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# Medical Marijuana Dispensary Group talks to Mammoth Town Council

At the Mammoth Town Council meeting held on Thurs. July 18, Ram Narasimhan of NCS, an engineering company, gave an update on the water project. The Town of Mammoth is looking on improving the quality of their drinking water and looking for water sources for future growth. The town has been looking at blended water, reverse osmosis systems and the options of drilling new wells or purchasing existing wells from private entities. The best and

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improving water quality seemed to be reverse osmosis. Purchasing an existing well after testing the water was said to be cheaper than drilling new wells. Preliminary testing on some privately owned wells has been done with good results. Further testing at higher pumping rates will need to be completed before they can determine which wells to purchase. A proposed housing development in the area known as the Wasko property was mentioned. Grants are being worked on for this project.

In other actions, a resolution to adopt salary increases for police officer and dispatcher positions passed. New salary and job classifications were approved. The appointments and swearing in of new members of the Planning and Zoning Commission was tabled. Vice mayor Wickham gave a review of the Regional CAAG meeting held in Payson.

The recent storm damage and clean up was discussed. The council and people in attendance seemed to approve of the way the town came together to address the emergency issues. A few council members voiced concern that the cutting of brush and trees earlier in the year by public works may have contributed to increased flooding in some

Representatives from the owners of the rights to the San Manuel CHAA (Community Health Analysis Area) which is a 25 square mile area where one medical marijuana dispensary can operate

spoke to the town council about wanting to open a dispensary in Mammoth. Attorney David W. Dow, Greg Rowles and Dr. Glenn Wilt are the board members of the Pinal County Wellness Center who spoke at the meeting. They spoke about the law making medical marijuana legal, what a dispensary is and what it can do. They talked about potential money that could be brought into the area including sales tax. They answered questions from the council and the audience. They said they were there to establish a line of communication with the Town of



Mammoth. Dr. Wilt was interested in properties on S. Main St. off of Highway 77 and on East Main St. They had first attempted to open a dispensary in Dudleyville but the

location was denied. The Mammoth Town Council was there to listen and not to take action on the issue. It is not known at this time whether more talks will be scheduled.

# Hayden Police issue area warning about phone scam

Citizens of the Copper Corridor please be aware of a scam that is directed at the elderly in our area. There have been several cases

involving this telephone scam.

The caller will act like a sibling child or young relative and ask for money

for being in an accident or arrested and needs the money to be wired to Mexico or Canada. It's usually in the range of \$300 to \$500 and they will call frequently gathering information about you. There are reports that the violators will call up to 25 times. Again they speak spanish and act like relatives. Some calls will involved multiple people acting like relatives as they gather more information.

To determine if the call is valid, ask them for the cellphone or home number or call a neutral relative to verify identity and tell them you will call back. The violators are using blocked phone numbers.

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# San Manuel Junior/Senior **High Important Information**

San Manuel – A new school year is about to begin. Clip out and save this article, provided as a handy guide to help your child have the best year possible.

All students who attend the Junior/Senior High must register before attending class on Aug. 8. Registration dates are as follows: Seniors and Juniors on Thurs., Aug. 1 from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.; Sophomores and Freshman on Fri., Aug. 2 from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m.; seventh and eighth graders on Mon. Aug 5 from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m.

All students must have a copy of a certified birth certificate and a proof of residency on file before they can be registered. This is a state requirement.

Oracle students must bring a certificate of residency, each year,

before they are allowed to register. This is available at the Oracle District Office. Please obtain this form from the Oracle District Office prior to registration.

Class fees are due at the time of registration. Fees are: Art class, \$10; Automotive, \$10; Woods Class, \$10; School Lock, \$6. No outside locks are allowed.

Students must have a physical, submit parent permission, pay the activity fee and have a birth certificate on file prior to participation in sport activities.

All students in the Junior/Senior High must have an annual physical examination after July 1 in order to participate in interscholastic sports for the 2013-14 school year. Physicals will be

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# Oracle schools announce new superintendent and principal, cut day care and 3-year-old preschool

Dennis Blauser was officially offered the superintendent position for the Oracle School District at the school board meeting on July 16. Blauser accepted the offer. Nanette Soule accepted the position of K-8 principal. The assistant principal position has been eliminated as a cost saving factor and as part of the administrative restructure plan which was approved and adopted by the governing board.

