



Hayden football player in serious condition following accident Saturday


A Hayden High School student and athlete Saturday was seriously injured in a single-vehicle car accident near Aravaipa.

According to the Arizona Department of Public Safety Public Information Officer Timothy Case Jr., the accident was reported on Aug. 22 at 3:59 p.m. on Hwy. 77 at milepost 125. The driver and sole occupant, Santiago Pina, was airlifted to a Phoenix-area hospital with serious injuries. Case said the cause of the collision is still under investigation. "Since the driver is the only person involved," Case said in an email to Copper Area News, "our investigators will need to interview him once he's released from the hospital to find out what happened."

He added that the entire roadway was blocked for a short period of time while first responders were working to save Pina.

Pina was supposed to play varsity football for Hayden High School. Coach John Estrada said that he showed real promise in practice.

Hayden-Winkelman Schools and many residents of the surrounding communities on Monday night held a candlelight vigil for Pina. The district posted the following statement to its page on Facebook: "We are extremely appreciative for our community as well as surrounding communities who came today for Santiago Piña and his family. It's a beautiful sight to see such an outpouring of support shown. THANK YOU!. #Lobostrong #Weloveyousantiago."

Town of Kearny Reaches Two Milestones

Two long-anticipated things for the people of Kearny are finally beginning to come together.

The first thing is news that our income survey, which we started last January and weren't able to complete until this summer, has been reviewed by the Arizona Department of Housing and, as a result, we are to receive our grant of \$224,000 for new fire hydrants and for developing our ten-vear plan for the town. I thank everyone who filled out the survey and also the many people who helped conduct the survey. It revealed what we already presumed, that the income level of most of our citizens has declined. The income decline is not good news, but at least our grant processes will take that reality into account and make Kearny eligible for grants in new ways.

The second thing is news that work has begun on the surface of the municipal swimming pool. Workers have already repaired the gutter and installed tiles all along the rim. This week they begin the surface itself. We don't have a completion date yet, because the work is dependent on the weather to some degree. I'm sure the heavy rain this past weekend put quite a bit of water and debris in the pool.

I thank everyone for their resolve and willingness to help by filling out the income survey and by giving to the pool fund. The survey got the granting process moving along to completion, and your gifts have enabled work on the pool to begin. Just last

Pinal County's RICO Fund. Individuals, groups, and businesses have all pitched in.

Resolution Copper employs local workers to reclaim over 11 acres of historical mining land

Resolution Copper is proud to announce a contract award to two local contractors, Oddonetto Construction from Globe and Albo Trucking from Superior. During the next four months, 24 to 26 workers from the Copper Triangle, including San Carlos Apache Reservation, will reclaim approximately 11.5 acres of historical mining land.

The project is located on Resolution Copper's West Plant property, in an area historically known as the "Lower Smelter Pond." Following the completion of the brush removal last year, Resolution Copper will complete reclamation by replacing previously contaminated soil with clean soil and vegetation.

"To date, we have spent more than two-thirds of a \$50 million budget," said Casey McKeon, Superior resident and environmental manager for Resolution Copper. "It is our commitment to the community, that we will continue to cleanup and reclaim the historic Magma Mine tailings area to a more natural state."

Work begins Monday, Aug. 17, and will take place Monday through Saturday from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Resolution Copper will monitor the noise and air quality throughout the duration of the project.

Ray drops season opener against Gilbert Christian

The Ray football team entered last Friday's season opener versus Gilbert Christian with the challenge of replacing a number of players from last year's playoff team. The Bearcats have the fewest number of returning seniors that they've had in some time.

"We find ourselves in a different role this year," Ray head coach Willie Jordan said before the first game of the season. "We have a well-rounded team that will be tested from the start of the season."

Perhaps no truer words could've been spoken and in such a prophetic way.

The Cats faced a Gilbert Christian team last Friday that reached the state semi-finals a year ago and is a team many suggest could make a state title run this season.

The Knights started fast, starting with a 22-point first quarter before adding 15 more in the second quarter to take a commanding lead at halftime, 37 – 12.

After the Knights took an early 6 - 0 lead, the Cats answered when Austin Huffman connected with Jeron Coleman on a 44-yard touchdown pass and reception, tying the game at 6 - 6.

Ray added another score when quarterback Fabian Valenzuela ran it in from two yards out early in the second quarter to make the score 22 - 12.

The Knights continued to dominant in the second half, outscoring the Cats 19 - 0 on their way to a 56 - 12 victory.


Ray will look to rebound this week in their first road game of the season at Valley Union, another playoff team from last year.


