AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE 2-4-1, RELATING TO THE TOWN OF THE MONTHLY REGULAR TOWN COUNCIL MEETING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. WHEREAS, the Town of Kearny has a desire to change the time of its monthly Regular Meeting which is currently set for the third Monday of each month at 7:30 p.m.; and WHEREAS, the Town of Kearny has determined that the starting time of the Regular Meeting at 7:00 p.m., would be beneficial to the citizens of the Town of Kearny; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OBTAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, ARIZONA, THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, ARIZONA, IS CHAPTER 2, Section 2-4-1 of the Kearny Town Code is amended as follows:

Section No. 1:
Section 2-4-1 Regular Meetings
All regular meetings of the Town Council shall be held on the third Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m., at the Town Hall Building located at 912-C Tilbury Road (Hubbard Park), Kearny, Arizona. The Mayor may designate an alternative location for Council Meetings.

Section No. 2: Any provisions of the Town of Kearny Municipal Code, all Ordinances and/or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof adopted herein by this reference or here by repeal.
Section No. 3: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portions of this Ordinance or any part of the code adopted here in by this reference, is for any reasons held to be invalid or unconstitutional the decision of any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section No. 4: The passage of this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Kearny and an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance is effective immediately upon passage by the Kearny Town Council.

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Measles exposure at two sites in Phoenix prompts Pinal County Public Health to issue warning

FLORENCE –Pinal County's Public Health Services District is alerting residents to a possible measles exposure that occurred during the dates of Aug. 9-11 at two locations in the Phoenix area. An international traveler tested positive for measles after participating at the World Hip Hop Dance Championships at the Arizona Grand Hotel.

Pinal County Public Health Services District (PCPHSD) would like to speak with all residents who were at either of these locations during this time frame. If you or someone you know, were at these

locations during this time please call our Pinal County Citizen Contact Center at 520-509-3555, toll free 1-888-431-1311, or 311 if you are in Pinal County.

"We are taking precautions in case any Pinal County residents may have been exposed at- either of these locations," stated PCPHSD Director Dr. Shauna McIsaac. "Measles is highly contagious and because of this it is important that anyone who was at either of these locations, be monitored for 21 days following their exposure."

Symptoms of measles begin 7-21 days after exposure and may include

- Fever (101 F or higher), red, watery eyes, cough and runny nose
- The fever is followed by a rash that is red, raised, and blotchy. The rash typically begins on the face at the hairline and moves down the body. The rash may last for 5-6 days and may turn brownish.

Anyone who was at one of these locations during these times and develops symptoms is encouraged to call their provider and let

them know they may have been exposed to measles.

Measles is a highly-contagious, vaccine-preventable viral illness spread through coughing and sneezing. You are considered protected from measles if you:

- Have received two doses of MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccine
 - Have previously had measles.
 - Have laboratory evidence of immunity

"We are paying close attention to this possible measles exposure in Maricopa County and will update the public with information as it is made available. We strongly encourage anyone who has not received two MMR vaccines to be vaccinated now." Stated Dr Shauna McIsaac, Director of the PCPHSD.

Preliminary work for US 60 Pinto Creek Bridge to begin Sept. 3

The Arizona Department of Transportation is scheduled to begin preliminary work on the US 60 Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project, between Miami and Superior, on Tuesday, Sept. 3.

Lane restrictions will be in place 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. while crews remove guardrails, re-stripe the road near the bridge and place temporary concrete barriers.

Flaggers and pilot cars will be directing traffic. Drivers should plan for delays.

Full closures of US 60 are tentatively scheduled to begin in late September between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

The overall project involves constructing a new bridge adjacent to the existing bridge, and then removing the existing

bridge. The project is expected to take about two years.

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Ray on wrong end of back-and-forth game in opener

The Ray football team played at Duncan in the 2019 season-opening football game for both teams last Friday night. The Wildkats erased a 14 – 0 deficit before having to hang on for a 26 – 20 victory against the Bearcats.

“Although we did not come out on top, we saw quite a few positives,” Ray assistant coach Jimmy Fessenden told *Copper Basin News*. “We have a lot of new faces playing new positions.”

After jumping out to a 14 – 0 lead in the first quarter on touchdown runs by Erik Manriquez and Alex Bravo, Ray allowed Duncan to score 26-unanswered points during the second and third quarters.

Ray closed within 26 – 20 in the fourth quarter on Manriquez’ second TD of the game. Later, the Cats were in position for a game-winning score, but a turnover with 30 seconds left in the game thwarted that opportunity.

Ray had other chances to pull out a win, but it saw a pair of touchdowns earlier in the game negated by penalties, and the inexperience of the Bearcats showed in the middle quarters.

“We need to work on playing hard all four quarters, and we are stepping up our conditioning,” Fessenden said.

Fessenden added his team needs to improve its timing on offense and its communication of defense improve before

its next game.

“We are doing that this week and will continue to improve each week,” he said.

After a game like last Friday’s, the Cats can rely on what the coaching staff believes is this team’s greatest strength.

