We don't live in a forest in our part of Arizona, but we still could learn a few things from those who do. People in Pine, Strawberry, and Payson clear the area around their houses from all flammable materials. # Healthcare Collaboration: CVRMC to assist Community Health Foundation

Twenty-five years ago, health care for Kearny and the residents of the Copper Basin was in jeopardy. Samaritan Hospital pulled out – the operation of a community hospital and health care clinic was no longer a sustainable operation. The loss of access to health care is devastating to a community and in that time of potential disaster community leaders from



Kearny stepped up to form the Community Healthcare Foundation.

The Foundation's mission was to maintain the old Kennecott hospital/clinic property and offer rents to health care providers at a rock-bottom price in order to keep some sort of health care services in the area. Over the years, as the population has declined and costs continued to increase, the sustainability of the Community Health Foundation was becoming more and more difficult. A partnership would be needed to continue the health care center operations.

"It is vital to maintain health services in the community of Kearny. We have been fortunate to work with many outstanding community members who have had the passion for health services as well and we look forward to caring for the people of Kearny in the future," explained Neil Jensen, CEO for Cobre Valley Regional Medical Center.

Cobre Valley Regional Medial Center has been a partner and tenant for several years. Often times they would offer some maintenance and upkeep services.

"They have always been so patient with us," said David Orzell, President of the Foundation. "Even when the

# **Behind the Scenes: ASARCO Smelter Improvements**

ASARCO Hayden Smelter Operations have begun the major improvements and repairs to the facilities and equipment in Hayden. The upgrades and improvements come after the 2015 Consent Decree signed by ASARCO and the Environmental Protection Agency. The Consent Decree lined out many improvements needed to protect the environment in the area surrounding the Hayden Smelter Operations.

Included in the \$40 million dollar repairs is the installation of wind fencing throughout the property to keep harmful dust particles from leaving the property. The major smelter upgrades will ensure that the smelter emissions remain 99.5% pollutant free. Some of the other upgrades include improvements to the crusher and paving roads.

ASARCO is also required to install 38 environmental monitors on their property and in the area. Data from the monitors must be tabulated and reported to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality on a regular basis.

**Opportunity to Comment on Apache** Leap Special Management Area The Tonto National Forest, Supervisor's Office, is preparing a management plan for the congressionally designated Apache Leap Special Management Area (SMA), located in Pinal County, 65 miles east of Phoenix, Arizona. The purpose of the proposed action is to develop and adopt long-range direction for managing the natural resources and human uses of the Apache Leap SMA consistent with Section 3003 of the Carl Levin and Howard P. 'Buck' McKeon National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2015 (NDAA) (Public Law [PL] 113–291). Approval of the Apache Leap management plan requires a concurrent forest plan amendment to add or modify one or more plan components or to change where one or more plan components apply (36 CFR § 219.13(a)). The 1985 Tonto Land and Resource Management Plan would be amended to: 1) include the Apache Leap SMA as a new management area (MA 2G Globe Ranger District - Apache Leap SMA); 2) modify the description and acreage of the former management area (MA 2F Globe Range District - General Management Area) and 3) incorporate new plan components that were developed to meet the primary purpose of the special management area. These plan components comprise chapter three of the proposed Apache
