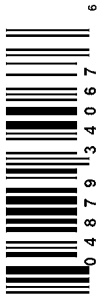

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Councilman addresses outgoing mayor's comments

The Mayor/Manager of Mammoth resigned 7/21/16 at the regular meeting. He claims that four persons on the Council allowed the Town to get in such a mess.

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
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Arizona Ziplines to host Peppersauce Roundup

One of the biggest events to ever happen in the Oracle area will take place this September. Arizona Zipline Adventures has partnered with the Arizona Trail Association and American Bunnyhop to bring to the area a large family friendly event, the Oracle Ford Peppersauce Roundup. The Peppersauce Roundup event will include a bicycle race, a 10 mile and 5K trail run, a bluegrass and country music festival, beer gardens, delicious food, kids' events and much more. Some proceeds from the event will benefit the Arizona

Trail.

The beer gardens will be provided by the Catalina Brewing Company, a craft beer brewer located in Tucson. They are supporters of the local mountain biking scene. Their variety of beers includes one that uses mesquite pods and agave nectar and another that uses prickly pear cactus in the brewing process.

American Bunnyhop, LLC is a premier cycling event management and production company. They are organizing the Mt. Lemmon Gravel Grinder, a 40 and 50 mile cycling event that will start and end at Arizona Zipline and a 10 mile and 5K run along the Arizona Trail. Qualifications for children to receive free or reduced price meals include: belonging to a household whose income is at or below the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines, belonging to a household that receives public assistance, or if the child is homeless, migrant, runaway, foster, or participates in a Head Start or Even Start pre-Kindergarten program. Household size and income criteria are used to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price benefits if the household does not receive assistance or the children are not in the other categories mentioned above. Children can get free or reduced-price meals if the household's gross income falls at or below the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guideline chart.

To apply for free or reduced-price meals, households can fill out the application and return it to the school unless the household has already received notification that their children are approved for free meals this year. Application forms are being distributed to all households with a letter informing households of the availability of free and reduced-price meals for their children and what is required to complete on the application. Applications also are available At Mammoth Elementary, First Avenue Elementary and JR/SR High cafeterias and offices.

Only one application is required for all children in the household and the information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and verification of data. Applications may be verified at any time during the school year by the school or other program officials. An application for free or reduced-price benefits cannot be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information as indicated on the application and instructions. In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age, or disability.

Families can apply for benefits at any time. If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household's income falls at or below the Federal Guidelines. The Town/City/County is expected to receive approximately \$226,279 in FY2015 federal CDBG funds from the Arizona Department of Housing Regional Account (RA). CDBG funds must be used to benefit low-income persons and areas, alleviate slum and blight or address urgent need. Based on citizen input as well as local and state planning objectives several potential projects have been selected to be forwarded to the State of Arizona with a request for funding. It is expected that the Town Council will select the final projects at this hearing and adopt applicable resolutions. The potential CDBG projects are named and described as follows:

1. Restoration and rehabilitation of water storage tank #1. The 250,000 gallon steel tank will be refinished inside and out. The project would include structural repairs and equipment upgrades. This tank serves the southern portion of the community with approximately 470 persons 5106% of whom are low to moderate income. Estimated cost of the \$196,300
2. Abandonment and replacement of a 910 foot section of deteriorated pipe with a new 6 inch main including approximately 10 service connections with new service lines from an estimated cost of \$130,000. Approximately 25 low to moderate income persons will benefit from this project.
3. Business district fire line. Construction of up to 600 feet of 8 inch water line in the business corridor along Highway 77 would include a fire hydrant and a circulation loop to improve water flow for all town residents. This project serves the entire community with approximately 929 persons of low to moderate income. Estimated cost \$105,300.

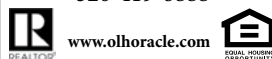