The administrative restructure plan is addressing the recent audit findings that expressed concerns about the administrative size and cost. The superintendent will be doing the work of the previous superintendent with additional duties that include:

\*Teaching the AP Middle School Algebra I class daily from 9:41 a.m. to 10:34 a.m. \*Manage the e-rate grant.

\*Schedule two hours per day on the Mountain Vista campus to assist the principal with discipline and duty coverage.

\*12:30 p.m. to 1:06 p.m., middle school lunch duty; 1:06 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., discipline coverage.

\*Perform half of the teacher performance evaluations which were previously split between the principal and assistant principal.

\*Function as the district's state test coordinator.

The principal will have additional duties besides performing the duties of the previous principal to include teaching the AP Geometry class daily from 8:45 a.m. to 9:38 p.m.; manage entitlement grants;

manage school improvement plan as reported to ALEAT; and cross training to fill in for the superintendent when needed.

This restructuring plan is expected to save \$14,000 in maintenance and operations costs compared to the previous superintendent structure. Another part of the administrative restructuring plan included the elimination of one full time

position in the district office and one full time position in the Mountain Vista office. Administrative staff will be cross trained to perform the duties of the positions that were eliminated and to cover for each other if one is absent. This will result in more savings of the district.

The Oracle Ridge Learning Center Restructure Plan that was approved by the board



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# Sea Lions win League Championship meet

The Sea Lions swim team hosted the Central Arizona League Championship Swim Meet on Saturday at the San Manuel Swimming Pool. The overall team scores were as follows:



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

# Volunteer Spotlight: Pfaff welcoming visitors at Tri-Community Visitors Center

Debi Pfaff knows how it feels to see something go from planning to fruition. She helped start the Tri-Community Visitors Center where she now volunteers.

Debi, 59, grew up in Gillette, New Jersey and graduated from Keane University with a Bachelor of Arts in Education.
After living in California, she settled in Arizona in 2004 where she met her husband Phillip and moved to Oracle. Debi has two grown children, a teenage daughter from marriage, and a two and a half month old granddaughter.

Debi has been a teacher since she was 22 years old and currently teaches part time at Sierra Oaks Community School. She is an independent marketer and helps connect people to nutritional and nontoxic products through Melaleuca Health. Debi is a part of OWN, or Oracle Women's Network, which is how she became involved at the center.

While meeting with the women of OWN, Debi became part of a movement for an idea to start up the center. It became a project of the organization to become a product for everyone.

"We were talking about how somebody ought to figure out how to disseminate and share all the information about activities and businesses and things that are going on so we became the somebody," said Debi. Debi serves as the

volunteer coordinator and her duties include creating schedules, training volunteers, and keeping

information current. Volunteer shifts are from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. and responsibilities include keeping the center clean, updating information, and welcoming people to the area.

"We put new things up basically just to welcome people and it's really fun because you just never know when you're going to have someone from Alaska stop in," said Debi. She said they receive visitors who want to move to the area and visitors from several different states.

Debi loves volunteering at the center because of the different people she gets to meet. She also enjoys the group of volunteers and the enthusiasm they have for where they live.

Debi's goal is for the center to become state sanctioned and hopes that doing so would allow for more publicity for the free resource. In order to become sanctioned, the center would need to be open 40 hours a week and Debi believes more volunteers are needed to do so. The center is currently open Tuesday through Saturday from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

"Encourage people to come to the tricommunities...not just as a place they're driving through but driving to," said Debi.

The Tri-Community Visitors Center opened on March 2, 2013 and has 21 volunteers on its roster. The center provides information about events in the community, how to connect with local businesses, and friendly faces to answer questions. The Tri-Community Visitors Center is entirely volunteer staffed. The Country Cottage which is owned by Adrian Darimont, is located in the back of the center and helps with costs, as a percentage of sales goes to the center.
