

Rep. O'Halleran visits Copper Corridor

On Friday, Congressional District 1 Representative Tom O'Halleran visited the communities of Superior, Kearny and Hayden.

Rep. O'Halleran makes frequent visits

to the area and on this particular trip he caught up with leaders in Superior on the development of the Superior Multi-Gen Center. O'Halleran chose this project to receive a \$2 million dollar congressional

appropriation. The money will be used to fund the renovations of the original high school to be used as the Multi-Gen Center and Enterprise Center. Superior Town leaders reported that construction is beginning and they anticipate moving into the facility in early 2023. Funding for the renovations and elevation construction is fully lined up.

During his visit to Kearny, he presented a check for \$417,228 to the Town of Kearny

for the CopperNet Broadband internet improvements. CopperNet was awarded the funding from the Arizona Department of Commerce as part of the broadband funding from the federal government. CopperNet is one of the primary internet service providers in the Copper Corridor region.

O'Halleran and his staff also met with leaders in Hayden and Winkelman during his visit to catch up on their needs as well.

CVIT hires guidance counselor

Guidance counselors are often thought of as the person at a school who creates and manages a student's academic schedule, a person who may also help with college and career placement, assist with scholarships and may lead a club or assist a school principal, depending on the size of the school. The emphasis on the need for school counselors has grown, as there has been more evidence that when students have access to support for social and emotional well-being, they also perform better as students. While there has been a push to hire more counselors across the state, the overall ratio is 700 students to one counselor across the state. This means the case load for a school counselor is usually met with insurmountable challenges.

Understanding that student success is tied to having a strong support system, the Cobre Valley Institute of Technology (CVIT) Governing board hired its first ever guidance counselor, Aja DeZeeuw. Aja is a 1997 graduate of Superior High School and attended the University of Arizona for a business degree. After many years maintaining a successful career in retail sales management, she decided to go back to school to earn a master's degree to become a certified guidance counselor. Prior to coming to CVIT, she worked for the Globe Unified School district as its guidance counselor.

CVIT leadership determined that adding a guidance counselor to its staff would benefit all of the school districts they serve: Globe, Miami, Hayden/Winkelman, Ray, San Carlos and Superior. Many of the schools in the Cobre Valley Institute of Technology district only have a student services director or academic advisor, who may not have the full qualifications to help with social and emotional behavioral needs along with the traditional student guidance. Career Technical Education (CTE) programs allow students to be dually enrolled in a local community college, which means that their college grades in CVIT count towards their permanent college transcript. In the role of the CVIT guidance counselor, DeZeeuw can help ensure that students participating in these program have the support they need to succeed.

DeZeeuw will be visiting each school on a regular basis to provide programing and support for social and emotional skills to all high school students, while also assisting students to sign up for advanced



education programs through the CVIT district. Some of the social and emotional skills include how to work with different people and learning some of the professional soft skills students need to succeed both in school and in their careers. While she will definitely miss her students at Globe High School, she is excited to be able to serve more students across the Copper Corridor achieve their academic and career goals, but also to provide some of the emotional and behavioral support that many students need.

Sophomores, juniors and seniors can sign up for a variety of Career Technical Education programs through their local school and at the CVIT central campus in Globe. Local classes and opportunity vary by school district but there are courses in everything from hospitality, culinary, law enforcement and business. The CVIT central campus also offers programs in nursing, welding and cosmetology. Depending on the program, there may be some prerequisites needed. CTE programs allow students to graduate from high school with a career certificate, while also giving them the opportunity to learn about career opportunities. DeZeeuw also explained that CVIT is working on programs to assist with transportation from a students home district to the CVIT Central Campus.

"We want to be as supportive as possible to our students," she explained.

Students who are homeschooled but who live in the CVIT district may also sign up for the programing. You can learn more about CVIT and the programs they offer at www.cvit81.org.

DeZeeuw is a resident of the Copper Corridor, living in Superior with her husband Josh and their menagerie of pets. She enjoys spending time with her family and friends and traveling to see as many places in the world that she possibly can.

SUMMARY: The United States Forest Service (USFS) has filed an application with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) requesting that the Secretary of the Interior withdraw 276 acres of National Forest System (NFS) lands located within the Tonto National Forest from location and entry under the U. S. mining laws for a 20-year term, subject to valid existing rights. The purpose of the withdrawal requested is to protect the lands for a U.S. Congressionally-directed conveyance to the Town of Superior (Town), Pinal County, Arizona. Publication of this notice temporarily segregates the lands for up to 2 years, initiates a 90-day public comment period, and announces to the public an

opportunity to request a public meeting on the withdrawal. **DATES:** Comments and requests for a public meeting must be received by [INSERT DATE 90 DAYS FROM DATE OF PUBLICATION IN THE FEDERAL REGISTER].

ADDRESSES: All comments or requests for a public meeting should be sent to the BLM Arizona State Office, 1 North Central Avenue, Suite 800, Phoenix, AZ 85004; faxed to (602) 417-9452; or sent by email to BLM_AZ_Withdrawal_Comments@blm.gov. SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The USFS requests the 20-year term withdrawal to protect the NFS lands from potential encumbrances that could affect the Town's ability to use the lands when purchased from the Federal Government. Section 3003 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2015 (NDAA) [P.L. 113-291§ 3003] requires the Secretary of Agriculture to convey the subject lands to the Town, upon request from the Town. The subject lands are located within the Tonto National Forest and within the Town's corporate limits, and include the 30-acre Fairview Cemetery, as

well as parcels near the Superior Municipal Airport.

The following described NFS lands are the subject of the USFS's withdrawal application and are temporarily segregated for a period of up to 2 years from location and entry under the U. S. mining laws, subject to valid existing rights. The lands remain open to such uses as may be made on NFS lands and to leasing under the mineral and geothermal leasing laws:

For a period until July 22, 2024 the lands will be segregated as specified above unless

the application is denied or canceled.

WHEREAS, the County of Pinal is the assessing and collecting authority for the Town of Superior, the Clerk is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this ordinance to the County Assessor and the Board of Supervisors of the County of Pinal Arizona

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona, as follows:

SECTION 1: There is hereby levied on each one hundred dollars (\$100.00) of the assessed value of all property, both real and personal within the corporate limits of the Town of Superior, except such property as may be by law exempt from taxation, a primary property tax rate of \$5.6914 for the fiscal year ending on the 30th day of June. 2023. If this tax rate exceeds the maximum levy allowed by law, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Pinal is hereby authorized to reduce the levy to the maximum allowable by law after providing notice to the Town.
SECTION 2: It is the intent of the

Town Council of the Town of Superior, Arizona to levy the primary property tax for operations for the Town of Superior for fiscal year 2022- 2023 will equal \$ 633,827.00 dollars.

SECTION 4: Failure by the County officials of Pinal County, Arizona, to properly return the delinquent list, any irregularity in assessments or omissions in the same, or any irregularity in any proceedings shall not invalidate such proceedings or invalidate any title conveyed by any tax deed; failure or neglect of any officer or officers to timely perform any of the duties assigned to him or to them shall not invalidate any proceedings or any deed or sale pursuant thereto, the validity of the assessment or levy of taxes or of the judgment of sale by which the collection of the same may be enforced shall not affect the lien of the Town of Superior upon such property for the delinquent taxes unpaid thereon; overcharge as to part of the taxes or of costs shall not invalidate any proceedings for the collection of taxes or the foreclosure of the lien thereon or a sale of the property under such foreclosure; and all acts of officers de facto shall be valid as if performed by officers de jure.

SECTION 5: All ordinances and parts of
