July 9, 1936. He recently celebrated his 86th birthday.

Growing up in Superior, or as Nacho would say, "God's Country," he kept busy with several hobbies. If he wasn't working at the corner drugstore or shining the Miner's shoes for a nickel at the Top Hat, he would be with his Dad, Tata Mac, promoting upcoming fights. Nacho began training and boxing in the ring himself. He fought his way up and became a Golden Glove Champion. He was proud of that title, but not as proud as the day his Dad was inducted into the Hispanic Hall of Fame for boxing.

When football season came around, a young Nacho looked forward to helping the SHS football players on the sidelines with tape or water during their home games. He learned about football from watching his elders and idolized one in particular, Gilbert Gonzales, who went on to play football for the University of Arizona. After one of Gil's U of A games, they interviewed him, and Gil mentioned Ygnacio (who was now a SHS football player) as a talented player to watch on the field. That interview came out in the Tucson paper and he became a die-hard U of A fan because of Gil.

Football was Ygnacio's favorite sport and by the time he was a Senior, he was a 130 lb., starting left half-back for the Panthers. In the opening game of the 1954 season, they faced a strong Florence team, each team fought hard, but neither scored. In the second game, the Panthers trotted over Peoria, 30-0. Nacho made 4 touchdowns to lead the Panther's scoring. The Panthers went on to capture the Class B Championships by defeating the Thatcher Eagles, 25-6, in their last home game of the season, which also was the school's first Homecoming celebration for Superior High School. During halftime, they crowned the first-ever Homecoming King and Queen of SHS, Dora Diaz and Ygnacio Villaverde Jr.

What began as childhood friends, playing hide and seek or kick the can, to dancing at the school sock-hops, to Dora becoming a Pom Pom cheerleader and Nacho a football player, then being crowned Superior's first Royalty pair, a true love story was flourishing.

After graduating from SHS in 1955, Ygnacio would earn his football emblem at Palo Verde College in CA, where he played college football for one year. He returned to God's Country and married Dora, his high school sweetheart and they began to start a family.

Ygnacio was a hard worker and always provided for his family. His career started in Superior, working at the smelter, then he worked at the mill, the number 9 until it shut down, and as an electrician at a power plant in the Valley. While working for the Magma Copper Company, Nacho enrolled with the American School and successfully completed their Electrician Apprentice Course and was awarded a diploma in October of 1976. Ygnacio retired in 1997 as a valued employee of Magma Copper Company/

BHP for more than 39 years, San Manuel plant, as an Electrician Journeyman, Mine Electrical Division, Shop Department. He cherished the friendships he formed throughout his years, as a miner in Superior and in San Manuel.

Nacho was actively involved in his community, he took pride in coaching little league, YMCA basketball leagues, being on the Hall of Fame committee, helping out at the local food bank, making deliveries to families in town. He was always ready to help anyone in need.


Of all the things Nacho was proud of, his greatest accomplishments were his family. The most important roles in his life was being a devoted husband and father. Being married to Dora, the love of his life, for 66 years, being a Dad to his 9 children and the love he had for his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He stressed good grades, encouraged perfect attendance, the importance of being in school clubs, participating heavily in sports and volunteering in your community. He enjoyed traveling with his wife to watch school functions and sporting events.

He loved Superior, God's Country, he bled black and orange and was proud to be a Panther. Ygnacio celebrated the day he was inducted into the SHS Hall of Fame in 2011, it was a monumental moment, because his legacy will forever be etched in SHS history.

Many say he will be remembered for his treasury of jokes, his entertaining stories, his quick wit and great sense of humor. Others admired the man he was, not only to his friends, but especially to his family. Besides the legacy Nacho has created, everything he's taught, the life he lived, all of his stories will live on. Heroes get remembered, but legends never die and Ygnacio P. Villaverde Jr. will forever be a Superior legend. Long live the Champ!

