Winkelman man killed south of Globe Thursday

Arizona's monsoon weather had a hand in a fatal accident that claimed the life of a Winkelman man.

According to the Arizona Department of Public Safety, on Thursday, July 25, 2013, at 3 p.m., a two-vehicle collision on Highway 77 at milepost 164.2, approximately eight miles

south of Globe, a vehicle driven by Jody Gibson, 18, Tempe, was traveling north when it hydroplaned during a heavy rainstorm, crossed into the southbound lane and collided head on with a second vehicle, driven by Gilbert Meza, 47, Winkelman.

Gibson and her passenger,

Angel Wheeler, 28, Tempe, sustained only minor injuries. Meza was pronounced dead.

The accident forced the closure of the highway for several hours while DPS officers investigated. Traffic between Globe and Winkelman was routed through Kearny and Superior on Highway 177.

Superior Police Report

According to state law, police may arrest suspected offenders by two methods. The suspect may be physically taken into the department and booked into jail, or the arresting officer may write a citation and release the suspect to

Reasons for recall explained

Having been the one that initiated the recall against Councilwoman Peralta, I would like to respond to the letter she submitted last week in which she defends herself against the recall. I would first like to clarify that this is by no means a personal attack or "singling out" of Peralta. At the time of the initiation of the recall, we were under the impression that Peralta was the only council member in violation that was also eligible for recall. We certainly do not claim that she made these decisions alone. On the contrary, we believe that decisions were made by several members of the council, without proper transparency. However, the other members had either recently lost their election seats, or were recently re-elected to their seats, which made them ineligible for recall until they had held office for six months.

In my opinion, Peralta, and other members of the town council violated open meeting law multiple times; however, I will attempt to be brief, and discuss what I feel to be the most blatant violations. On Feb. 21, 2013, The Town of Superior issued a press release stating that they wished to terminate their mutual benefits agreement with Resolution

Copper Company. Prior to this date, there was no council action taken, or even discussed in any open forum with regard to this matter. The citizens and Resolution Copper were completely blindsided by the town council's complete reversal of support.

Peralta states that the council was acting on a discussion that they had that evening in executive session. But how is it then, that copies of a press release regarding this decision were available for members of the audience AT that meeting? Clearly, this press release had been drafted BEFORE the council voted on the matter. The council members' votes were clearly decided PRIOR to the meeting, which is a violation of open meeting law.

In response to my misspelling of malfeasance... I apologize. However, as Peralta explained, malfeasance is defined as the commission of an act by a public officer that is unequivocally illegal or completely wrongful. A blatant disregard of open meeting law is certainly, in my opinion, malfeasant.

Peralta also states that the principal reason for terminating the mutual benefits agreement was Former Councilmember Gutierrez's involvement in the draft-

ing of the original mutual benefits agreement. Fine. Why not use this mistake to the town's advantage and negotiate a new, improved mutual benefits agreement? Instead, the council decided to take it a step further, and completely oppose the land exchange, even sending a delegation to Washington DC to speak against it. They turned their back on one of the few large-scale companies that has invested in our town. This is a decision that destroyed a revenue stream that the town so desperately needs. Once again, in my opinion, this is malfeasance.

However, I would like to stress that this recall is NOT about Resolution Copper. This just happens to be the issue that finally made us want to put our foot down and demand better for our town. It is time we had a leadership that will stop blaming others, own up to their decisions, and take responsibility for them. It is time we had a leadership that will stop dwelling on the mistakes of the past and figure out how we can build a better future. It is time to recall Councilmember Peralta and others that would rather "do nothing" than move forward. That is what this recall is about.