“Our strength is the team wants to improve and is willing to work hard to do just that,” Fessenden said. “We have team speed on both sides of the ball and our attitudes are good. Coach Lechuga and I are pleased with the team chemistry.”

Hayden aims to reach even higher levels of success

The Hayden football team finished the 2018 season as the 1A State Runner-Up and enters this season as one of only a handful of teams as legitimate contenders to prevent defending champion Superior from a repeat.

The Lobos recent success has produced greater depth for their team, which is beneficial when competing as one of the best in 1A.

“We’re doing something right,” Hayden head coach John Estrada recently told the *Copper Basin News*. “This year we have 33 kids playing football; Four years ago, we had

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Input sought for potential assisted living center and tiny house village

The Kearny United Methodist Church is in the preliminary planning stages for an assisted living center and tiny house village on its property adjacent to the church building. Developing such a project is a multi-year project requiring many planning steps.

At this point, to get investors, the church needs a sense of how many people in the Copper Corridor area would be actively interested in such a development. To that end, it is asking people to complete a questionnaire available locally at several locations. Participation in the survey does not legally bind participants but does indicate a strong possibility of utilizing the service in the future. Though there are no guarantees that the project will ultimately be built, there is a strong commitment on the part of the church and strong support from the Town of Kearny, Pinal-Gila Council for Senior Citizens, Pinal County Economic Development and the housing department.

The vision is to build 12-16 rental tiny houses for elders, young teachers, millennials and adventurers. The village will be for people wanting to downsize or to live simply in a friendly, mutually supportive neighborhood. All units will

have a view of the mountains to the south. Tiny houses are stand-alone dwellings of 400 square feet or less similar to studio apartments. All will be designed for independent living but will be accessible to those with limited mobility. Meals, housekeeping and home healthcare are not included but residents may contract independently for such services.

Nearby there will be an assisted living center for an undetermined number of people so that local elders or people with disabilities do not need to be placed in facilities far from home.

The natural desert setting of the land will be maintained to the highest extent possible. All will be supported by the availability of the parish hall as community center. The planning effort is being led by local resident and church member Carol Hosler.

Hayden-Winkelman School District employees receive opioid life saving drug training

On Friday, Aug. 23, HWUSD teacher and staff attended a two-hour training on drug awareness and how to administer Naloxone, which, when given quickly to an opioid overdosing victim, can prevent deaths. Hayden Officer Nehrmeyer and Kearny Police Officer Rozzi conducted the collaborative training to share the hard-cold facts about the opioid epidemic in Arizona. The biggest reason that there is a significant increase in deaths is the drug is Fentanyl, which is added to opioids to make them more potent, but far more deadly as well.

“On small partial of Fentanyl, the size of a grain of salt added to oxytocin can be deadly,” said Rozzi, a certified Naloxone administration training specialist.

Officer Rozzi is on light duty because several months ago he was struck by a pick-up truck and faced life threatening injuries after responding to a call in Hayden. He was pulling a suspect over on Hwy. 177 when he was struck by a pick-up truck.

“I am happy to be back doing what I love again, which is being a law officer and helping keep our communities safe,” said Rozzi. He said, “this training teaches how to effectively administer Naloxone to anyone overdosing on opioids. The best part of the drug is that there is no lasting health risk and is highly effective. Naloxone saves lives if administered

quickly during an overdose.”

“It is really scary, and I am very happy we received the training and will have Naloxone on site. We always prepare for the worst and pray for the best. Being prepared and aware of this grow epidemic was well worth our time,” said Leonor Hambly K-8 Principal Pam Gonzalez.

HWUSD Superintendent Jeff Gregorich added, “I was not aware of the dangers of touching pills with my bare hands. Understanding how dangerous these drugs are and being exposed by simply touching Fentanyl, will make me handle pills with gloves and be far more cautious.”

Officer Rozzi and Nehrmeyer will be providing more training to schools and the general public about the seriousness of this issue in the Copper Corridor over the coming months. The recent arrest of a local drug dealer selling opioids with Fentanyl in the Copper Corridor communities makes education on this issue very important. Also, being a border state with Mexico, which is the leading source of Fentanyl coming into our county, makes awareness of these drugs and how to potentially save lives by prevention critical.

Rozzi also added, “Naloxone is available for free at pharmacies. If there is an overdose from opioids, the quick administration of Naloxone can save lives.”

Are you financially literate? Class offered in Hayden

These programs will help with daily stressors such as: worrying about electric bills, putting food on the table and wondering if they will have somewhere to sleep tomorrow night, all of which influences the way individuals interact with their child(ren), their families and their communities.

A single session will begin the classes: Where Does Your Money Go? The curriculum was put together by Purdue Cooperative Extension and highlights activities that go over a Spending Savings Plan; Occasional Expenses Worksheet; and adding up the extras worksheet to give a quick overview of where our money goes.