Ygnacio was preceded in death by his daughter, Angie; his parents, Ygnacio and Jessie Villaverde; sister, Frances SantaMaria; and brothers, Porky and Johnny Villaverde. He is survived by his brothers, Tony (MaryAnn) and Bobby; sisters, Lydia Casillas and Betty Vasquez (Manuel); his wife, Dora Villaverde and children, Rosanna, Sport (Cathy), Anna, Debbie (Froylan), Dora (Joe), Vince (Molly), Angela (Anthony) and Billie Jo (Joe); 41 grand/great/great-great-grandchildren and with one more due in October.

Services for Ygnacio will be held Saturday, Sept. 3, 2022, at St. Francis of Assisi Church, 11 Church Ave., in Superior, AZ. Visitation will be held at 9 a.m., Rosary at 9:30 a.m., Mass at 10 a.m., with interment at Fairview Cemetery, immediately following the Mass.

Group in San Manuel aims to end the food desert

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to grow your own vegetables? Have you ever thought about starting a garden, but felt like you didn't know enough to start?

If you've ever had the bug to get outside and start growing and planting, then there might be a meeting you should attend – the Agrihood meetings that are taking place at the San Manuel Community Center on the third Thursday of every month. These meetings will help people with gardening tips and information specific to San Manuel. Having agriculturally ambitious citizens is the start of creating food sustainability in the community, and cutting down how much has to be imported here.

Earlier this month, ground was broken on an 18-acre parcel behind the Community Presbyterian Church. According to the San Manuel Revitalization Coalition, the land was donated to SMRC by BHP. Two acres are for a community garden. The remaining 16 have been earmarked for a future cemetery. SMRC has a long way to go before the cemetery is open. The cemetery project has to go through the county's permitting process first.

Victory Gardens of the Copper Corridor

It is good to see the development of community gardens and gardens at many of our schools these days. The community garden in Oracle is growing in popularity and is becoming a learning center for gardening. That they are working in partnership with Mt. Vista School and others will only benefit our community.

San Manuel will soon boast one of its own, thanks to the San Manuel Revitalization Coalition's Agrifood.

We need more community gardens in Pinal County as well as the United States especially in the rural areas. There was a time when community gardens, school gardens and individual food gardens were considered necessary and promoted by the federal, state and county governments in cooperation with individuals, community organizations and businesses.

Beginning in 1914 most of Europe was engulfed in World War I. Due to the war, many farms were devastated and farm workers were in shortage due to men being recruited to fight for their countries, creating

a severe food shortage crisis. It would be up to the United States to help feed their allies overseas. The United States entered the war in 1917. It was then that the term "community gardens" came into use to describe collectively grown gardens and gardens with individual plots planted on shared or public lands.

In March of 1917 Charles Lathrop Pack organized the National Emergency Food Garden Commission. At the time, Lathrop was one of the five wealthiest men in the United States. He was a forestry expert and became a leading advocate for forest conservation. Pack partnered with other philanthropists, agricultural experts, clubs and organizations. They then teamed up with the federal government's Department of Agriculture, Department of Education and a newly-created Department of Food Administration.

Soon, state, county and city governments joined up and the "War Garden" movement began. These gardens were also called liberty gardens or food gardens for defense. After the war ended in 1918, they became known as "Victory Gardens" and the excess produce allowed the U.S. to help feed the starving masses in Europe.


The Food Garden Commission and government entities organized gardens at schools around the country. The Bureau of Education's program was known as the U.S. School Garden Army and kids were encouraged to enlist as "soldiers of the soil". The Food Garden Commission created and printed pamphlets and instruction booklets on gardening, food preservation including canning and drying fruits and vegetables, which they distributed for free. Newspapers and magazines cooperated and printed articles with gardening tips, recipes and gardening news. Propaganda posters were created encouraging everyone to do their patriotic duty and plant a war garden. People in the cities began planting gardens on their window sills, roof tops and in vacant lots and the movement spread throughout the country. It is estimated that 3 million new gardens were planted in the United States in 1917 and more than 5.2 million in 1918. They generated 1.45 million quarts of surplus canned fruits and vegetables. The War Gardens allowed Americans to contribute to the war effort, boosted morale, express their patriotism and safeguarded against food shortages on the home front.

