any of us are familiar with the Eddie Murphy movie Beverly Hills Cop. While the theme song sung by Glenn Frey, "The Heat Is On" is about the police going after the bad guy, it certainly describes the summers here in Arizona.

Friday, June 21, and with it comes the warmer and HOTTER days of summer. This is the time we are outside more enjoying the beauty of this state and all it has to offer. Some people must work in the hotter temperatures no matter how hot it gets. So, heat safety isn't just for those enjoying their vacation or time relaxing outdoors.

As many of us who live in the desert are aware, the higher temperatures can quickly cause dehydration and bring on potentially life-threatening heat-related medical issues. During our hot summer days our body still sweats even though our skin may appear to be dry. The lower humidity we have here in the desert can evaporate our sweat making it look like we are not all that hot so the summer heat isn't a problem, but IT IS!!

There are three stages of summer heatrelated medical issues that can happen and rapid recognition and treatment of those issues can help save a life or prevent any permanent damage to someone's body. Signs and symptoms of heat related illness are:


