July 9, 1936. He recently celebrated his 86th birthday.

Growing up in Superior, or as Nacho would say, "God's Country," he kept busy with several hobbies. If he wasn't working at the corner drugstore or shining the Miner's shoes for a nickel at the Top Hat, he would be with his Dad, Tata Mac, promoting upcoming fights. Nacho began training and boxing in the ring himself. He fought his way up and became a Golden Glove Champion. He was proud of that title, but not as proud as the day his Dad was inducted into the Hispanic Hall of Fame for boxing.

When football season came around, a young Nacho looked forward to helping the SHS football players on the sidelines with tape or water during their home games. He learned about football from watching his elders and idolized one in particular, Gilbert Gonzales, who went on to play football for the University of Arizona. After one of Gil's U of A games, they interviewed him, and Gil mentioned Ygnacio (who was now a SHS football player) as a talented player to watch on the field. That interview came out in the Tucson paper and he became a die-hard U of A fan because of Gil.

Football was Ygnacio's favorite sport and by the time he was a Senior, he was a 130 lb., starting left half-back for the Panthers. In the opening game of the 1954 season, they faced a strong Florence team, each team fought hard, but neither scored. In the second game, the Panthers trotted over Peoria, 30-0. Nacho made 4 touchdowns to lead the Panther's scoring. The Panthers went on to capture the Class B Championships by defeating the Thatcher Eagles, 25-6, in their last home game of the season, which also was the school's first Homecoming celebration for Superior High School. During halftime, they crowned the first-ever Homecoming King and Queen of SHS, Dora Diaz and Ygnacio Villaverde Jr.

What began as childhood friends, playing hide and seek or kick the can, to dancing at the school sock-hops, to Dora becoming a Pom Pom cheerleader and Nacho a football player, then being crowned Superior's first Royalty pair, a true love story was flourishing.

After graduating from SHS in 1955, Ygnacio would earn his football emblem at Palo Verde College in CA, where he played college football for one year. He returned to God's Country and married Dora, his high school sweetheart and they began to start a family.

Ygnacio was a hard worker and always provided for his family. His career started in Superior, working at the smelter, then he worked at the mill, the number 9 until it shut down, and as an electrician at a power plant in the Valley. While working for the Magma Copper Company, Nacho enrolled with the American School and successfully completed their Electrician Apprentice Course and was awarded a diploma in October of 1976. Ygnacio retired in 1997 as a valued employee of Magma Copper Company/

BHP for more than 39 years, San Manuel plant, as an Electrician Journeyman, Mine Electrical Division, Shop Department. He cherished the friendships he formed throughout his years, as a miner in Superior and in San Manuel.

Nacho was actively involved in his community, he took pride in coaching little league, YMCA basketball leagues, being on the Hall of Fame committee, helping out at the local food bank, making deliveries to families in town. He was always ready to help anyone in need.

Of all the things Nacho was proud of, his greatest accomplishments were his family. The most important roles in his life was being a devoted husband and father. Being married to Dora, the love of his life, for 66 years, being a Dad to his 9 children and the love he had for his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He stressed good grades, encouraged perfect attendance, the importance of being in school clubs, participating heavily in sports and volunteering in your community. He enjoyed traveling with his wife to watch school functions and sporting events.

He loved Superior, God's Country, he bled black and orange and was proud to be a Panther. Ygnacio celebrated the day he was inducted into the SHS Hall of Fame in 2011, it was a monumental moment, because his legacy will forever be etched in SHS history.

Many say he will be remembered for his treasury of jokes, his entertaining stories, his quick wit and great sense of humor. Others admired the man he was, not only to his friends, but especially to his family. Besides the legacy Nacho has created, everything he's taught, the life he lived, all of his stories will live on. Heroes get remembered, but legends never die and Ygnacio P. Villaverde Jr. will forever be a Superior legend. Long live the Champ!

Ygnacio was preceded in death by his daughter, Angie; his parents, Ygnacio and Jessie Villaverde; sister, Frances SantaMaria; and brothers, Porky and Johnny Villaverde. He is survived by his brothers, Tony (MaryAnn) and Bobby; sisters, Lydia Casillas and Betty Vasquez (Manuel); his wife, Dora Villaverde and children, Rosanna, Sport (Cathy), Anna, Debbie (Froylan), Dora (Joe), Vince (Molly), Angela (Anthony) and Billie Jo (Joe); 41 grand/great/great-great-grandchildren and with one more due in October.

