

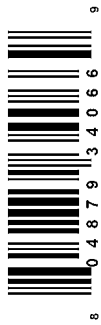

Hayden football player in serious condition following accident Saturday

A Hayden High School student and athlete Saturday was seriously injured in a single-vehicle car accident near Aravaipa.

According to the Arizona Department of Public Safety Public Information Officer Timothy Case Jr., the accident was reported on Aug. 22 at 3:59 p.m. on Hwy. 77 at milepost 125. The driver

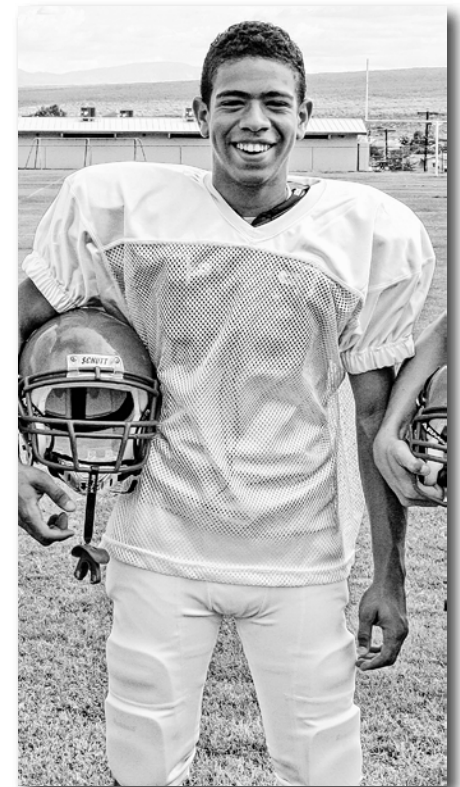
and sole occupant, Santiago Pina, was airlifted to a Phoenix-area hospital with serious injuries. Case said the cause of the collision is still under investigation. "Since the driver is the only person involved," Case said in an email to Copper Area News, "our investigators will need to interview him once he's released from the hospital to find out what happened."

He added that the entire roadway was blocked for a short period of time while first responders were working to save Pina.

Pina was supposed to play varsity football for Hayden High School. Coach John Estrada said that he showed real promise in practice.

Hayden-Winkelman Schools and many residents of the surrounding communities on Monday night held a candlelight vigil for Pina. The district posted the following statement to its page on Facebook: "We are extremely appreciative for our community as well as surrounding communities who came today for Santiago Piña and his family. It's a beautiful sight to see such an outpouring of support shown. THANK YOU!. #Lobostrong #Weloveyousantiago."

Superior Chamber gets update on Hwy. 60 expansion from ADOT

The expansion of US Hwy. 60 through Superior is coming. Of that, there is no doubt.

But where does the project stand at present?

On Wednesday, Aug. 19, the Superior Chamber of Commerce received firsthand information on the project from a spokesperson from the Arizona Department of Transportation and the engineering firm responsible for the project, Mindy Teague, Engineer from SRE-Globe Construction who is involved in the road widening of U.S. 60 Superior section. Representatives from ADOT were also there to answer questions.

The Copper Bistro, located at 2118 E. Hwy. 60 in Globe, prepared a fine luncheon for the Chamber members

consisting of a Cornish pasty with gravy, a green salad, pasta salad, drinks and cookies. The Cornish pasty is a traditional meat and vegetable pastry. It was a regular lunch item eaten underground by Cornish copper and tin miners who became known as "Cousin Jacks" in the United States.

Following lunch Carmen Casillas announced that she will be running for Representative of District 8 in the Arizona Legislature. Carmen is an advocate for education, jobs and the economy. She says she supports the Resolution Copper project and responsible mining.

Teague spoke then, using maps and a slide show presentation to provide information about the highway project. Business owners from Superior voiced their concerns about safety as well as the impact the construction and the completed highway will have on their businesses.

Not everyone is happy with the design plan. Drainage was another issue discussed.

The crossing of U.S. 60 at the "Y" at the end of Main Street was also a major point of discussion. The Y crossing is being moved to align with the new Circle K driveway. This could have an impact on traffic flow to other businesses forcing drivers to make a U-turn if they are headed west and want to stop at certain businesses on the opposite side of the road.

The construction is scheduled to begin on Sept. 17, 2015. It is expected to be completed in 850 days, sometime in 2018. The first phase will be the new alignment from Hewitt Station Road east.

After the meeting, a rumor was being circulated that the Superior Chamber of Commerce was filing an injunction to halt the U.S. 60 project. It turned out to be false information. Sue Anderson, President of the Chamber, said, "I want to be sure everyone understands that the Superior Chamber of Commerce will not take part in, or support, any legal action against this project. It is our job to get the facts about the project to the appropriate people and help our businesses get through this with the least amount of disruption to their businesses."

It's business as usual for the Superior Unified School District with the first week of school going smoothly for Superior students and teachers.

