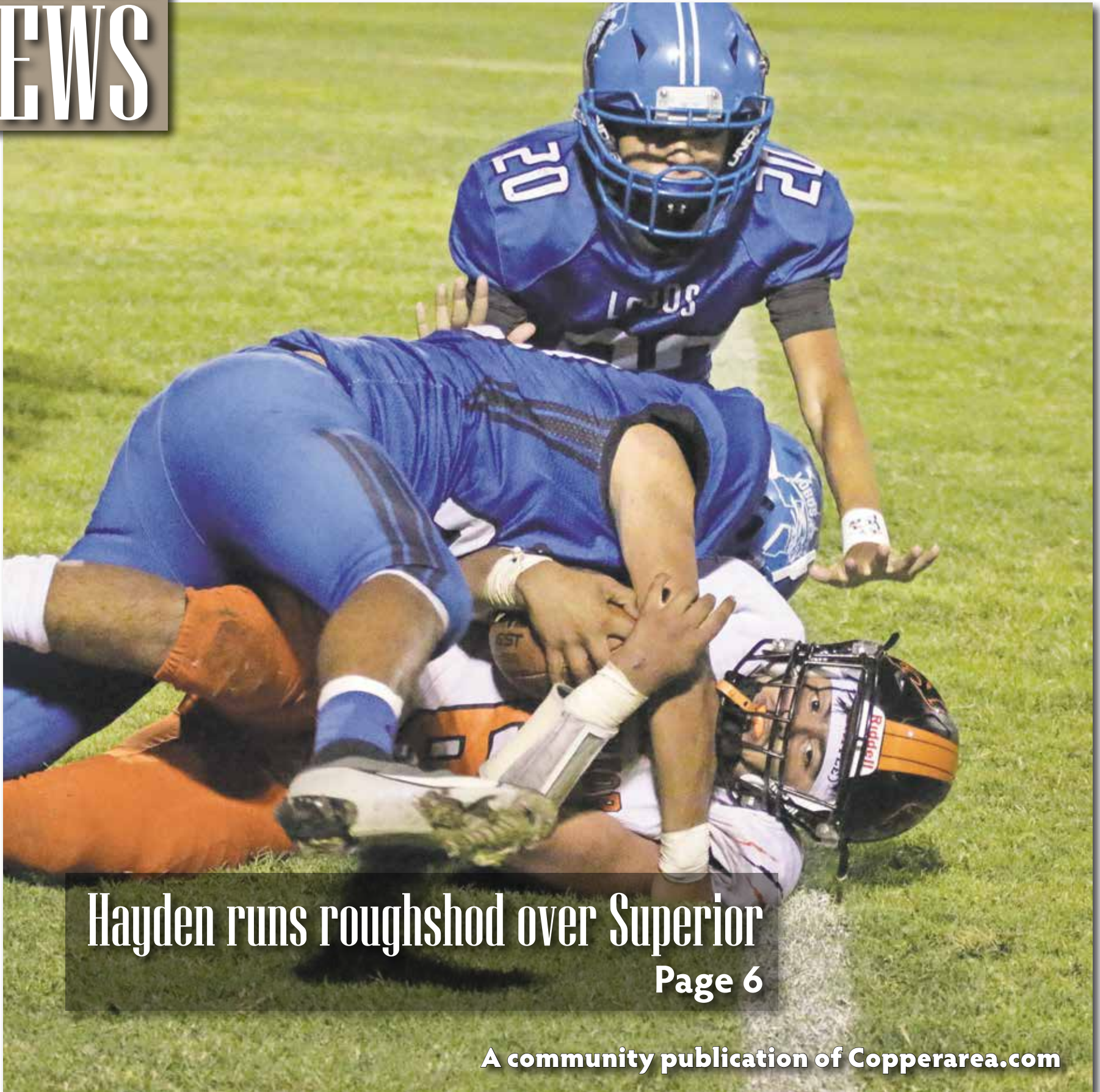

Rita 'Quata' Bon Rios

Rita "Quata" Bon Rios, 78, passed away peacefully at her home in San Pedro, Arizona in the early morning of Aug. 14, 2023, after a short sudden battle with cancer.

