pinal County. I worked graveyard shift for the first year of my career. The starting pay was around \$ 13,00 an hour. I was promoted a total of four times in my career. On my spare time I was able to obtain my degree using my own money to pay for classes. My pay raises mainly came from promotions as I did not rely on my opponent who was on the board at the time for pay raises.

Throughout my career I was subject to call outs on nights, weekends, and holidays. I spent many hours away from my family while my opponent slept comfortably in his bed. Throughout my 31 years of public service there were times when my personal safety was at risk. What personal risk has my opponent ever taken? Yet he attacks me for drawing a retirement that I have worked hard for my entire career. Does my opponent feel this way about the hundreds of Arizona Peace Officers and Corrections Officers that have loyally served and earned a retirement?

My opponent sleeps in his three-bedroom house in Apache Junction, which is District five. He does not even respect voters enough in District one, where he is elected to represent.

I have defended our country and protected our communities for 31 years. I will accept the will of the people on the August 4th primary. I will not let attacks on why I have chosen to serve, and my record of service go unanswered.

The First Postmasters of the Copper Corridor

In the more than two centuries since Benjamin Franklin was appointed the country's first Postmaster General in 1775, the United States Post Office has grown and changed with America. The Copper Corridor's history with the institution doesn't go that far back in history, but is linked with the history of the state of Arizona.

Copper Area News wanted to share some of that rich history, exploring the names of the first Postmasters of our region. Over the next several weeks, join us on a journey to meet those first civil servants and perhaps gains some Historical Perspective.

ORACLE AREA

Manlyville was located on what is the Willow Springs Ranch. Joseph Chamberlin established the ranch in 1880. The post office would be

established on April 18, 1881. It was named Manlyville after Joseph Chamberlin's son Manly. Manly Chamberlin was the first Postmaster. Manlyville was also a stage stop between Tucson and Riverside. The post office would be discontinued in 1888.

American Flag – Isaac Lorraine discovered and developed the American Flag Mine in the 1870s. Around 1877, he built a house which served as his residence and headquarters for his mining and ranching operations. The population around his mining camp and other nearby mines and ranches warranted a post office. On Dec. 28, 1880 the post office was established at American Flag and the house served as the first post office in the district. Peter H. Loss was the Postmaster. The post

office was discontinued in 1890 and the mail service moved to Oracle. It is believed that the American Flag Ranch building is the oldest Arizona territorial post office still standing.

The Oracle post office was established on Dec. 28, 1880. James Branson was the Postmaster. It would be discontinued in 1883 and reestablished in January 1885 with Edwin Dodge as the Postmaster.

SAN MANUEL

San Manuel is a former mining town built in 1953 - 54 for the Magma Mining Company. The builders were Del E. Webb Construction Company and M.O.W. Homes Inc. In April 1954, Joe Cittadini was appointed Postmaster. Joe was from Ray-Sonora where he owned El Charro restaurant and bar in Sonora and was the acting

Postmaster there. He served as an aircraft mechanic with the Air Force in the Pacific during World War II.

in northern Arizona. It is about 26 miles north east of Kingman on State Route 66. The area that became Valentine was first known as Truxton named after a railroad siding that became a small town with a post office. The town grew around the railroad station and the Truxton Canyon Training School which served as the school for the nearby members of the Hualapai Indian

tribe, located within the Indian Agency. It was also a boarding school for other tribes in Arizona.

In 1910, the Truxton post office, town and the school were renamed Valentine, not after St. Valentine but after Charles Gordon Valentine, the new Commissioner of Indian Affairs. C.G. Valentine was 36 years old, a native of Massachusetts and a graduate of Harvard when appointed as Commissioner. He served from 1909 until 1912.

In its heyday, Valentine would have a population of a couple of hundred residents. It was a small tourist stop on Route 66 before the I-40 section bypassed it. It would become known for its heart shaped postal stamp and Valentine, Arizona cancellation postmark in February as visitors would flock to the post office and thousands

of people from all over the country and from overseas would mail their valentines to Valentine to be post marked. It is believed that the tradition began in the 1940s and its popularity grew over the years promoted by the post mistresses.

On Aug. 15, 1990, tragedy struck that would be the end of the Valentine Post Office. The contract post office was being operated by Jacqueline Ann Grigg and her sister-in-law Sheli for the past 11 years. On this day Jacqueline was murdered during a robbery. She was shot while sitting in a chair knitting. The murderer got away with \$40 cash and \$800 in worthless money orders that had not been validated. He was arrested two days afterwards in California. He was sentenced to Life in prison. She was survived by her husband, Fred and three children.

Soon after her death, her broken-hearted, widowed husband dismantled the building used as the post office and left town. This ended the tradition of thousands of people sending their valentines or visiting the post office for its heart shaped Valentine's Day postmark from Valentine, Arizona.

The Valentine postal stamp is now at the

Kingman, Arizona post office. If requested they will stamp your letter with the cupid heart that says Valentine, Arizona and its zip code although it

is postmarked Kingman. They get some requests, but not like in the days of the Valentine post office when tourists flocked to town in February and they

processed more mail than at Christmas.

Valentine is virtually a ghost town these days with fewer than 40 residents reported in the last census.

Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. We post a daily update on our Facebook page with the total positive COVID-19 Data. This graph shows the daily counts of positive cases for the past week as of press time on July 21, 2020.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.
5. You can follow other data such as ICU bed use, Ventilator use and hospital capacity online: <https://bit.ly/3inh280>

that fall sports are set to begin Aug. 17, but parents and athletes are encouraged to check with the athletic office and social media as that date approaches because the situation is ever changing. “As long as the AIA and CJHL have athletics in 2020-21, so will we,” Lovato wrote in a letter to parents.

Protocols and procedures will be in place and will be shared at a later date.

Lovato noted that students who do not attend in-person classes, once offered, will not be able to participate in extracurricular activities including sports if the choice

is made for any reason other than safety.

One change to policy for this year is that due to social distancing, the school is no longer accepting cash payments for athletic fees or clearance packets. All documentation has to be submitted through the website: registermyathlete.com (RMA). Three payment options are available: personal check; debit/credit card (option offered through the Athletic Office); and online payment through RMA.

Sports fees are \$40 per sport (\$240 family cap). No refunds will be given after the first

competition of the season. Fall sports offered this year include: football (JH/HS), volleyball (JH/HS), cheer (JH/HS) and swimming (HS).

Firefighting helicopter



The San Manuel Airport served as a staging area for aerial firefighters during the Horse Fire late last week. The Horse Fire, on BLM land north of Aravaipa Canyon, grew to 228 acres by the time fire crews arrived Thursday afternoon to begin suppression. Aided by aerial retardant and water drops, the fire's forward movement was stopped by evening when nighttime thunderstorms drenched the fire. Resources remained at the fire through the night and by Friday morning had achieved 50% containment. An element of rappellers remained throughout the day Friday before being removed by the end of the day. Resources will monitor the remote fire scar over the next several days to insure it remains secure. Today many resources are being reassigned to other incidents or returned to their home units to repair and replace materials, rest, and prepare for their next assignments. The above pictured helicopter is a C-47 Chinook. It spent its former life in the US Army and is based out of California. Crew includes two pilots and, depending on the mission, a crew chief and a couple of others. Its previous mission was the Bighorn Fire.