The enrollment for the elementary school this year is K-6, 204 students and pre-K, 23 students. A Team Teaching pilot program has been started for the fifth grade teachers. Mrs. Mashaw and Mrs. Moore will be working on this. JFK has adopted a Beyond Textbook Program and will continue with the EnVoy Program. Mrs. O'Connor will be working one day a week in the library. The Positive Behavior Intervention and Support program has been implemented with certified staff trained and support staff training to follow. New staff consists of Mrs. Janell Hunt who has been hired as a third grade teacher and Elizabeth Sinteral as a Special Ed Paraprofessional.

Likewise, the junior-senior high school indicated that orientation went very well and the new teachers are getting acclimated.

"The first week and few days have been great," said principal Billy Duarte.

Enrollment for the high school is 107 and the junior high school is 54. Students are offered all required courses. Biology, Earth Science, Geometry and Spanish along with other courses are now being offered. Football practice began on Aug. 5 for the junior and senior high school with

the varsity scrimmage set for Aug. 20 at 6 p.m. Volleyball practice began on Aug. 10. New staff for the high school includes John Ellison, high school special education; Daryl Workman ELA/social studies junior high; Glenn Winn, science; Carlos Hurtado, junior high math and

high school Spanish; Donald Hunt, junior and senior high school English; and Sent Manickam, high school math.

The Superior School Board encourages everyone to attend the meetings. The next regularly scheduled meeting is set for Sept. 2, 2015 at 6 p.m.

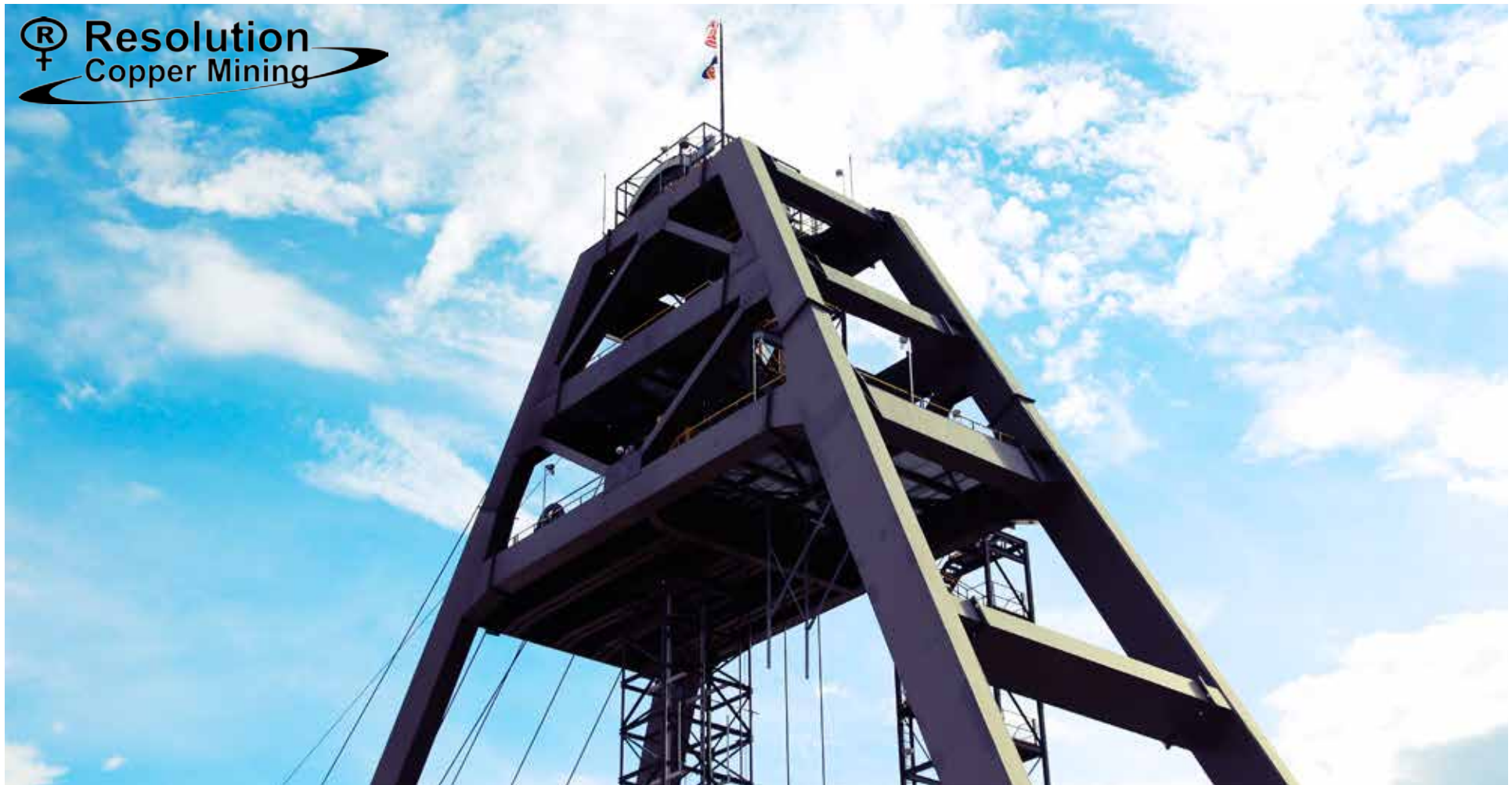
