

Pinal County donates to Hayden Senior Center

On Tuesday, July 19, the Hayden Senior Center received a \$20,000 donation from the Pinal County Board of Supervisors for the Meals on Wheels program. District 1 Supervisor Pete Rios presented the check to Hayden Senior Center Director Anita Hinojos. Hayden Mayor Bobby Smith and Council Members Enrique Lopez and Jeremy Garcia were in attendance.

"The Town of Hayden ran the program for many years and

have been very supportive of us," said Hinojos.

Supervisor Rios said that even though the Hayden Senior Center is located in Gila County, "we found that they serve a significant percentage of seniors in Pinal County."

"Gila County and Pinal County have been sister counties for a long time and have worked together as members of Central Arizona Governments (CAG)," Rios added.

The Meals on Wheels program serves seniors in Hayden, Winkelman, Kearny, Superior, Dudleyville, Mammoth, San Manuel, Oracle and SaddleBrooke. The Pinal County Board of Supervisors has provided \$40,000 for the program over the last two fiscal years. This donation is for the fiscal year 2016-2017. The Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to support the program.

"We will try and get it every fiscal year," said Rios.

The Meals on Wheels program provides 600 to 700 congregate meals and 1,800 to 2,000 meals for homebound seniors per month. Congregate meals are those meals served at senior centers in the different communities. Supervisor Rios said that the homebound deliveries "serve a dual purpose." Not only does it provide a nutritious meal but the people who make the delivery also check on the welfare of the seniors.





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Rolling Rock Gallery - Copper Triangle

n the late 90's, the Town of Superior started to buy some of the vacant buildings that were available for sale in hopes of preserving the downtown and having an area for business owners to have a place to open shop. In 2005 Debra and David Knight decided that they would like to expand their mining and geology services and gift shop store. They had heard about the Resolution Copper project from a mutual friend and decided that expanding their operations to Superior would be a good business opportunity.

Debra and David are both natives of Arizona, even though they have lived in Elko, Nevada for many years. David is a geologist and Debra is a middle school science teacher and their business and retail selections reflect their interests.

They purchased the three office buildings on Magma Ave. and the Wing's building on Main St.

"We promised the town we would get a store open, renovate the buildings and most importantly we promised not to raise the rent on the Cobre Valley Clinic," they said. The sale of the buildings took over 18 months to complete but once the sales closed, the Knights set out to work on remodeling the buildings and opening their Rolling Rock Gallery and the Copper Triangle, which is a mining supply store that also offers temporary job services.

The gift shop is very unique to the area. "There is a little bit of everything," said store manager Kathy Long. The store has a wide variety of merchandise from fun and playful hats for adults and kids to educational toys and puppets. There is also lots of local art work, housewares, wind chimes and even some clothing.

The mining supply store has everything someone might need for mining, from core sample boxes and maps to safety equipment. They can also order supplies that someone may need. The Copper Triangle also offers temporary job services, those looking for a job can go in and leave an application for an employers. Many of the local mines and other employers use the hiring service to hire temporary employees. That is the busiest aspect of their business.

Their advice to their fellow business owners and fellow entrepreneurs: "Lower the sales taxes; that will help with retail sales," said Debra.

"The youth need to get their education. Finish high school and go to college," said Dave.

"We were able to get loans to grow our business because of our education. We were less of a risk," added Debra.

David also recommended that you have at least one year of expenses saved when you start a business. "It takes a while to really start making money," he said.

Chrysocolla Inn

ooking for a place to have a staycation or maybe you have guests coming, but not enough room in your home? Chrysocolla Inn is a bed and breakfast located near downtown Globe. This B & B is a labor of love for the owners Heidi and Holley Rooney.

After they remodeled their historic adobe home, they decided to take on another project. But this project was much larger than a small home. They decided to save an old miner's boarding house. They wanted to preserve a piece of history for the area. The renovation took almost seven years, however they cut no corners and insisted in perfection. After all those years of hard work and patience the business opened.

Since 2012 the B & B has hosted hundreds of guests, either traveling though the area or some who needed a longer term stay. Libby Rooney is the hostess and manager of the inn. She has many years of experience: she managed a 22-room bed and breakfast in Galilee, Israel.

Each room is decorated colors of the gems and minerals associated with copper mining. The three-level building has six guest rooms, multiple sitting areas, patios and a chef's kitchen. The turquoise room features a wood burning stove which is unique to the area and each room has an attached bathroom and some have a claw foot tub and shower. The rooms are decorated with antiques and fine furnishing, much of which was purchased at local antique stores.

Guests checking in get a full tour of the building and a history of the building. Libby explains that in the mining hey days often two miners shared one room. One would sleep in the room during the night while the other was at work. Before the other miner returned from his shift the housekeepers would flip the mattresses and prepare the room for the second miner. This is where the term "flop house"