Quata was born Jan. 8, 1945, in Caborca, Sonora to the late Maria Vega Bon and Guadalupe Bon. She was second youngest of nine children.

In 1964, Quata became the beloved wife to Angel "Kelo" Rios and they spent 47 loving years together until he

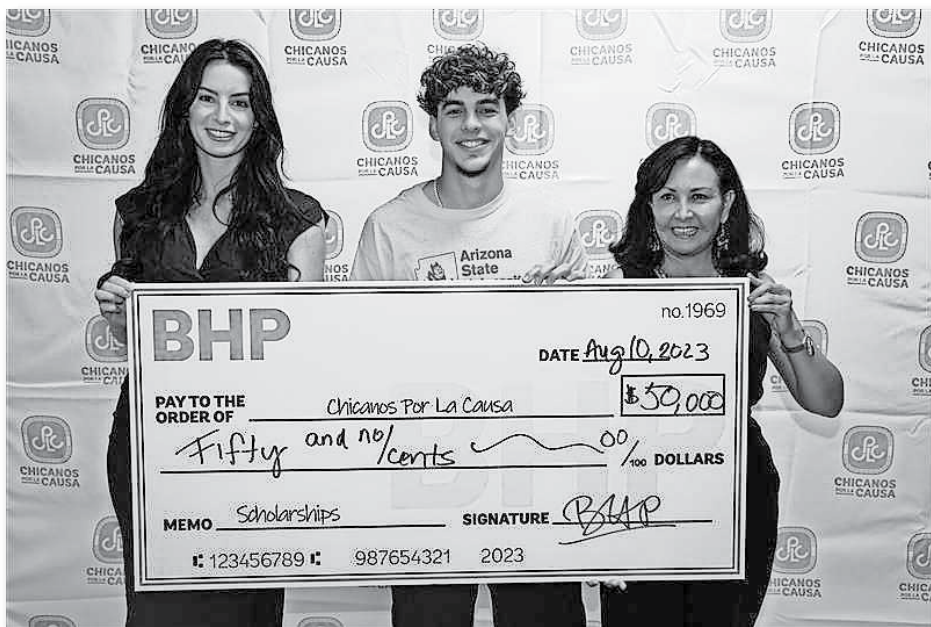

Chicanos Por La Causa announces new partnership with BHP to establish a scholarship and grant program

(Phoenix, AZ) Chicanos Por La Causa, Inc. (CPLC) recently received an investment of \$50,000 from BHP, a global resource company, that will go towards scholarships and grants supporting the educational and career aspirations of Arizona's Copper Corridor residents. The scholarship aims to expand access and affordability to higher education or vocational training, upskilling and certification.

"Generations of immigrant workers and rural Arizonans have been the backbone of the mining industry in the Copper Corridor. Their labor has been key to the growth of our nation's economy and quality of life, and we now have an opportunity to invest in the future of their youth," said David Adame, CPLC President and CEO. "As industry and the economy have changed over the years, we cannot leave this population behind. So, we are proudly partnering with BHP to provide scholarships to youth and residents from these mining towns. This opportunity is the next step for people from the region to upskill and enhance communities in the Copper Corridor."

CPLC BHP scholarships can be applied toward the tuition of any of the three state universities, the community colleges, or vocational schools. Grants will also be

made available for those seeking a training certification or towards the purchase of tools as it pertains to upskilling and training. All applicants must be at least 16 years old and live in the Copper Corridor region consisting of Miami, Globe, Superior, Hayden, Kearny, Oracle, Oracle Junction, San Manuel, Mammoth and Winkelman. Applications open Oct. 1, 2023.

"BHP is delighted to partner with Chicanos Por La Causa to support scholarships for students from the Copper Corridor pursuing an education," said Kate Sommerville, BHP Legacy Assets General Manager.

Winkelman resident and 2023 graduate of Hayden High School, Brandon Garner Jr., was selected as an inaugural CPLC BHP ASU Tomas Espinoza Scholar and enrolled in ASU's Ira A. Fulton School of Engineering.

