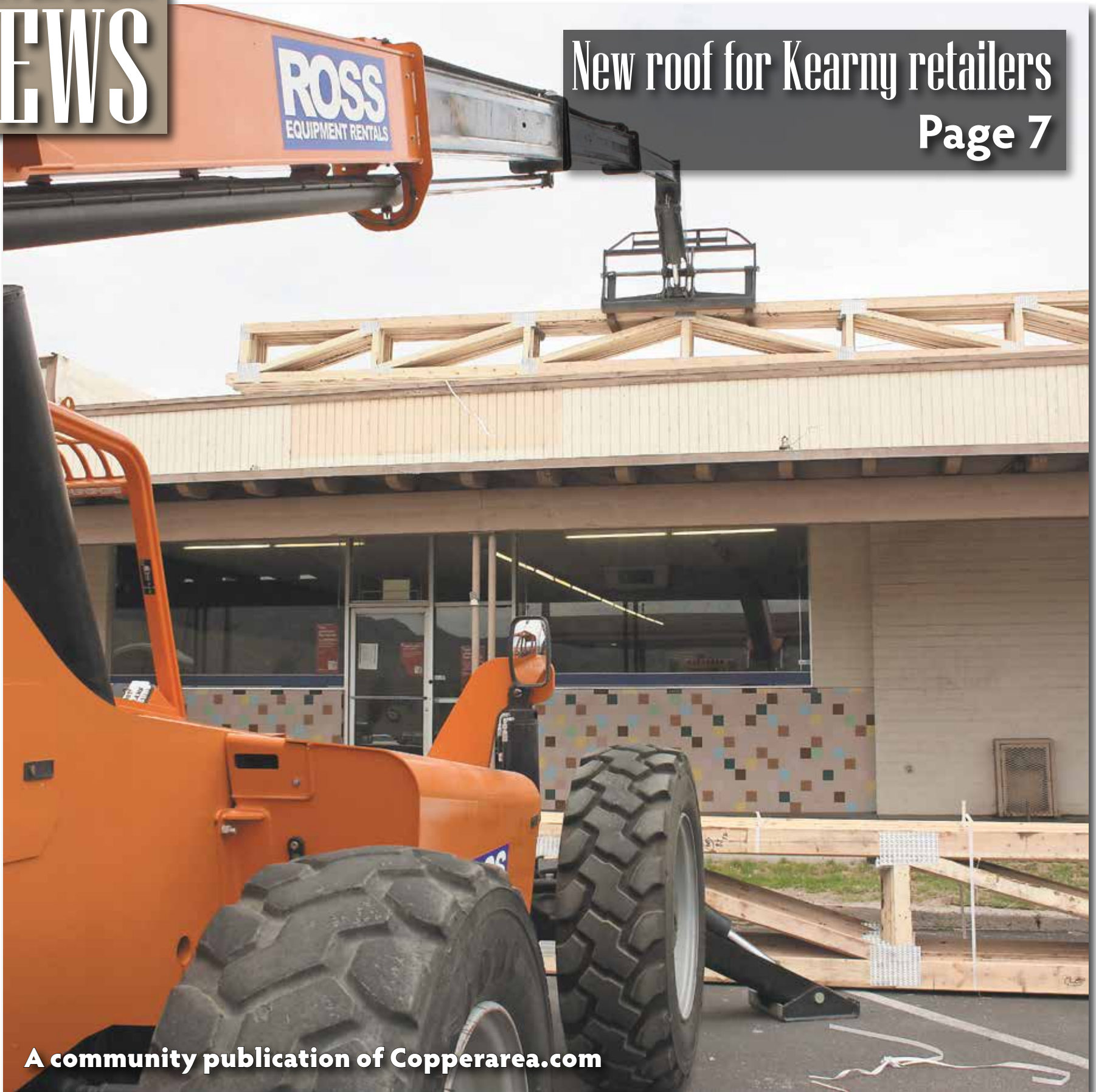

Accident on River Rd. in Mammoth leaves one dead, one injured

A late night accident earlier this month left one man dead and another with minor injuries.

According to Pinal County Sheriff's Office Public Information Officer Daniel Bavaro, on Aug. 2, 2019 at approximately 10:30 p.m., a pick-up truck traveling

northbound on River Rd. was driven left of center and off the roadway, striking a barbed wire fence. The driver, identified as Vernon Lewis, 57, was ejected and suffered fatal injuries. A passenger in Lewis's vehicle received minor injuries and was released at the scene.

Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers

The Arizona Corporation Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. CenturyLink's basic local service rates for residential voice lines are \$18.47 per month and business services are \$35.00 per month. Specific rates will be provided upon request.

