I am a natural peeping tom stalking at sunrise, camera in hand, hoping not to be seen or noticed, hoping to capture the perfect beaver shot. For my efforts I am rewarded with a glimpse of wild tail, beautiful, fleshy, round and shapely. When that tail attached to a beaver slaps the water it makes a rifle crack sound and the entire family of beaver, poppa, momma, and pup swim away underwater before I can zoom in, focus or click. Another perfect beaver shot foiled.

With a sigh, (sigh) I look across the river and discover that in the branches of a thick willow tree there climbs a family of four raccoons. I suppose that this photograph of the four raccoons will have to do. Except the thick green grape vines which cover the tree trunk give the coven of masked bandits plenty of places to hide - another perfect nature photograph denied.

It reminds of the time I was at Beasley Flats and heard a splash behind me, turning around just in time to see two river otters swim away. I knelt down and got a wonderful close up photograph... of their footprints in the soft mud. Why do all my photographs have titles like quivering branch where bald eagle just launched, impressive ripples where fish has just leapt, tip of mountain lion tail as it leaps over bushes. That is one of my favorites, one I am particularly proud of -

tip of mountain lion tail as it leaps over bushes.

Still, as you may or may not know any time of year, just before sunrise when I sit there with my camera, the river shore is always dark, damp and cold and sometimes it even rains - just the weather being mean I suppose. Sort of like the morning I sit

on the bank and write this story. That is right it rained, I am suffering for my art but I wouldn't trade these experiences for any other,

Because as the river rolls my mind slows and I get back to the basics - back to the basics.

There is a sun which shines in the day and there is a moon which shines in the

night, river glistening beneath the silver light. Sometimes the moon shines in the day, something that is magic only because I believe it is and that is enough. Last summer as my autofocus failed, a raven caw cawed from a tree - mocking me. While that black bird laughed and laughed, a single feather

bottles found in the trash. They paid a visit to the people that illegally dumped, delivered the trash back to them and spoke to them. Not only were the people shamed by being caught but they have been warned that they may be banned for life from using the brush disposal site if caught again. The site is operated by the Oracle Firewise Board and the Oracle Fire Department.

The second illegal dumping was made a few days later. Not only did they illegally dump but they got into the site without paying the dump fee. These people may not be as lucky. The evidence identifying them has been turned over to the Pinal County Sheriff's Office. Illegal dumping is a crime! Illegal dumping can be a class 2 or class 1 misdemeanor. Illegal dumping of a large amount of trash can be classified as a class 6 felony punishable by up to one year in prison. The fine for a class 2 misdemeanor can be as high as \$750. A class 1 misdemeanor can

result in a fine of \$2,500. The misdemeanors can also result in six months of jail time.

Illegal dumping also known as desert dumping is defined as the disposal of solid waste such as garbage, appliances, furniture, hazardous waste, tires, yard waste, and construction and demolition debris in a location other than a landfill, waste transfer station, recycling center or curbside waste management provider. Illegal dumping costs Arizona taxpayers thousands of dollars each year for clean up and disposal. It is harmful to the environment and poses a threat to public health and safety. Tires littering the desert or stockpiled can be fire hazards. Toxic chemicals can leak into our waterways or wells because of the illegal dumping of oil, paint, cleaners, pesticides, weed killer, etc. Illegal dump sites can be breeding grounds for insects and rodents that can carry diseases to humans.

Special to the Crier Rodolfo Rivera, Jr., better known as 'Rudi' to Oracle residents, can usually be found in the kitchen preparing healthy Mexican meals with the same love and care he has done all his life.

The food served at the charming Casa Rivera Restaurant is consistently of high quality and freshness. Rudi emphasizes that only pure olive oil is

being used for cooking.
Rivera buys ingredients
locally whenever possible.
He uses organic eggs,
obtained from local
farmers.

In order to stay competitive in the current economic climate, Rivera has introduced a value meal in the early morning hours where patrons can order breakfast for \$3.95 between 6:30 and 9:30 a.m.

Casa Rivera's menu includes a variety of foods designed to please just about every palate. There are tacos and tamales, steak and shrimp, burritos and specials like menudo, and American fare such as sandwiches and cream pies.

Rudi points out the latest addition to this special collection, a picture of his own father on the day of baptism in Juarez around 1915. On the right of the baby stands the aforementioned Rodolfo Fierro who had taken time off from the war to perform the baptism. Thus the name Rodolfo has continued prominently in the family tree of the Rivera clan.

