KPD responds to allegations made by 12 News

As with any major disaster or tragedy everyone can look back and see how a community or group came together in support of the event. Following the Shipman Fire while Mayor Hosler and Chief Ingulli have commended the community, volunteers, police and fire departments, allegations arose that Chief Bob Ingulli and the Kearny Police Department were not available during the early reports of the fire.

KPNX Channel 12 and AZ Central launched an investigative report on the Kearny Police Department. Their investigation highlighted that KPD was not available during the fire and did not have adequate coverage. The interview also uncovers another incident in November of

2012 when Kearny had a lapse of police coverage for three hours. That lapse of coverage warranted a letter from Chief Deputy Steve Henry of PCSO.

Copper Basin News talked with Chief Ingulli to set the record straight on the investigation. Ingulli first commended the staff of the police and fire departments for responding to the Shipman Fire. "Our departments and volunteers in police service worked tirelessly through the fire to ensure the safety of Kearny residents," said Ingulli.

Ingulli explained that while 12 News was trying to imply he was not in the community during the fire he did confirm that he was having dinner with his wife in the White Mountains and within 45 minutes of learning about the fire he was on his way back to

Kearny. His neighbor in the White Mountains drove him to Globe where he was able to get another ride into Kearny with a friend. "I left my wife and our dogs at our home in the White Mountains," he said.

Ingulli also explained that Kearny Police Department was the first agency on duty to help with the evacuations of the Stevens Trailer Park. Hayden Police and the Department of Public Safety followed shortly behind to assist Kearny Police Department. He further explained that the Shipman Fire was never in the town limits and confirmed that Stevens Trailer Park is also not in the town limits. Reports indicated that PCSO did not arrive on the scene until half hour after the first reports of the fire.

"This investigation (by KPNX Channel 12) is

nothing but a bunch of lies; they edited out my full explanation," said Ingulli.

As for the November 2012 incident reported in the 12 News story, Ingulli explained that there was a day when there was a three hour gap of coverage but he had arranged for Hayden Police to cover in case of an emergency and stated that if something major would have

happened PCSO is usually close by to assist as well. "I never assumed that PCSO would be protecting our town," he said.

Public Safety Departments throughout the state work under mutual aid agreements which means they can assist one another in a time of disaster or emergency. "We have a great working relationship

with Hayden, DPS and PCSO," explained Ingulli. "I have never left this community unattended; I care about this community." KPD has one officer on duty at all times and is backed up by the Chief of Police in most cases.

Winkelman man killed south of Globe Thursday

Arizona's monsoon weather had a hand in a fatal accident that claimed the life of a Winkelman man.

According to the Arizona Department of Public Safety, on Thursday, July 25, 2013, at 3 p.m., a

two-vehicle collision on Highway 77 at milepost 164.2, approximately eight miles south of Globe, a vehicle driven by Jody Gibson, 18, Tempe, was traveling north when it hydroplaned during a heavy rainstorm, crossed

into the southbound lane and collided head on with a second vehicle, driven by Gilbert Meza, 47, Winkelman.

Gibson and her passenger, Angel Wheeler, 28, Tempe, sustained only minor injuries. Meza was pronounced dead.

The accident forced the closure of the highway for several hours while DPS officers investigated. Traffic between Globe and Winkelman was routed through Kearny and Superior on Highway 177.

CVIT program provides technical ‘college’ training for Hayden, Superior students

Ashley Darreas, a senior from Superior Unified School District, participates in many activities and one in particular the Cobre Valley Institute of Technology (CVIT) program. Ashley began the CVIT program her junior year of high school and continues with the program this year. Ashley has a rigorous schedule that starts with six hours of regularly scheduled high school classes. She also participates in cheerleading for football and basketball after school and at games. After this her CVIT classes begin. She has CVIT classes from 4:30 p.m. until about 6 p.m. She has homework for her high school classes and also with CVIT. Ashley also participates in the Family Community Career Leaders of America (FCCLA).

Ashley is enrolled in the Geology CVIT Program and really enjoys the college professors and classes. In her Geology classes she has lectures and labs. Geology is the science that deals with

the dynamics and physical history of the earth, the rocks and the physical, chemical, and biological changes that the earth has undergone or is undergoing. One of her classes she recalls measuring sizes of earthquakes with a linear line chart. They were taught to measure the earthquakes based on the chart and even where the earthquake had started. They also had worked with the dirt and sand to see if it stayed sloped or angled from the earthquake. They also take the students on field trips.

