Supervisor Rios: 'ADOT does right by continuing roadside memorials'

FLORENCE - Pinal County Supervisor Pete Rios said he is pleased with the decision of the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to continue to allow roadside memorials.

"ADOT does right by continuing roadside memorials," the District 1 Supervisor said. "This is a way families and friends remember loved ones lost in automobile or other vehicle accidents. My thanks goes to those who wrote and called ADOT and the Governor's Office to express their dissatisfaction with the removal of many of the memorial crosses. It was their action that made this policy change possible."

Supervisor Rios became the champion in the fight to keep the roadside memorials in April when he had received calls about many crosses missing from highways in parts of Gila and Pinal Counties.

"They had called because they thought that Pinal County did this," Supervisor Rios recalled. "I was as surprised as





they were that those memorials went missing. So after placing some calls, I found out that it was ADOT who was doing this. There was no warning that this was going to happen."

The Supervisor sent out a press release in April alerting residents that the removal was taking place on state highways. That press release was soon picked up by statewide media and some national media outlets as well.

"Looks like many citizens were as upset as I was over this," Rios said in the overwhelming response to State authorities. "But I have lost friends who are memorialized on the side of the road. I know many, many families who have lost loved ones in traffic accidents. This became an issue close to my heart."

"I really want to thank the ADOT Director and his staff for their willingness to work with me on this policy. They have one of the hardest jobs out there trying to keep people safe on the roads with limited resources. Their crews do great work," Supervisor Rios stressed. "But on a Statewide policy to remove of all memorial crosses, I couldn't agree with them. I appreciate them reevaluating their policy

with a 42 - 6 victory.

The Vikings scored in every quarter, opening a 36 – o lead at the end of the third before both teams tallied matching touchdowns in the fourth.

"We made a lot of mistakes on both sides of the ball," Lobos' head coach John Estrada said after the game. "Not taking anything away from Williams, it was a big, senior loaded and seasoned team. They will make the playoffs again this year."

Estrada was pleased with the performance of senior running back and linebacker Brandon Cruz, who played in the game despite suffering from a "bad cold" virus. His teammates, on the other hand, appeared tentative, according to their head coach.

"We need to play football," Estrada said. "I think we are putting too much pressure on ourselves. We just need to play ball, have fun and hit."

The Lobos will need to adjust quickly with undefeated NFL Yet Academy visiting this Friday. The Eagles are averaging 64 points per game and have outscored their opponents this season 128 – 22, including a 66 – 22 win against Ray last Friday.

"We'll try and rebound and learn from this game," Estrada said.

Ray head coach Frank Lechuga and his team had to feel pretty good at one point about shutting out an NFL Yet Academy team that put up 62 points in its season opener. If Lechuga and the Bearcats did indeed feel good about their 2 – o lead at the end of the first quarter, it didn't last long as the Eagles exploded for 66 points in the game's final three quarters on their way to a decisive 66

- 22 victory. "We actually played a decent game until about 10 minutes left in the third quarter," Lechuga told the Copper Basin News. "Then they started reeling off points and it got out of control."

For the second week in a row the Cats' defense allowed

more than 50 points. They surrendered 52 to St. David last week. It's a disturbing trend for any team that wants to win games.

"We can't seem to control other team's passing game," Lechuga said. "They're getting us on outside passes."

"We're not doing too well in that area right now," he continued. "We've been working on it the last two weeks so hopefully we can make some positive changes back there."

The offense is doing its part as evidenced by its three-touchdown performance on Friday night. Junior quarterback Fabian Valenzuela rushed for two scores and threw for another, connecting with freshman receiver Eric Manriquez on a 35-yard touchdown pass

In order to get some wins, however, the defense is

going to need to help out the offense by not allowing opposing teams to build insurmountable leads.

"Right now we're a first half team," Lechuga said. "We need to take it to the next level and get our defense up to par with our offense."

Ray will play its third-straight road game this Friday when it visits Ft. Thomas.

Returning home with a win would be a confidence booster for the Cats in advance of their home opener next week.

"It all comes down to the defense," Lechuga said about notching that first win this week. "Our offense has been there the past two weeks. We need to take control of these games in the second and we can come away with a win."

Friday's kickoff at Ft. Thomas is scheduled for 7 p.m.