Rudi Rivera is proud of his heritage. He was born in Juarez, Mexico and raised in Los Angeles, California. As father, grandfather and greatgrandfather, he continues to be the respected patriarch of the family. He explains that his grandfather's origin is from France and Spain, and that his grandmother is Mexican Indian.

Casa Rivera Restaurant continues to be a family affair: Rodolfo and son Isaak work in the kitchen, son Chris and daughter Crystal manage the restaurant together with Rudi's wife Gloria and other close family members.

Rivera has been in the food business his whole life. He opened his first restaurant in California in 1969 and soon thereafter changed over to industrial catering for the next fifteen years, followed by a move to Arizona in 1988.

Things were not always easy, he explains, referring to a former restaurant he owned in Hayden. Asarco's move to the Tucson office resulted in the loss of many employees who were part of his lunch crowd.





Health Issues: Glutathione

Glutathione is arguably the best antioxidant our bodies have. Antioxidants protect us against damage from free radicals. Free radicals break up cells. They are responsible for cancer, hardening of the arteries, aging and almost all of our ailments. So, antioxidants are very, very important.

Chemistry: Glutathione is a tri-peptide - meaning that it is a molecule composed of three amino acids. Amino acids are the building blocks of protein which, in turn, provides the physical structure of our bodies. There are only 20 amino acids that humans use for the majority of our structures.

Glutathione is a naturally occurring substance in our bodies. We produce it in many places, though most of it is produced in the liver. There are many factors that adversely influence its production including aging, pollution and stress.

Glutathione has many uses in medicine. Besides being probably the

strongest antioxidant in the body, it has also shown benefits in treating Parkinson's Disease and other neurodegenerative processes and has had good effects in treating lung conditions.

Glutathione has a very difficult time being absorbed through the digestive system. It also has a difficult time getting into cells where most of its protective work takes place. Because of its difficulty in getting absorbed orally, other methods of delivery have been used to deliver it where it is needed. For instance, in the treatment of Parkinson's it has been administered intravenously. With lung conditions it has been added to inhalers (i.e.

nebulizers).

These treatments have not seen as much of a reversal of conditions as it has a stabilization of conditions. Glutathione works as a protectant not a regenerator of cells. It is excellent preventive medicine.

Cysteine is the most important of the three amino acids that make up glutathione. It has the sulfur group that is responsible for much of its protective qualities. Cysteine is easily digested and assimilated into the cells. There it combines with glycine and glutamic acid to form glutathione. This is why I recommend supplementing with cysteine. The best type of cysteine to take orally is N-acetyl-cysteine (NAC).

Not only does it get into the cells easier, it pulls out toxic metals like lead and mercury from the body. This will also help protect against degenerative processes.

Glutathione is a very important part of our healthy existence. Though it's not a well known part of our makeup, it is essential to our well being. And, because of its difficult assimilation, it is good to know how to ensure its optimal presence. There is a vast difference from person to person concerning the amount of cysteine that each person has. That is why I recommend cysteine as a supplement to consider as a daily or weekly routine.

Disposal Site was opened eight years ago. It is an arrangement between the Oracle Fire Department, the Arizona Department of Forestry and the state land department. It was started

to give residents a place to safely and inexpensively dispose of brush and shrubbery from their property. "We wanted to encourage people to dump their brush at the dump instead of the desert," said Oracle Fire Chief Larry Southard. The Oracle Fire Department's burn permit only allows for brush to be burned at the site. If they were to burn trash they stand the chance of losing their permit. It also costs the fire department time and sometimes money to clean up and dispose of the illegally dumped trash and prohibited items. The brush disposal site has signs that clearly show what can and can't be dumped


at the site. They also explain in English and Spanish that illegal dumping is a crime and those violators will be prosecuted.

"Oracle is a Firewise community," said Chief Southard. "Besides our volunteers, the brush dump is an important part of the system to keep it working and fire safe. It is also used to train new firefighters in fire suppression techniques during the burning of the brush piles. We can't afford to lose our burn permit because of the bad behavior of a few people, 99 percent of the people that use the dump care about keeping it," said Southard.

The brush disposal site is open daily from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. The key to the dump must be picked up at the fire

station. The cost to dump a load is \$3. The \$3 goes towards the cost of operating the dump. It would be a shame to lose this site or have tighter restrictions placed on it over the behavior of few misguided people who do not seem to care about their community or the environment. If you see someone illegally dumping, try to get a description of the vehicle or license plate number and report it to the Oracle Fire Department. Keep Oracle safe and the desert clean. STOP ILLEGAL DUMPING NOW!