Services for Ygnacio will be held Saturday, Sept. 3, 2022, at St. Francis of Assisi Church, 11 Church Ave., in Superior, AZ. Visitation will be held at 9 a.m., Rosary at 9:30 a.m., Mass at 10 a.m., with interment at Fairview Cemetery, immediately following the Mass.

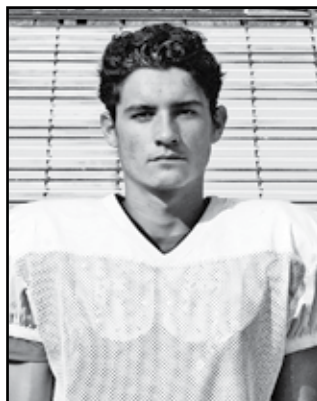

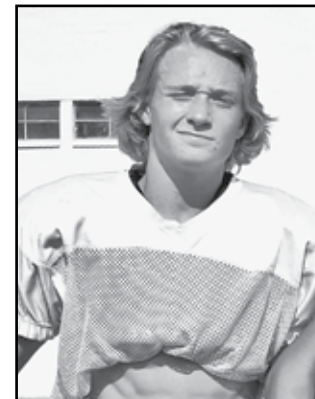

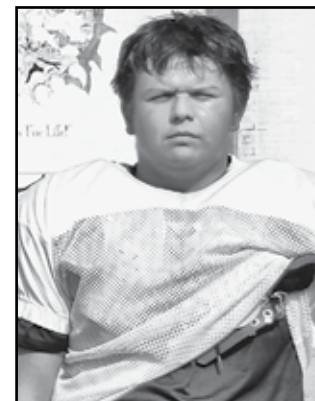

Hayden rolls right over Joseph City in 73-6 win

The Hayden Lobos did it again – wowing the hometown crowd this time with their amazing win over Joseph City.

The Hayden Lobo football team devastated the Joseph City Wildcats last Friday. The game started in the Lobos' favor when Deondre Collier took the opening kickoff return 98 yards, scoring the first touchdown of the game. The defensive team flexed their muscles all

game, holding Joseph City's offense to 0 points, while scoring 3 defensive touchdowns and making Joseph City turn the ball over 9 times. Defense was led by Mark Acevedo, who had 7 Tackles, 1 assist, 1 sack, 1 forced fumble, 1 fumble recovery, and 1 blocked punt. Jando Lorna had 5 tackles, 1 assist and 2 fumble recoveries for touchdowns.

Offensively, the Lobos produced 351 total yards in offense, 196 yards passing, and 155 rushing. Fabian Elvira had another great game throwing the football. He was 6 for 6

with 195 yards passing and 3 touchdowns. Brandon Garner had 3 receptions for 102 yards, and 2 touchdowns. Isaac Castillo had 2 receptions for 61 yards, and 1 touchdown. Jordan Rodriguez led the rushing with 6 Carries for 71 yards 1 touchdown. Moraes Cruz had 2 Carries for 33 yards and 1 touchdown. Deondre Collier had 3 carries for 31 yards.

The game ended with total domination from Hayden. The final score of the game was 73-6, giving the Lobos their second win of the season.

Their next game will take place at home on Sept. 2, with a kickoff time of 7 p.m. The boys will be taking on the tough Mogollon Mustangs. Come out and show your support under the Friday night lights for the Lobo football team.

The win was a little bittersweet for some. The team and school took time out of the game to honor the memory of the late Robert "Bob" Bohrn, who passed away recently. He was a 1975 graduate of Hayden High School, a member of the 1972 State Championship Team and lifelong Lobo.

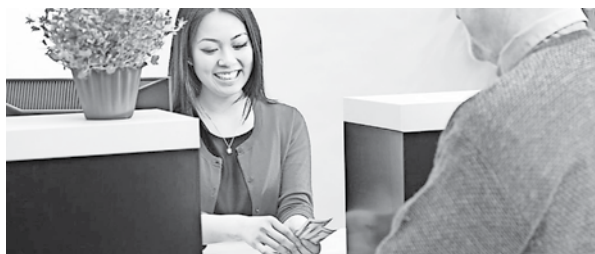