CenturyLink participates in a government benefit program (Lifeline) to make residential telephone or broadband service more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. Eligible customers are those that meet eligibility standards as defined by the FCC and state commissions. Residents who live on federally recognized Tribal Lands may qualify for additional Tribal benefits if they participate in certain additional federal eligibility programs. The Lifeline discount is available for only one telephone or broadband service per household, which can be on either wireline or wireless service. Broadband speeds must be 18 Mbps download and 2 Mbps upload or faster to qualify.

A household is defined for the purposes of the Lifeline program as any individual or group of individuals who live together at the same address and share income and expenses. Lifeline service is not transferable, and only eligible consumers may enroll in the program. Consumers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain Lifeline telephone or broadband service can be punished by fine or imprisonment and can be barred from the program.

Tonto National Forest releases Draft Environmental Impact Statement for Resolution Copper Project and Land Exchange

Late last week, the USDA Forest Service released the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the Resolution Copper Project and Land Exchange for public review and comment.

The Resolution Copper project is a proposed underground copper mine near the town of Superior, Arizona. The project would create one of the largest copper mines in the United States, create more than 1,500 jobs and generate nearly \$270 million in labor income for surrounding communities.

"Our multiple use mission means that we have to balance demand for economic productivity with our commitment to environmental stewardship and sustainability," said Tonto National Forest Supervisor Neil Bosworth. "The Forest Service is required to consider proposed plans of operations for mining, and if they meet environmental regulations, minimize environmental impacts, and other requirements, we're required to approve them under the General Mining Law of

1872."

A Notice of Availability has been released alongside the DEIS in the Federal Register and begins a 90-day public comment period. The DEIS, supporting documents and instructions on how to comment, are available at <https://www.resolutionmineeis.us/>.

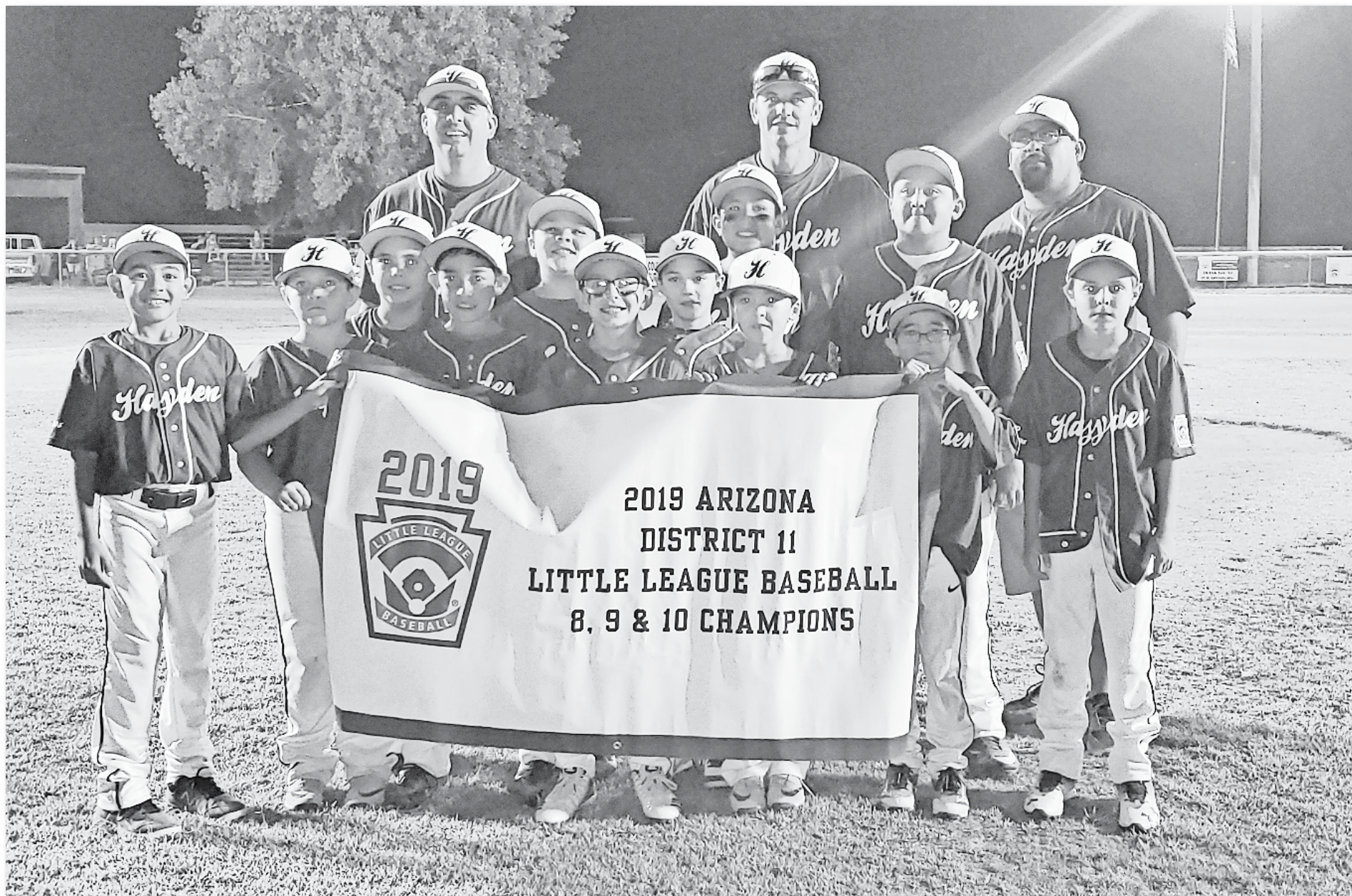
The DEIS describes effects of the proposed Resolution Copper Project and offers five potential alternatives developed considering feedback from a 2016 scoping period.