"I am honored and grateful to have been selected as the first BHP scholar as part of the Chicano Por La Causa's scholarship program. As an incoming freshman to Arizona State University, this opportunity helps me to attain a college degree in mechanical engineering and pursue my career goals," said Garner.

Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers

The Arizona Corporation Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. CenturyLink's basic local service rates for residential voice lines are \$18.47 per month and business services are \$35.00 per month. Specific rates will be provided upon request.

CenturyLink participates in the Lifeline program, which makes residential telephone or qualifying broadband service more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. Eligible customers may qualify for Lifeline discounts of \$5.25/month for voice or bundled voice service or \$9.25/month for qualifying broadband or broadband bundles. Residents who live on federally recognized Tribal Lands may qualify for additional Tribal benefits if they participate in certain additional federal eligibility programs. The Lifeline discount is available for only one telephone or qualifying broadband service per household, which can be either a wireline or wireless service. Broadband speeds must be at least 25 Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload to qualify.

CenturyLink also participates in the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP), which provides eligible households with a discount on broadband service. The ACP provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward broadband service for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands.

For both programs, a household is defined as any individual or group of individuals who live together at the same address and share income and expenses. Services are not transferable, and only eligible consumers may enroll in these programs. Consumers who willfully make false statements to obtain these discounts can be punished by fine or imprisonment and can be barred from these programs.

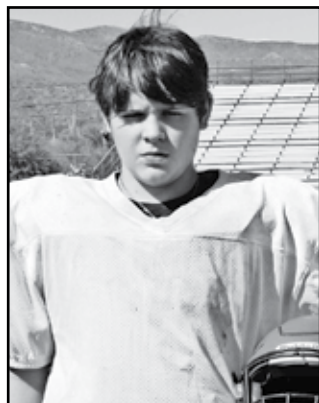

Lobos slaughter the Panthers in the season opener

The Hayden High School football team took to the field last Friday, showing their strength as they dominated the Superior Panthers.

The Lobos showed just how tough their offense was, by racking up a total of 70 points throughout the entire game.

Quarterback Paul Gaither was 4-8 passing with 192 yards and 4 touchdowns. Deondre Collier, Keiston Pool, JJ Manriquez, and Kino Lorona each had a receiving touchdown. The Lobos had 320 yards rushing with their offensive line controlling the line of scrimmage, and

opening holes for the running backs. Jordan Rodriguez led with 5 Rushes for 124 yards and 2 touchdowns. Deondre Collier had 7 rushes for 90 yards, and 2 touchdowns, he also had one reception for a 93-yard touchdown. Kino Lorona had 5 rushes for 81 yards, and 1 touchdown, he also had one reception for a 45-yard touchdown. Matt Armenta had 2 rushes for 41 yards and 1 touchdown.

The Lobos defensive team also showed the Panthers how tough they were by not letting them score a single point. Tyler Garner had 4 solo, 1 assist, 2 interceptions, and 2 pass defense. Erick Fox had 2 solo, 5 assist, and 1 sack. Mark Acevedo had 3 solo, 4 assist, and 2 QB hurries. Deondre Collier had 2 solo, 2 assist, 2 pass defense. Rene

Ochoa had 3 assists and 1 forced fumble. Kino Lorona 2 solo, 1 assist, 1 forced fumble and fumble recovery. Keiston Pool had 2 assist, and 1 sack. Matt Armenta had 4 solo, and 3 pass defense. Mario Hong had 1 solo, 1 sack, and a forced fumble. Angel Moreno had 5 tackles and 2 assist. Javier Ortega, Julius Pinkard, Manny Aguirre, Oscar Rodriguez, MJ Oropeza and Jr Fong had recorded a tackle.

The game ended in a total shutout of 70-0, with the Lobos claiming their first victory of the season. On Friday, Aug. 25, the 1-0 boys will travel to Bagdad to take on the 1-0 Sultans. The game is scheduled for a 7 p.m. kickoff.