Waste Voucher Program

Please remember that in order to obtain vouchers those interested must present a current utility bill dated within the last 60 days with their name and physical address imprinted on it. No vouchers will be issued without proper documentation. Three vouchers will be given and they will be good from Jan. 11, 2016 until Dec. 30, 2016. If those participating own more than one residence they can only obtain vouchers for the primary residence. Vouchers can be used at the Oracle Transfer Station and are good for a truck load of up to 750 lbs. or the Dudleyville Landfill and are good for a truck load of up to three cubic yards. Recycling: Why, how, where, when and what

Pinal County - Most of us have seen them around the Copper Corridor: the big blue dumpsters that are reserved for materials that can and should be recycled. Surprisingly few have a clear understanding of what to do with them, so as to help the environment without getting a reprimand or fine, however, and, many of us remain confused as to why they are even needed.



Recycling helps alleviate the negative impact of consumer societies on the natural environment. When the waste by-products of our lifestyles are dumped into landfill sites where they are simply left to break down in the sun or covered over, a few very bad things happen.

Modern life brings modern joys, including lighter weight materials that are more cost-effective so that more people can afford some simple joys of life, such as a stereo, a television, furnishings, jewelry, pans and so much more. These materials can save us time, expense, the lives of animals in the case of fleece versus fur for winter warmth, but, the cost of all the good they do is the bad that results when the items made up from them are no longer of use and must be disposed of.

Harmful greenhouse gasses and dangerous chemicals are released to leech out into the soil or pollute the air, in a way that would not happen with natural materials. Recycling helps to reduce this sort of pollution. It also helps alleviate another potential problem, which is the sheer volume of waste materials produced.

According to a brochure available online from Eco-Cycle at www.ecocycle.org nearly 90% of what we throw away could potentially be recovered through reuse, recycling or composting. Engaging in recycling can save resources, prevent pollution, support public health and create jobs.

There are many ways of recycling, by personal choice. Many artists and artisans use old magazines, clothing, broken jewelry, and much else to create new works of art or household goods. Of course, much can be donated to thrift shops to be resold, Free Cycle and Craig's List are options to help divest yourself of items that you are not sure what to do with. Repair is often an option. When it comes to recycling that goes on outside of the big blue can, the sky's the limit. What goes on inside the big blue can involves a little more following of rules, and, for good reason.

Remember all those new jobs mentioned? Well, with new jobs come new paychecks. This is good news for those who are job seekers, but, not such great news for those who are wondering why the cost for trash removal and certain landfill sites are what they are. So, how do we get the costs down and keep them down? Primarily, by the effective sorting of trash into recyclable and non-recyclable materials, so that it takes less time for the workers at the other end of the equation to do what they need to do to help the environment.

There are recycling centers open to the public, approximately 12,000 of them nation-wide, for those who do not have the big blue can or who have recycling needs that exceed the volume it is capable of holding. For the towns of the Copper Corridor: Dudleyville, Kearny, Mammoth, Oracle and San Manuel, one place to go is the Oracle Transfer Station, 2100 E. Transfer Station Road in Oracle on Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. This station is also open every second and fourth Saturday from 9 a.m. through noon. For other locations, visit http://bit.ly/2bx5zQU. this is also a good site for accessing phone numbers to ask questions when in doubt on recycling issues.

In some towns, there is a big blue recycling bin, instead of or in addition to the big blue cans. Pinal County Recycling bins are available Monday through Friday, from 6:30 a.m. through 2 p.m. Regardless of whether you are using bin, can or transporting recycling materials to a station, there are things you should and must not submit for recycling. These can vary from place to place and year to year, depending on budgets and capabilities of different stations. Below is a list of what can and cannot be recycled by official recycling stations of Pinal County:

Items Accepted

Cans: aluminum, tin or steel; Bottles: plastic or glass, including jars; Paper: news, printer, junk mail, magazines, shredded, phone books; Cardboard boxes: food, detergent, cereal; Plastics: 1-7, including bottles and milk jugs.

Items NOT Accepted

Hazardous materials: Paint, oils, batteries, electronics; Organics: tree limbs, grass clippings, household trash, food waste; Scrap materials: large pieces of glass, mirrors, windows, furniture, stoves

Follow these guidelines and you'll truly be helping make the world a better place. Happy recycling!