Journey ends for Hayden LL All-Stars

When it comes to competing for a championship typically only one team will be all smiles in the end.

Unfortunately, the Hayden Little League Minors All-Star team was not the last team standing at last month's 2019 Arizona State Little League Tournament, but the players, coaches and fans should still be smiling.

Why?

Because, like life, athletics is as much about enjoying the journey as it is about the celebrating the triumphs. For the

second consecutive year the Hayden LL Minors All-Star team reached the state tournament, and many were along for the joyous ride.

Hayden, the District 11 champion, had a bye in the first round before a 10 – 7 loss on Saturday, July 13, to District 2 Champion Rio Vista of the Peoria district. On Sunday, July 14, Hayden was eliminated following a heartbreaking 11 – 10 walk-off loss to District 9 Champion Nogales.

"They had a lot of heart," Hayden manager Brandon Garner told the Copper Basin News. "We only had 15 players on

our minors little league team, and we took 12 of them to All-Stars.

"We made huge improvements during the season and we wanted it really bad. They remained motivated and stayed in the game the whole time."

The All-Stars roster consisted of some returners and some new players, all of whom improved from the start of the Hayden season all the way through the state tournament.

"The pitching," Garner answered, when asked what his team's greatest improvement was during the season. "We took kids that hadn't ever pitched before

and used them to pitch. Our batting was improved, also. We had a lot of young kids who displayed more confidence as the season progressed."

Hayden, perhaps one of the smallest district champions – relative to the number of players other districts have to choose from – should be commended and celebrated for accomplishing something some of the "bigger" districts didn't during the last two seasons.

"They did an awesome job playing against districts with more players and I'm proud of them," Garner said.

According to Mary Rasmussen, Tonto National Forest project manager, "The next 90 days – Aug. 10 through Nov. 7 – are a crucial time for folks to learn specific details about the impacts expected from this mine project.

"We welcome informed,

thoughtful feedback about the proposed project as well as our environmental review process," Rasmussen added. "We want to engage with the public to identify the best decision among several hard choices that will effect present and future generations."

Section 3003 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal

Year 2015 mandated a land exchange between the federal government and Resolution Copper Mining. This includes federal land previously withdrawn from mineral entry. Once a Final EIS is complete and a decision is rendered, the land exchange will give Resolution Copper Mining legal access to the copper ore deposit.

The USDA Forest Service has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS) for the Resolution Copper Project and Land Exchange.

The proposed action is to approve the General Plan of Operations submitted by Resolution Copper Mining, LLC, and to complete the associated land exchange as directed by Congress under Section 3003 of the National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal year 2015. The Forest Service also anticipates a project-specific amendment to the existing forest plan. The proposed action includes the development of an underground copper mine near Superior, Arizona with a 40- to 50-year mine life with an estimated surface disturbance of 6,951 acres. The activity would occur on portions of the Tonto National Forest, Arizona State Trust Lands, and private lands in Pinal County, Arizona. The land exchange will convey 2,422 acres of Federal land on the Tonto National Forest, located in the area of the proposed mine, to Resolution Copper in exchange for approximately 5,344 acres of private land on eight parcels located elsewhere in eastern Arizona to be managed by the Forest Service and the Bureau of Land Management.