This class will be followed by a four-week series: Personal Finance Capability. Classes include:

 Week 2 – Planning for emergency events
 Week 3 – Costs of debt
 Week 4 – Understanding our credit score and credit reports

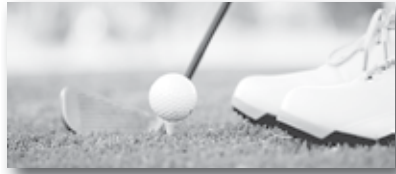

CASA of Gila County Academy in Payson cancelled due to lack of applicants

The CASA of Gila County program has announced that the CASA Academy scheduled for Sept. 26, 2019 in Payson, Arizona has been cancelled due to the program not receiving enough applicants. Those who would like to apply are strongly encouraged to do so as the need has greatly increased, and the program staff have several other training opportunities for applicants to attend.

"We are seeing an increase in the number of children who are being placed in out-of-home care settings," comments Coordinator Emily Leverance, "This can be expected at the start of the school year, but we have approximately

110 children in Southern Gila County and we are only able to provide a CASA for 15 of those children."

CASA volunteers provide support and advocacy for children who are either in licensed foster home, group homes, or in the care of relatives. Volunteers receive in-depth training and ongoing support from their local program as well as from the National CASA/GAL Association. Across the nation, CASA Pre-Service Volunteer Training serves as the foundation of which every volunteer learns the principles of best interest advocacy. The curriculum has just recently been revised

to highlight the shared values and build the skills, self-awareness and points of view necessary for volunteers to be most effective.

"Throughout the entire county, we have over 100 children who could benefit from a CASA being appointed to their case." Leverance continued, "As a CASA, you help them find hope during a time that can be confusing and scary to a child. Every child deserves to have hope."

No special background or education is required to become a CASA volunteer, a caring and generous group that represents a wide range of cultures and professions,

educational and ethnic backgrounds. Once accepted into the program, CASA volunteers receive all necessary training. CASA volunteers must be at least 21 years old and willing to complete necessary background checks, provide references and participate in an interview.

WHEREAS, the Town of Kearny has previously passed Ordinance 99-148, **BANNING THE DESTRUCTION, MUTILATION OR DAMAGE TO AIRPORT PROPERTY** which added Section 10-1-25 through 10-12-7; and WHEREAS, the Town of Kearny has determined that other Ordinances currently have been assigned 10-1-26 and 10-1-27 in the Town Code so this Amending Ordinance shall have the effect of reassigning Ordinance 99-148 to reflect a violating of Kearny Town Code Section 10-1-25, 10-1-25.1 and 10-1-25.2; **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OBTAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, ARIZONA, THAT THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, ARIZONA, IS CHAPTER 10 AMENDED TO AMEND AND ADD SECTIONS 10-1-25; 10-1-25.1 and 10-1-25.2 AS FOLLOWS:**
Section 10-1-25 - Destruction, Mutilation or Damage to Airport Property Prohibited to destroy damage or mutilate airport property including the runway or trespass on the airport runway or other property of the Town at the airport.
Section 10-1-25.1 - Violation - Penalty Any person violating any provision of this Chapter shall be guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of no greater than \$2,500.00 dollars excluding court assessments and surcharges and a jail term not to exceed six (6) months.
Section 10-1-25.2 - Reward for Information Any person who provides information which leads to a successful prosecution of any violation of Section 10-1-25 of this Chapter shall receive a reward of \$100.00 dollars.
Section No. 2: Any provision of the Town of Kearny Municipal Code, all Ordinances and/or parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance or any part thereof adopted herein by this reference or by repeal.
Section No. 3: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance or any part of the code adopted here in by this reference, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional the decision of any Court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.
Section No. 4: The passage of this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Kearny and an emergency is declared to exist and this Ordinance is effective immediately upon passage by the Kearny Town Council.

Travel ID getting more attention as deadline gets closer

With the federally-imposed deadline of Oct. 1, 2020 drawing closer, as of this past Friday the Transportation Security Administration will advise passengers passing through airport security checkpoints that it's important to consider getting a Travel ID in order to meet upcoming new federal identification requirements.

The Arizona Department of Transportation Motor Vehicle Division offers the federally-compliant Travel ID at all MVD locations statewide. It's also available at those Authorized Third Party providers that offer license and ID services.

"This is a significant step for the TSA," said MVD Director Eric Jorgensen. "It's important for the flying public to be aware of these new ID requirements. While those requirements are a federal mandate, licenses and IDs are issued by the state, and we encourage all Arizona motorists to strongly consider getting the Travel ID. It's the simplest way to ensure you have the

proper ID needed to pass through airport security starting on Oct. 1, 2020."

He added, "The Motor Vehicle Division has made this process very simple. People can make an MVD office appointment at servicearizona.com. Prior to coming to an office, a visit to azdot.gov/travelID will help begin the application process. Those who make an office appointment will typically be served in fewer than 30 minutes."

In order to get a license or ID, customers need to bring three forms of documentation, including:

1. Proof of ID such as a birth certificate or valid U.S. Passport
2. Proof of Social Security number, such as a Social Security card
3. Two documents proving Arizona residency such as a utility bill, rental statement or similar items