Ashley’s Geology class last year had 10 students. Having a smaller class gave the students the opportunity to get to know each other and the professor’s on a more personal level. The CVIT Geology class was actually held in Superior last year. The professor was from Central Arizona College and at different times an Arizona State University professor would attend and help teach the students.

Christopher Villaverde Jr. is another Superior senior

that participates in the CVIT program. Christopher has been enrolled in the electrician field and after this year when he graduates with his high school diploma will also have his associates degree. Christopher started the CVIT program his sophomore year in the graphic design field, but then changed to the electrician field his junior year. He plans to obtain a job in the electrical field right out of high school and CVIT has made this possible for him.

Christopher, like Ashley, has his regular classes at Superior High School. He also participates in tennis, FCCLA and CVIT. This summer Christopher was able to participate in the FCCLA Nationals that were held in Tennessee. During nationals he was awarded a silver metal for his work. Christopher also has an interest in law enforcement and is currently a Pinal County Explorer through the Pinal County Sheriff’s Department. He has been with them for about a year and a half now. Christopher said through the

CVIT program he has made many new friends and has great teachers.

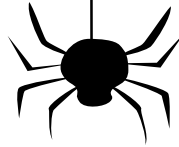
Christopher’s CVIT classes are held at the Gila College. He leaves after lunch around 12:45 p.m. for the journey to Gila College. Superior provides transportation to Gila College. Christopher considers his classes to be “hands on” but they do have lectures and plenty of homework. The professors teach circuitry, systems, motor controls and every day electrical procedures. He looks forward to a career as an electrician where he will be able to install, maintain, repair and operate electrical equipment and circuitry. Christopher is able to work with his father who owns and operates his own electrical company called Villaverde Electric in Superior. Christopher said his father’s work inspired him to pursue the electrical field. Christopher’s CVIT Electrical class consists of twelve student’s total. He recommends taking the CVIT classes now since

Registration begins Aug. 1 for CAC's GED classes

PINAL COUNTY, Ariz. – Central Arizona College will offer GED classes to help students earn their General Educational Development (GED) diploma at several locations throughout Pinal County during the fall semester. Beginning Thursday, Aug. 1, students may pre-register at any one of Central Arizona College's nine locations. GED classes will be divided into two eight-week periods and are currently provided at no cost for Arizona residents.

On Jan. 1, the GED exam will change to a computer-based test aligned with the Common Core Standards. Anyone who started the tests under the current GED Series 2002 must complete and pass all five parts of the exam by Dec. 3 or they will be required to start over in January with the new test that is expected to be more expensive and complex.

Students taking class at one of the following locations in Eastern Pinal County are encouraged to pre-register at any one of Central Arizona College's campuses or centers, or they may register onsite on the first night of the class. Proof of legal presence in the United States is required. These locations are: Aravaipa Campus, located at 80440 E. Aravaipa Rd., Winkelman, Ariz., Room E107 from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m., on Monday and Wednesday, beginning Aug. 19; and Mt. Vista Junior High School, located at 2618 W El Paseo, Oracle, Ariz., Room 23 from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m., on Monday and Wednesday, beginning Aug. 19.

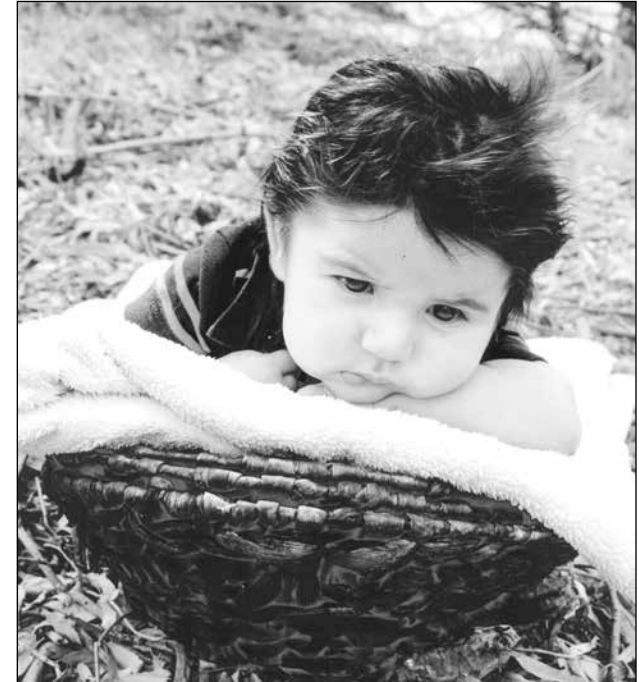