In Arizona, county agricultural agents were appointed to organize, assist and coordinate the war gardens with government agencies. Watson Pickrell was the agent for Pinal and Pima counties. He was appointed in

June 1917. His base of operations was the chamber of commerce in downtown Tucson. Pickrell was a farmer and graduate of the Agricultural College at the University of Arizona. Newspapers reported that he was to spend 10 days each month in Tucson and the rest of the time visiting farmers in both counties. It was reported that the purpose of his position was "aiding the farmers of these two counties in the increased production and food conservation campaign inaugurated by the University of Arizona and the Arizona State Council for Defense in connection with the war with Germany."

In early August 1917, it was noted in the *Tucson Citizen* that Watson Pickrell filed for an exemption from the military draft claiming that his position as county agricultural agent is necessary to the military establishment. Pickrell was drafted at the end of August and assigned to the Army. An appeal was filed to the President of the







United States by Professor Frederick W. Taylor of the University of Arizona on behalf of Pickrell and all the agricultural agents in the state. By this time Pickrell was at Ft. Riley, Kansas having accepted a commission as an officer. He served in France and returned to Arizona in July 1919. He was appointed as agricultural agent for Pima and Santa Cruz counties.

W.E. Mullen took Pickrell's place. The war garden campaign was a success in Arizona. In his February 1918 report, Mullen showed the number of home war gardens being cultivated in Pinal County as being 563. They were listed as follows: Blackwater, 4; Mammoth, 5; Kelvin, 5; Sacaton Indian School, 1; Picacho, 6; Red Rock, 7; Toltec, 5; Hayden Junction, 11, Oracle, 7; Belgravia, 1; Florence, 35; Superior, 36; Casa Grande, 55; Ray, 177; Sonora, 203.

As you can see, the leaders for Pinal County were located in the Copper Corridor: the mining towns of Ray and Sonora. The largest war garden in the

state would also be part of the Copper Corridor. It would go on to be the largest in the United States and at one time claimed to be the largest in the world.

The War Gardens at Miami were started up by J.R. Sandige, the agricultural agent for Gila County. He was also an employee of the Inspiration Copper mine. Inspiration Copper invested in excess of \$20,000 in the garden providing 80 acres of land along Mills Boulevard between Globe and Miami. They leveled and plowed the land, installed an irrigation system and divided plots for employee's families and others to work. Water for the gardens was free. A

labor strike increased the numbers of people willing to work the land, especially those miners who had families. Before long there would be 432 war gardens in the area.

The gardens would also be known as the Inspiration War Gardens and received publicity all over the state and country. In 1918 it would expand to 100 acres and be known as the largest war garden in the world. It would also "inspire" other mining companies in the

state to get involved in the war garden campaign. Some of these mining companies included Old Dominion and Miami Copper Company. The Ray Consolidated Copper Company donated land, seed, water and installed an irrigation system for the Ray School. The school would be known for selling produce three days a week at their campus. They made \$250 their first school year in sales.

The war gardens of the Copper Corridor provided more than their share

towards the World War I food production and conservation campaign. In the 1920s, the popularity of the victory gardens declined when government and corporation interest and support dwindled. Many of the gardens faded away. When World War II broke out, victory gardens became popular again. Government and corporations once

again supported a victory garden campaign. Food and other commodities were rationed during the war which made these gardens essential and more popular. Fruit, vegetables and herb production would exceed the gardens of World War I.

The idea of war/victory gardens has helped shape

the popularity of community gardens. Wouldn't it be nice to see increased government and corporate support of community and individual gardens, perhaps a campaign for "Peace Gardens", "Feed the Poor Gardens" or "No Child Left Hungry Gardens"?


